SHELBY COUNTY BOARD MEETING

June 9, 2010 – 9:00 A.M.

The Shelby County Board met on Wednesday, June 9, 2010, at 9:00 A.M. at the Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman Brooks called the meeting to order and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Clerk called the roll. Joe Sims was absent.

Minutes for the May 12, 2010 Board meeting were presented for approval.

MOTION: Norma Stewart made motion to approve the minutes

of the May 12, 2010 Board meeting as presented.

Fred Doerner seconded the motion.

VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried.

Chairman Brooks announced the resignation of Allan Lolie as Shelby County's State's Attorney. Mr. Lolie has been appointed an Associate Judge of the Fourth Judicial Circuit. A rousing applause greeted Mr. Lolie after Chairman Brooks wished him the best and thanked him for his dedication to Shelby County. Mr. Lolie stated that the last 9 ½ years have been a privilege and that much has been accomplished. Strong law enforcement relationships throughout Shelby County have been developed as well as great relationships built working with county officials. Mr. Lolie ended his comments by thanking the Board for their cooperation setting his budgets and appreciates the confidence they have had in him.

At this time, Chairman Brooks appointed Gina Vonderheide to the position of Shelby County State's Attorney stating that she is a lifelong resident of Shelby County, an attorney with Bennett Law Offices since 2004 and prior to that worked for Heller and Holmes Law Offices.

upon the unanimous recommendation of the Fees and Salaries Committee, made motion requesting Board approval of the appointment of Jared Rowcliffe as Shelby County's ESDA Coordinator and Zoning Administrator. The salary set for assuming both part-time positions is \$33,000.00 annually.

Kristie Warfel, C.E.F.S. Transportation Director. Ms. Warfel presented the following documents requiring approval of the County Board for public transportation. The documents included two resolutions authorizing application for to the Department of Public Transportation, Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) for operating assistance for public transportation, an Ordinance stating Shelby County wishes to provide public transportation for its citizens and become eligible for grants from the State of Illinois, Federal government or any department or agency and the acceptance of a Special Section 5333(B) Warranty for application to the small urban and rural programs.

MOTION: Ken Barr made motion to approve the C.E.F.S. Resolutions,

Ordinance and Special Warranty to authorize application for Downstate Public Transportation Act funding documents as

presented.

Norma Stewart seconded the motion.

VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried.

The annual Prevailing Wage Rate Resolution was presented to the Board for approval.

MOTION: Bruce Cannon made motion to approve the annual

Prevailing Wage Resolution as presented. Richard Hayden seconded the motion.

VOTE: All voted aye by voice with the exception of one nay vote.

Motion carried.

Alan Spesard, County Highway Engineer, addressed the Board to give the highway report. Mr. Spesard requested a Highway Department budget amendment for this fiscal year. To explain, Mr. Spesard stated that Federal and State grants have been awarded to the Highway Department over the last year and several agreements for reimbursement have been entered into; and, most of the projects are anticipated to start and complete this year. Mr. Spesard met with County Auditor Robin Yockey, County Treasurer Debra Page and the Road and Bridge Committee in determining the accounting process for this. Further explaining, Mr. Spesard stated that the County Board previously approved the grants and agreements. Estimated state reimbursements are \$1,700,000.00. Mr. Spesard is requesting budget authority to spend \$1,626,704.00 for these grants and agreements this fiscal year. All projects are running ahead of schedule. Funds are being received from the State this year in order to do these projects. Reimbursements are being received and none are included in this year's budget. Mrs. Yockey informed Mr. Spesard that the funds coming in must be accounted for as revenue and the related expenses have to be budgeted. Mr. Spesard requested approval for the budget amendment to provide for these accounting measures to spend the \$1,626,704.00. Discussion followed and Mr. Spesard answered questions from the Board.

MOTION: Rob Amling made motion to approve the County Engineer's

request for a Highway Department budget amendment to provide for the accounting measures to spend the \$1,626,704.00 this fiscal

year as presented.

Discussion followed. Mrs. Yockey reiterated Mr. Spesard's budget amendment explanation to the Board.

Dale Wetherell seconded the motion.

VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried.

Shelby County Board Meeting

June 9, 2010

Ending his report, Mr. Spesard gave the Board some updates on the work in the County Highway Department. Three bridges, one in Rose, Dry Point and Tower Hill Townships, will be on the June 11th State letting. The prejob meeting on the Findlay Road project, one of the above grant projects, will be held on June 11th with construction to begin in June. Three railroad crossing approach projects, one in Shelbyville Township and two in Sigel Township, were approved for 100% funding and should start this month. The bridge project started last year in Richland Township is open and the IDOT inspection completed. The Tower Hill Road project, another grant project, has two days of construction yet before completed.

Kathy A. Lantz, Election Authority addressed the Board regarding the selection of Election Judges for 10-2012. Every two years, the County Board approves the proper ratio of persons to serve as election judges in each election precinct from certified lists which have been furnished the Chairman of the County Central Committees. The number of votes cast for Governor in the last three Governor elections determines the ratio of Democratic and Republican judges in each precinct. Based upon those numbers, the ratio of three Democratic judges and two Republican judges will be in the precincts of Cold Spring, Herrick, Lakewood, Okaw, Rose # 1, Shelbyville # 2, # 3, #4, #5, #6, #7, Todds Point, Tower Hill, Windsor #1 and #2. The precincts having three Republican judges and two Democratic judges are Ash Grove, Big Spring, Clarksburg, Dry Point, Flat Branch, Holland, Moweaqua # 1, # 2, Oconee, Penn, Pickaway, Prairie, Richland, Ridge, Rose # 2, Rural, Shelbyville # 1 and Sigel. The County Central Committee Chairmen submitted lists of persons selected to serve as election judges.

MOTION: Dale Wetherell made motion to approve the ratio of persons

to serve as election judges to serve 2010-2012 in each precinct from the certified lists submitted by the County Central Committee

Chairmen as presented.

Barbara Bennett seconded the motion.

VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried.

Chairman Brooks called for Committee Reports.

Mr. Amling requested that the Zoning Committee revisit the zoning fee for broadband towers that Shelby Electric Cooperative puts up. Broadband is a high priority of Farm Bureau. Shelby Electric Cooperative is putting up towers to service the county but with the current rate of \$25.00 a foot this would prohibit them from putting up too many towers especially around the lake. Mr. Amling suggested a \$100.00 permit fee be considered as the Zoning Administrator does have to go out to the tower site when the tower is installed. Discussion followed regarding permit fees charged by other counties and fees charged by Shelby Electric Cooperative for their services to the County. Chairman Brooks read a letter he received stating their opposition to Shelby County's current permit fee for broadband towers. (Letter on file in the County Board meeting file for June 9, 2010) Zoning Committee Chairman, Glenn R. "Dick" Clark stated he would see to it the Planning Commission and Board of Appeals meeting review the permit fee.

MOTION: Ken Barr made motion to refer the broadband tower issue

over to the Zoning Committee to review the fee charged and

report back to the Board their findings. Richard Hayden seconded the motion.

VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried.

At this time, Chairman Brooks thanked County Engineer Alan Spesard, Roger Haycraft and Scott Short for arranging for the disposal of county records. Another pick up load of records were approved for destruction by the State of Illinois Local Records Commission. Drew Bosgraaf and Ace Campfield picked up the records and disposed of them for the County. Thanks to everyone involved. An acknowledgement was received by the Robbie Robertson family (Robin Robertson's father) for the memorial received at the time of his passing.

Sheriff Miller noted to the Board that the Courthouse clock motor was not working. The clock will be shipped to a company in California for repairs.

Shelby County Board Meeting June 9, 2010

Cooperative Extension Unit Leader, Jim Looft, gave an update on the University of Illinois reorganization of extension units. Hearings have been held and a new unit will be formed. Director of the five county unit will be determined. Our county office should stay open with staffing of a secretary and 4-H person. A budget was submitted with positions for four educators. It is unknown at this time if those positions will be filled. Mr. Looft encouraged everyone to go out and see the remodeling changes in the Airport terminal. Additional improvements are planned including a new hanger to be built this year.

