SHELBY COUNTY BOARD MEETING

September 9, 2009 – 9:00 A.M.

The Shelby County Board met on Wednesday, September 9, 2009, at 9:00 A.M. at the Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman Brooks called the meeting to order and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Before roll call, Board member Larry Lenz drew the Board’s attention to the vacant board seat draped in black. Mr. Lenz stated that this is in memory of Board member, George Frazier, who recently passed away. Mr. Lenz noted Mr. Frazier did a lot for the County and will be missed. The Clerk called the roll. Bruce Cannon and Glenn R. “Dick” Clark were also absent.

Minutes for the August 12 Board and August 26, 2009 Budget Committee meetings were presented for approval.

MOTION: Norma Stewart made motion to approve the minutes of the August 12 board and August 26, 2009 Budget Committee meetings as presented.
Dale Wetherell seconded the motion.

VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried.

Chairman Brooks declared a vacancy in County Board District #10 due to the passing of Board member George Frazier. Following the vacancy declaration, Chairman Brooks requested the appointment of Kay Kearney to serve the unexpired term of Mr. Frazier.

MOTION: Richard Hayden made motion to approve the Chairman’s request to appoint Kay Kearney to serve the unexpired term created by the passing of George Frazier, County Board District 10.

Richard Reynolds seconded the motion.

VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried.

Mrs. Kearney took the Oath of Office administered by County Clerk Kathy Lantz and was seated.

Chairman Brooks presented the Fiscal Year (FY) 2009 – 2010 Budget for adoption. The budget totals \$9,963,859.00.

Norma Stewart seconded the motion.

A lengthy discussion followed. Sheriff Miller explained the details of the Courthouse Security set up to the Board.

MOTION: Larry Lenz made motion to approve the levy resolutions, for tax year 2009 payable in 2010, in one roll call vote. Barbara Bennett seconded the motion.

At this time, Alan Spesard, County Highway Engineer, introduced "friends of Shelby County" Senator Kyle McCarter and Representative Bob Flider to the Board. Mr. Spesard noted that they have done a lot for the County and he invited them to the Board meeting to express his personal appreciation for all they have done. Mr. McCarter spoke to the fiscal uneasiness of the times, the capital bills and the allocation of the infrastructure projects for Shelby County. Mr. Flider informed the audience that he was very pleased that Mr. Spesard was "right there" to submit an application for IDOT emergency road repair funds to resurface the Assumption blacktop. Mr. Flider said this was "huge" and that Mr. Spesard "was doing his job". Further noting, Mr. Flider stated Mr. Spesard has worked with him by testifying before committees to secure funding for downstate projects. Chairman Brooks thanked the gentlemen for coming. Discussion followed. Mr. Spesard thanked Mr. McCarter and Mr. Flider as he announced that they had secured \$450,000.00 for Shelby County for the Assumption blacktop resurfacing project. The Board thanked them with a rousing applause.

Chairman Brooks called for a 10 minute recess.

MOTION: Mr. Amling made motion to approve the Chairman's request for a recess. Barbara Bennett seconded the motion.

VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried.

The recess ended and Chairman Brooks requested a motion to reconvene the session.

MOTION: Norma Stewart made motion to approve the Chairman's request to reconvene the session. Dale Wetherell seconded the motion.

Mr. Spesard proceeded to give the Board the highway report, requesting approval for a Local Agency (LA) Agreement for Federal Participation between the State and Shelby County for funding of the Village of Tower Hill Road Project from the south corporate limits of Tower Hill to Illinois Route 16. Cost of the project is \$552,714.00. Construction funding will be paid by federal stimulus money, \$487,714.00 and the balance by state match funds.

MOTION: Richard Reynolds made motion to approve the LA Agreement for Federal Participation for the funding of the Village of Tower Hill Road Project as presented. Robin Robertson seconded the motion.

VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried

Mr. Spesard requested approval for a 50/50 Petition to replace a culvert over the unnamed tributary where the same is crossed by the highway TR 5 at a point near the NE ¼, NW ¼, Section 28, T14N, R3E in Penn Township. Estimated cost to replace is \$3,000.00. Cost share is to be to be shared equally between the County and Township.