Whitney D. Hardy, representing Lincoln Heritage, Inc., directed the Board to the new "Looking for Lincoln Story Trail" brochure which he providing stating that the brochures are now available in the Tourism office. A "Discovery Guide for Abraham Lincoln Sites in Shelby County" is available, also. The recycling funds they receive now are being shared with Habitat for Humanity.

Treasurer Page reminded the Board that direct deposit of payroll checks is in place. It isn't too late to sign up if someone is interested. Answering a comment from the Board, Mrs. Page stated that there isn't enough room on the payroll check stub to list each deduction separately.

Chairman Brooks introduced the County's appointee to the State's Attorney position, Gina Vonderheide, to the Board. Mrs. Vonderheide was welcomed with applause from the Board. Thanking the Board for appointing her, Mrs. Vonderheide stated that she is excited to get started and do the best she can to serve the Board and Shelby County.

There was no further business to come before the Shelby County Board.


WHEREAS, the provision of the public transit service is essential to the transportation of persons in the non-urbanized area; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE SHELBY COUNTY:

- Section 1. That an application be made to the Division of Public Transportation, State of Illinois, for a financial assistance grant under Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act of 1991, as amended (49 U.S.C. § 5311), for the purpose of off-setting a portion of the Public Transportation Program operating deficits of Shelby County.
- Section 2. That while participating in said operating assistance program Shelby County will provide all required local match funding.
- Section 3. That the County Board Chairman of the Shelby County Board is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file on behalf of the Shelby County such application.

ORDINANCE NUMBER_______AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION IN SHELBY COUNTY, ILLINOIS

Whereby, public transportation is an essential public purpose for which public funds may be expended under Article 13, Section 7 of the Illinois Constitution; and

WHEREAS, Shelby County wishes to provide public transportation for its citizens and become eligible for grants from the State of Illinois or any department or agency thereof, from any unit of local government, from the Federal government or any department or agency thereof; and

WHEREAS, Illinois Compiled Statutes 740/2-1 et seq. authorizes a county to provide for public transportation within the Shelby County limits:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Chairman and the County Board of Shelby County that:

Section 1. Shelby County shall hereby provide public transportation within the Shelby, Moultrie, Douglas, Fayette, Clay and Montgomery Counties.

Section 2. The County Clerk of the County of Shelby shall file a certified copy of this Ordinance, within sixty days after passage of this ordinance.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval, as required by law.

Section 4. That the County Board Chairman of Shelby County is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file on behalf of Shelby County a Grant Application to the Illinois Department of Transportation.

Section 5. That the County Board Chairman of Shelby County is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file on behalf of Shelby County all required Grant Agreements with the Illinois Department of Transportation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that nothing herein shall be construed to apply to the prevailing hourly rate of wages in the locality for employment other than public works construction as defined in the said Act; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk of Shelby County is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this Resolution with the Illinois Secretary of State's Springfield office.

This Resolution shall be in full legal force and effect from and after its passage pursuant to law.

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Explanations

SHELBY COUNTY

TRUCK DRIVERS (EAST) - East of a line starting where such line from the northeast corner of Moultrie County in a southwesterly direction to Findlay intersects the Moultrie-Shelby Counties line, to Findlay, continuing in a southerly direction to a point approximately 2-1/2 miles south of Middlesworth, continuing to a point on the Shelby-Cumberland Counties line approximately one mile south of the Trowbridge Neoga Road.

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial/Decoration Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration such as the day after Thanksgiving for Veterans Day. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

Oil and chip resealing (O&C) means the application of road oils and liquid asphalt to coat an existing road surface, followed by application of aggregate chips or gravel to coated surface, and subsequent rolling of material to seal the surface.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER, MARBLE FINISHER, TERRAZZO FINISHER

Assisting, helping or supporting the tile, marble and terrazzo mechanic by performing their historic and traditional work assignments required to complete the proper installation of the work covered by said crafts. The term "Ceramic" is used for naming the classification only and is in no way a limitation of the product handled. Ceramic takes into consideration most hard tiles.