MOTION: Norma Stewart made motion to approve the 50/50 Petition to replace a culvert in Penn Township at an estimated cost of \$3,000.00 as presented. Robert Jordan seconded the motion.

VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried.

Mr. Spesard requested approval for a 50/50 Petition to replace a culvert over the unnamed tributary where the same is crossed by the highway TR 156 at a point near the NE ¼, SE ¼, Section 29, T14N, R3E in Penn Township. Estimated cost to replace is \$3,000.00. Cost share is to be to be shared equally between the County and Township.

MOTION: Dale Wetherell made motion to approve the 50/50 Petition to replace a culvert in Penn Township at an estimated cost of \$3,000.00 as presented.
Norma Stewart seconded the motion.

VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried.

Ending his report, Mr. Spesard gave the Board some highlights and updates on the work in the County Highway Department. Mr. Spesard stated that they are helping supply timber piles for the University of Illinois and IDOT's timber pile bridge testing research project. Mr. Wetherell, Road and Bridge Committee member, stated Mr. Spesard was doing a good job and that he has paid off the last highway department loan. This is the first time in ten years that the department has had no outstanding debt.

Health Administrator Steve Melega updated the Board on House Bill 170 which provides, beginning January 1, 2013, that no new surface discharging private systems can be installed without a NPDES permit. After a public opposition campaign to legislators and the Governor, Governor Quinn did not sign the bill but used his amendatory veto on certain sections of the bill. Mr. Melega explained the amendatory veto's of the bill. The House and Senate must now choose to override or accept the veto as is, according to Mr. Melega.

Zoning Administrator Dennis Harris updated the Board on the activities of the Zoning office and highlighted the Zoning monthly report. Mr. Harris informed the board that he contacted Bill Teichmiller, of E J Water Coop, regarding building permits for the construction of the Delbert Mundt Water Treatment Plant. Mr. Teichmiller stated that they were tax exempt. A recently constructed tower on Route 16 belongs to Lincoln Prairie Water and is a communications tower. Mr. Harris described the zoning ordinance hearing processes that will be held after he receives the cellular/wireless resolution.

The annual Courthouse Clock Maintenance Contract between the County and Ron Hatfield was presented for approval. The contract remains \$1,200.00 annually (September 1, 2009 – August 31, 2010).

MOTION: Robin Robertson made motion to approve the annual Courthouse Clock Maintenance Contract as presented.
Jim Warren seconded the motion.

VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried

Liquor Commissioner Brooks updated the Board stating that liquor licenses for the coming year were renewed for Louis and Christina Donnel, Willow Ridge Vineyards and Winery.

Chairman Brooks called for Committee Reports.

Mr. Hayden, Law Enforcement Committee Chairman, asked Sheriff Miller to address the Board. Mr. Miller stated that he presently was loaning a surplus 2004 Ford pickup to the Dive Team and requested approval to give the truck to the Dive Team.

MOTION: Richard Reynolds made motion to approve giving the Sheriff's department's 2004 Ford pickup to the Dive Team as presented.
Robin Robertson seconded the motion.

VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried.

Mr. Hayden, Solid Waste Committee Chairman, informed the Board that Saturday, September 26th an Electronics Recycling Day would be held at the Shelbyville Walmart Parking Lot. This event is sponsored by the Committee, Shelby County Health Department, Walmart and the Lincoln Heritage RC & D. Information regarding the recycling day is available on the health department's website per Mr. Melega. (www.shelbyhealth.net).

At this time, Chairman Brooks introduced Cristy Pullen, the County's new ESDA coordinator. Mrs. Pullen stated she was "glad to be here".

Under correspondence, Chairman Brooks noted that acknowledgements were received from the Frazier Family and Angel of Love Program for the County's donation in memory of George Frazier.

Jim Warren, Chairman of the Public Buildings Committee, reported that the bids for the County buildings lighting repair project were received and opened. Sheriff Miller stated that the low bid from Sphar Electric bid did not meet the bid requirements. Pals Electric bid was for \$29,642.00 but did not state that prevailing wages would be paid. The highest bid from Figgins Electric was for \$33,888.47. (Original bids are on file in the office of the Sheriff.) The Figgins bid stated that prevailing wages apply and were willing to do the repairs after normal work day hours. The bid includes materials for the Highway Department but no labor.

MOTION: Robin Robertson made motion to accept the Figgins Electric bid in the amount of \$33,888.47 for the lighting repairs project at the Courthouse, Detention Center and Highway Department as presented.

In addition, there was a note from a pantry client expressing their appreciation of the County's support. Lastly, Chairman Brooks referred to a letter by Tourism Director Freddie Fry requesting financial support to pay the utilities for the Tourism Building wing occupied by the County. (County Board, ESDA and Zoning offices are housed there.) The Tourism Office is facing a 40% loss of revenue due to the closing of Eagle Creek Resort.

Chairman Brooks requested the following appointments.



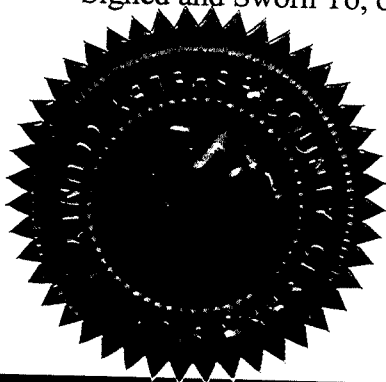

The STATE and LA jointly propose to improve the designated location as described below. Agreement Provisions

THE LA AGRE

- (1) To acquire in its name, or in the name of the state if on the state highway system, all right-of-way necessary for this project in accordance with the requirements of Titles II and III of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, and established state policies and procedures. Prior to advertising for bids, the LA shall certify to the STATE that all requirements of Titles II and III of said Uniform Act have been satisfied. The disposition of encroachments, if any, will be cooperatively determined by representatives of the LA, and STATE and the FHWA, if required.
- (2) To provide for all utility adjustments, and to regulate the use of the right-of-way of this improvement by utilities, public and private, in accordance with the current Utility Accommodation Policy for Local Agency Highway and Street Systems.
- (3) To provide for surveys and the preparation of plans for the proposed improvement and engineering supervision during construction of the proposed improvement.
- (4) To retain jurisdiction of the completed improvement unless specified otherwise by addendum (addendum should be accompanied by a location map). If the improvement location is currently under road district jurisdiction, an addendum is required.
- (5) To maintain or cause to be maintained, in a manner satisfactory to the STATE and FHWA, the completed improvement, or that portion of the completed improvement within its jurisdiction as established by addendum referred to in item 4 above.
- (6) To comply with all applicable Executive Orders and Federal Highway Acts pursuant to the Equal Employment Opportunity and Nondiscrimination Regulations required by the U.S. Department of Transportation.
- (7) To maintain, for a minimum of 3 years after the completion of the contract, adequate books, records and supporting documents to verify the amounts, recipients and uses of all disbursements of funds passing in conjunction with the contract; the contract and all books, records and supporting documents related to the contract shall be available for review and audit by the Auditor General and the department; and the LA agrees to cooperate fully with any audit conducted by the Auditor General and the department; and to provide full access to all relevant materials. Failure to maintain the books, records and supporting documents required by this section shall establish a presumption in favor of the STATE for the recovery of any funds paid by the STATE under the contract for which adequate books, records and supporting documentation are not available to support their purported disbursement.
- (8) To provide if required, for the improvement of any railroad-highway grade crossing and rail crossing protection within the limits of the proposed improvement.
- (9) To comply with Federal requirements or possibly lose (partial or total) Federal participation as determined by the FHWA.
- (10) (State Contracts Only) That the method of payment designated on page one will be as follows:
 - Method A - Lump Sum Payment. Upon award of the contract for this improvement, the LA will pay to the STATE, in lump sum, an amount equal to 80% of the LA's estimated obligation incurred under this Agreement, and will pay to the STATE the remainder of the LA's obligation (including any nonparticipating costs) in a lump sum, upon completion of the project based upon final costs.
 - Method B - Monthly Payments. Upon award of the contract for this improvement, the LA will pay to the STATE, a specified amount each month for an estimated period of months, or until 80% of the LA's estimated obligation under the provisions of the Agreement has been paid, and will pay to the STATE the remainder of the LA's obligation (including any nonparticipating costs) in a lump sum, upon completion of the project based upon final costs.
 - Method C - Progress Payments. Upon receipt of the contractor's first and subsequent progressive bills for this improvement, the LA will pay to the STATE, an amount equal to the LA's share of the construction cost divided by the estimated total cost, multiplied by the actual payment (appropriately adjusted for nonparticipating costs) made to the contractor until the entire obligation incurred under this Agreement has been paid.
- (11) (Day Labor or Local Contracts) To provide or cause to be provided all of the initial funding, equipment, labor, material and services necessary to construct the complete project.
- (12) (Preliminary Engineering) In the event that right-of-way acquisition for, or actual construction of the project for which this preliminary engineering is undertaken with Federal participation is not started by the close of the tenth fiscal year following the fiscal year in which this agreement is executed, the LA will repay the STATE any Federal funds received under the terms of this Agreement.
- (13) (Right-of-Way Acquisition) In the event that the actual construction of the project on this right-of-way is not undertaken by the close of the twentieth fiscal year following the fiscal year in which this Agreement is executed, the LA will repay the STATE any Federal Funds received under the terms of this Agreement.
- (14) (Railroad Related Work Only) The estimates and general layout plans for at-grade crossing improvements should be forwarded to the Rail Safety and Project Engineer, Room 204, Illinois Department of Transportation, 2300 South Dirksen Parkway, Springfield, Illinois, 62764. Approval of the estimates and general layout plans should be obtained prior to the commencement of railroad related work. All railroad related work is also subject to approval by the Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC). Final inspection for railroad related work should be coordinated through appropriate IDOT District Bureau of Local Roads and Streets office.