ELECTRONIC SYSTEMS TECHNICIAN

Installation, service and maintenance of low-voltage systems which utilizes the transmission and/or transference of voice, sound, vision, or digital for commercial, education, security and entertainment purposes for the following: TV monitoring and surveillance, background/foreground music, intercom and telephone interconnect, field programming, inventory control systems, microwave transmission, multi-media, multiplex, radio page, school, intercom and sound burglar alarms and low voltage master clock systems.

Excluded from this classification are energy management systems, life safety systems, supervisory controls and data acquisition systems not intrinsic with the above listed systems, fire alarm systems, nurse call systems and raceways exceeding fifteen feet in length.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION Class 1. Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by separate units, truck driver helpers, warehouse employees, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling materials, tools, or workers to and from and on-the-job site, and fork lifts up to 6,000 lb. capacity.

- Class 2. Two or three axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, vactor trucks or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, four axle combination units, and ticket writers.
- Class 3. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or more. Drivers on water pulls, articulated dump trucks, mechanics and working forepersons, and dispatchers. Five axle or more combination units.
- Class 4. Low Boy and Oil Distributors.
- Class 5. Drivers who require special protective clothing while employed on hazardous waste work.

TRUCK DRIVER - OIL AND CHIP RESEALING ONLY.

This shall encompass laborers, workers and mechanics who drive contractor or subcontractor owned, leased, or hired pickup, dump, service, or oil distributor trucks. The work includes transporting materials and equipment (including but not limited to, oils, aggregate supplies, parts, machinery and tools) to or from the job site; distributing oil or liquid asphalt and aggregate; stock piling material when in connection with the actual oil and chip contract. The Truck Driver (Oil & Chip Resealing) wage classification does not include supplier delivered materials.

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217-782-1710 for wage rates or clarifications.

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.

Notes to County Board Members re: Selection of Election Judges for 2010-2012

Every two years, the County Board approves the proper ratio of persons to serve as election judges in each election precinct from the certified lists which have been furnished by the Chairmen of the County Central Committees. Motion and vote required.

The number of votes cast for Governor in the last three Governor elections determines the ratio of Democratic and Republican judges in each precinct.

Based upon those numbers, the ratio of three Democratic judges and two Republican judges will be in the precincts of Cold Spring, Herrick, Lakewood, Okaw, Rose # 1, Shelbyville # 2, # 3, #4, #5, #6, #7, Todds Point, Tower Hill, Windsor #1 and #2.


The precincts having three Republican judges and two Democratic judges are Ash Grove, Big Spring, Clarksburg, Dry Point, Flat Branch, Holland, Moweaqua # 1, # 2, Oconee, Penn, Pickaway, Prairie, Richland, Ridge, Rose # 2, Rural, Shelbyville # 1 and Sigel.



Farm Bureau is a supporter of implementing high-quality, affordable broadband Internet service in rural areas including Shelby and the surrounding Counties. For the past three years, broadband has been a priority issue of the Illinois Farm Bureau and American Farm Bureau Federation.

In the 21st century, broadband Internet access is a necessity, not a luxury. Access to high-speed Internet is important to rural America. Broadband plays a critical role in health, education and economic development.

Shelby Electric Cooperative is attempting to bring this much needed service to Shelby County. Farm Bureau has learned the county is charging a \$25 per foot permit fee to build a broadband tower. This fee could limit the number of towers built within the county and thus limit a much needed service to Shelby County residents.

We find the current permit fee to be excessive compared to our neighboring counties of Moultrie and Christian who do not charge a permit fee. In Shelby County, a permit for one-180 foot tower at \$25 per foot costs Shelby Electric Cooperative \$4,500. Shelby Electric Cooperative was formed many years ago to bring electric service to rural areas and today it is still trying to service its rural members.

The Commerce Department shows that broadband Internet access enhances the economic growth and performance of communities. People who live and work in rural areas are often unable to access the same educational, medical, business and government services as people living in more populated areas. This inequity can be corrected with access to broadband Internet service.

I am enclosing information regarding the benefits of broadband provided by the Illinois Farm Bureau. Shelby County Farm Bureau would like the county board to review its permit policy and waive the fees for broadband towers in Shelby County.