Plans and preemption times for signal related work that will be interconnected with traffic signals shall be submitted to the ICC for review and approval prior to the commencement of work. Signal related work involving interconnects with state maintained traffic signals should also be coordinated with the IDOT's District Bureau of Operations.

The LA is responsible for the payment of the railroad related expenses in accordance with the LA/railroad agreement prior to requesting reimbursement from IDOT. Requests for reimbursement should be sent to the appropriate IDOT District Bureau of Local Roads and Streets office.

Engineer's Payment Estimates in accordance with the Division of Cost on page one.

- (15) And certifies to the best of its knowledge and belief its officials:
- (a) are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency;
 - (b) have not within a three-year period preceding this Agreement been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against them for commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain or performing a public (Federal, State or local) transaction or contract under a public transaction; violation of Federal or State antitrust statutes or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements receiving stolen property;
 - (c) are not presently indicted for or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a governmental entity (Federal, State, local) with commission of any of the offenses enumerated in item (b) of this certification; and
 - (d) have not within a three-year period preceding the Agreement had one or more public transactions (Federal, State, local) terminated for cause or default.
- (16) To include the certifications, listed in item 15 above and all other certifications required by State statutes, in every contract, including procurement of materials and leases of equipment.
- (17) (State Contracts) That execution of this agreement constitutes the LA's concurrence in the award of the construction contract to the responsible low bidder as determined by the STATE.
- (18) That for agreements exceeding \$100,000 in federal funds, execution of this Agreement constitutes the LA's certification that:
- (a) No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress or any employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan or cooperative agreement;
 - (b) If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress or an employee of a Member of Congress, in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying", in accordance with its instructions;
 - (c) The LA shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all subawards at all tiers (including subcontracts, subgrants and contracts under grants, loans and cooperative agreements) and that all subrecipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.
- (19) To regulate parking and traffic in accordance with the approved project report.
- (20) To regulate encroachments on public right-of-way in accordance with current Illinois Compiled Statutes.
- (21) To regulate the discharge of sanitary sewage into any storm water drainage system constructed with this improvement in accordance with current Illinois Compiled Statutes.
- (22) That the LA may invoice the STATE monthly for the FHWA and/or STATE share of the costs incurred for this phase of the improvement. The LA will submit supporting documentation with each request for reimbursement from the STATE. Supporting documentation is defined as verification of payment, certified time sheets, vendor invoices, vendor receipts, and other documentation supporting the requested reimbursement amount.
- (23) To complete this phase of the project within three years from the date this agreement is approved by the STATE if this portion of the project described in the Project Description does not exceed \$1,000,000 (five years if the project costs exceed \$1,000,000).
- (24) Upon completion of this phase of the improvement, the LA will submit to the STATE a complete and detailed final invoice with all applicable supporting supporting documentation of all incurred costs, less previous payments, no later than one year from the date of completion of this phase of the improvement. If a final invoice is not received within one year of completion of this phase of the improvement, the most recent invoice may be considered the final invoice and the obligation of the funds closed.
- (25) (Single Audit Requirements) That if the LA receives \$500,000 or more a year in federal financial assistance they shall have an audit made in accordance with the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular No. A-133. LA's that receive less than \$500,000 a year shall be exempt from compliance. A copy of the audit report must be submitted to the STATE with 30 days after the completion of the audit, but no later than one year after the end of the LA's fiscal year. The CFDA number for all highway planning and construction activities is 20.205.

THE STATE AGREES:

- (1) To provide such guidance, assistance and supervision and to monitor and perform audits to the extent necessary to assure validity of the LA's certification of compliance with Titles II and III requirements.
- (2) (State Contracts) To receive bids for the construction of the proposed improvement when the plans have been approved by the STATE (and FHWA, if required) and to award a contract for construction of the proposed improvement, after receipt of a satisfactory bid.
- (3) (Day Labor) To authorize the LA to proceed with the construction of the improvement when Agreed Unit Prices are approved and to reimburse the LA for that portion of the cost payable from Federal and/or State funds based on the Agreed Unit Prices and Engineer's Payment Estimates in accordance with the Division of Cost on page one.
- (4) (Local Contracts) That for agreements with Federal and/or State funds in engineering, right-of-way, utility work and/or construction work:

- (a) To reimburse the LA for the Federal and/or State share on the basis of periodic billings, provided said billings contain sufficient information and show evidence of payment by the LA;
- (b) To provide independent assurance sampling, to furnish off-site material inspection and testing at sources normally visited by STATE inspectors of steel, cement, aggregate, structural steel and other materials customarily tested by the STATE.

IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED:

- (1) That this Agreement and the covenants contained herein shall become null and void in the event that the FHWA does not approve the proposed improvement for Federal-aid participation or the contract covering the construction work contemplated herein is not awarded within three years of the date of execution of this Agreement.
- (2) This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties, their successors and assigns.
- (3) For contracts awarded by the LA, the LA shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the award and performance of any USDOT – assisted contract or in the administration of its DBE program or the requirements of 49 CFR part 26. The LA shall take all necessary and reasonable steps under 49 CFR part 26 to ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of USDOT – assisted contracts. The LA's DBE program, as required by 49 CFR part 26 and as approved by USDOT, is incorporated by reference in this Agreement. Upon notification to the recipient of its failure to carry out its approved program, the department may impose sanctions as provided for under part 26 and may, in appropriate cases, refer the matter for enforcement under 18 U.S.C. 1001 and/or the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986 (31U.S.C. 3801 et seq.). In the absence of a USDOT – approved LA DBE Program or on State awarded contracts, this Agreement shall be administered under the provisions of the STATE's USDOT approved Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program.
- (4) In cases where the STATE is reimbursing the LA, obligations of the STATE shall cease immediately without penalty or further payment being required if, in any fiscal year, the Illinois General Assembly or applicable Federal Funding source fails to appropriate or otherwise make available funds for the work contemplated herein.
- (5) All projects for the construction of fixed works which are financed in whole or in part with funds provided by this Agreement and/or amendment shall be subject to the Prevailing Wage Act (820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq.) unless the provisions of that Act exempt its application.



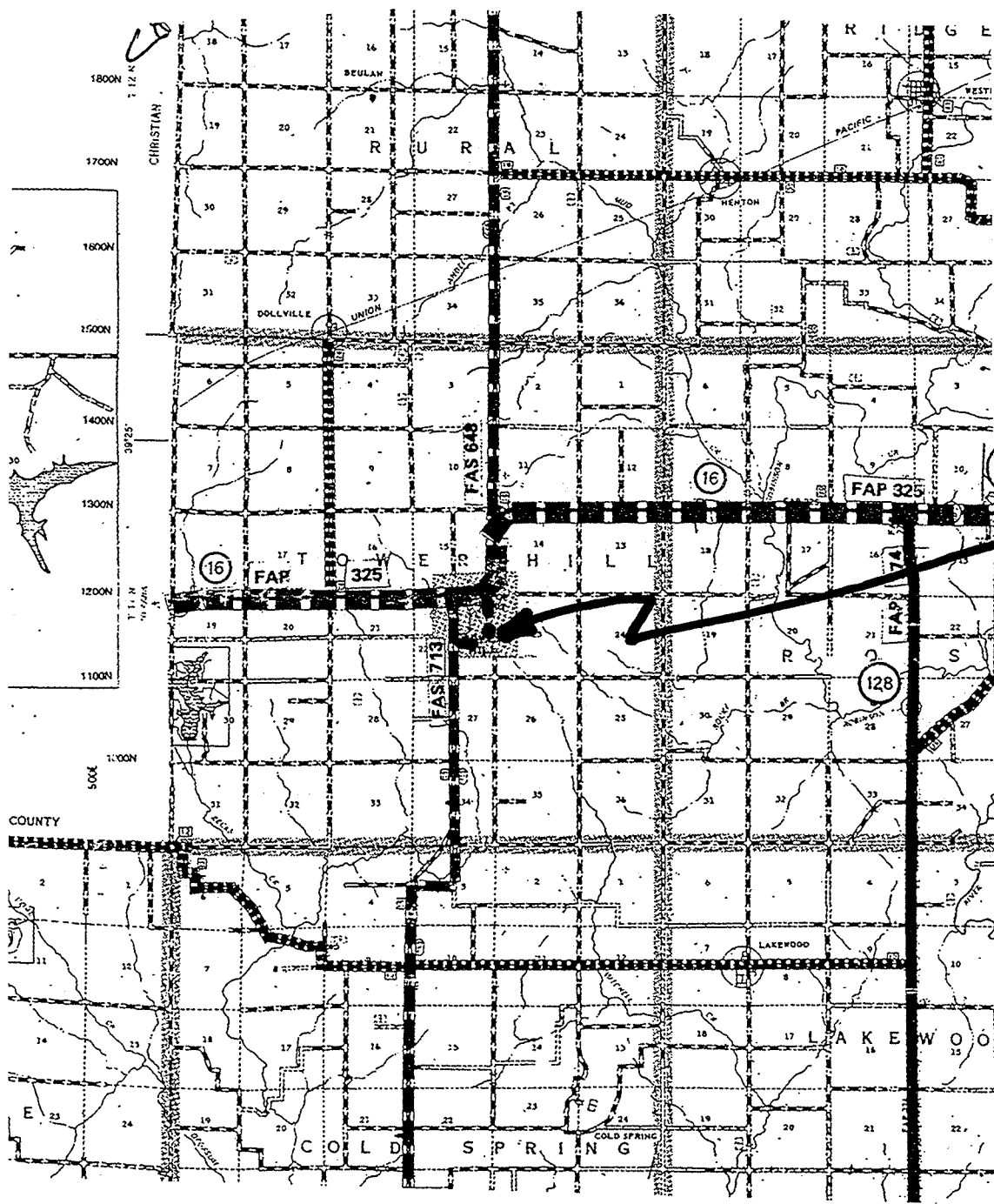

Some good news regarding HB170 PRIV SEWAGE/EPA-SRFCE DSCHRG. The governor did not sign the bill but rather did an amendatory veto of certain portions of the bill. The amendatory veto is as follows:

Recommends: replacing references to "waters of the United States, as that term is used in the Federal Water Pollution Control Act" with references to "waters of the United States, as defined at 40 C.F.R. § 122.2"; and deleting language authorizing a person to construct or install a surface discharging private sewage disposal system in a jurisdiction in which the local public health department has a general NPDES permit issued by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the surface discharging private sewage disposal system is covered under the general NPDES permit.

Now the bill goes back to the legislature to the fall veto session starting in October. Will be interesting to see if the language gets changed or if Tryon tries to get enough votes to override the veto.

To the Honorable Members of the Illinois House of Representatives,
96th General Assembly:

Today I return House Bill 170 with specific recommendations for change. I thank the sponsors for their hard work and the members of the General Assembly for passing this bill. However, there are provisions parts that require modification.

House Bill 170 provides that, beginning January 1, 2013, no new surface discharging private system installations may be authorized by the Illinois Department of Health (DPH) unless a specific permit is first issued for the system by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The bill will assist both DPH and EPA in formally coordinating their respective permitting systems. However, there are some issues with the bill as drafted that could lead to misinterpretation and confusion.

Therefore, pursuant to Article IV, Section 9(e) of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, I hereby return House Bill 170, entitled "AN ACT concerning regulation.", with the following specific recommendations for change:

Page 3, by replacing lines 10 through 11 with "of the United States, as defined at 40 C.F.R. § 122.2."; and

Page 4, by replacing lines 9 through 10 with "waters of the United States, as defined at 40 C.F.R. § 122.2, shall not be constructed"; and

Page 4, by replacing lines 13 through 19 with "Environmental Protection Agency or the United States Environmental Protection Agency. The private sewage disposal code must be amended"; and

Page 5, by replacing lines 11 through 12 with "of the United States, as defined at 40 C.F.R. § 122.2."; and

Page 8, by replacing lines 15 through 16 with "discharges into the waters of the United States, as defined at 40 C.F.R. § 122.2, unless he"; and

Page 8, by replacing lines 18 through 24 with "Illinois Environmental Protection Agency or the United States Environmental Protection Agency."

With these changes, House Bill 170 will have my approval. I respectfully request your concurrence.

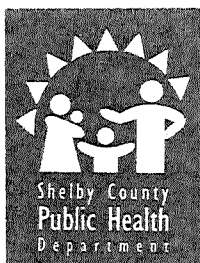



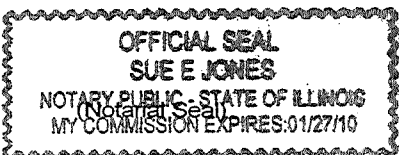

In the Sheriff's Office /Jail there are 195 lighting fixtures to be upgraded or replaced. For disposal there will be 448 - 4' lamps, and approximately 1950lbs.worth of old lighting ballast.

Due to the closure of Eagle Creek Resort, we are facing a devastating revenue loss projected at forty (40) percent. This extreme loss of revenue has prompted us to make a request for financial assistance.

In addition to the expected loss caused by the closing of eagle creek, we were not paid March revenue by Shiffman and Associates, also the management team filed June and July tax reports totaling \$4,603.70 without a payment. Since September of 2005, when the zoning and economic development offices were moved into the west side of our building; our office has covered the entire cost of utilities and maintenance for the building without any reimbursement from the county. This expense amounts to approximately \$1,500 a year.

For the last twenty years, this office has more than met the obligations of the ordinance that created us. We feel we are an integral and vital part of the county's economic success. Our website receives more than 5 million hits a year and 65,000 copies of our Visitor Guide are well placed and received. After a request from the Illinois Bureau of Tourism, we were asked to separate from the Decatur Area Convention and Visitor Bureau and become a self standing bureau. We received our certification in May 2009 and officially became the Lake Shelbyville Area Convention and Visitors Bureau/Shelby County Tourism beginning July 1, 2009.

It is our hope that you will find a way to help us get through these funding issues and to continue to promote Shelby County and the Lake Shelbyville area for the economic benefits.
