

SHELBY COUNTY BOARD MEETING

<u>December 14, 2011 – 9:00 A.M.</u>

The Shelby County Board met on Wednesday, December 14, 2011, at 9:00 A.M. at the Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman Bruce Cannon called the meeting to order. All present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

County Clerk Kathy Lantz called the roll. Roger Pauley was absent.

Minutes for the November 9, 2011 board meeting were presented for approval. Zoning portion of minute's corrected to reflect that the township for the May rezoning resolution should be Ridge, not Cold Spring as stated.

Clark moved to approve the minutes as corrected. Doerner seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote. (20 yes, 0 no)

Chairman Cannon announced the resignation of Roger Pauley as Shelby County Board member from District #4 and read Mr. Pauley's resignation letter to the body. A vacancy in County Board District #4 was declared by Chairman Cannon. (Letter and Notice of Declaration to declare vacancy on file in original County Board minutes book).

Probation Officer Heather Wooters presented the Drug Court Resolution. (See resolution attached to these minutes).

Amling moved to approve the Drug Court Resolution enacting a fee to support Shelby County Drug Court. Hayden seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no), Resolution 11-58.

Chairman Cannon presented the West Central Development Council (WCDC) Resolution to Support the Taylorville Energy Center IGCC Plant with Carbon Capture. (See resolution attached to these minutes).

Barr moved to approve the WCDC Resolution to support the Taylorville Energy Center IGCC Plant with carbon capture. Cruitt seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no), Resolution 11-59.

At this time, Chairman Cannon called for the County Highway Engineer's report.

Alan Spesard, County Highway Engineer presented four petitions, four resolutions and one agreement and provided a brief update at the end of his report. The primary reason for entering into the Lakeland College Statement of Understanding/Cooperative Educational Program is that it provides for additional help which is needed for next year's projected construction projects. These projects are expected to reach over \$5 million which would be a record amount of construction oversight needed based on money spent. The anticipated projects include the Neoga Road, 3 bridges, 2 railroad crossing approaches, and a request from the City of Shelbyville for construction oversight for a road project that supports International Paper's plant expansion. County Highway costs for the City of Shelbyville project would be reimbursed. The County Highway department also has several design projects planned. (See petitions, resolutions and agreement attached to these minutes for further descriptions, funding division of costs, estimates, etc.).

Bennett made motion to approve the Petition to replace a culvert in Cold Spring Township. Wetherell seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Barr made motion to approve the Petition to replace a bridge in Lakewood Township. Clark seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Wetherell made motion to approve the Petition to replace a bridge in Rural Township. Warren seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Wetherell made motion to approve the Petition to replace a bridge in Prairie Township. Warren seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Amling made motion to approve the Resolution to annually assess traffic control signs by visual nighttime inspection. Warren seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no), Resolution 11-60.

Wetherell made motion to approve the Resolution to enter into a Lakeland College Statement of Understanding/Cooperative Educational Program. Robertson seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no), Resolution 11-61.

Robertson made motion to approve the Resolution for County Maintenance. Clark seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no), Resolution 11-62.

Hayden made motion to approve the Agreement for the County Engineer's salary. Warren seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Wetherell made motion to approve the Resolution to appropriate funds for the payment of the County Engineer's salary. Robertson seconded the motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no), Resolution 11-63.

EMA/Zoning Administrator Jared Rowcliffe present one zoning ordinance amendment and provided a brief Zoning/EMA update to the board. (See ordinance amendment attached to these minutes for further description).

Behl made motion to approve the Ordinance Amendment providing for the placement of private use wind energy turbines. Jordan seconded the said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no), Ordinance Amendment 11-03-"0".

Shelby Co Board Meeting December 14, 2011

Mrs. Lantz presented for approval the calendars of regularly scheduled board meetings, committee meetings and County holidays for 2012.

Kearney made motion to approve the calendars of regularly scheduled board meetings, committee meetings and County holidays for 2012. Bennett seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Chairman Cannon called for committee reports. (Committee reports are attached to the minutes). Action taken during Legislative committee report is as follows:

Hayden made motion to relocate Shelbyville Precincts 1 & 2 polling place to the Shelbyville American Legion, 121 E. N. 2nd Street, Shelbyville, IL 62565. Clark seconded the motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Chairman Cannon gave a brief update on Dennis Ballinger's Eagle Creek Resort project. Correspondence included a thank you note from CEFS for the County's food bank donations. Chairman Cannon wished everyone a Merry Christmas.

At this time, Chairman Cannon thanked Alan Spesard and the Highway Department employees, Sheriff Mike Miller and employee, Bill Calvert for all their work disposing of records and relocating offices within the Courthouse.

There was no further business to come before the Shelby County Board.

Clark made motion to assess mileage and per diem for the December meetings, to pay the bills/payroll as approved by the committees and adjourn until the next regular meeting to be held on January 11, 2012. Doerner seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no) and the meeting was adjourned at 10:05 A.M.

RESOLUTION NO. 2011-58

Enacting Fee to Support Shelby County Drug Court

WHEREAS, 55 ILCS 5/5-1101(f) provides, in pertinent part, that in each County in which a Drug Court program has been created, a County may adopt a mandatory fee of up to \$5.00 to be assessed pursuant to statute; and

WHEREAS, 55 ILCS 5/5-1101(f) further provides that assessments collected by the Clerk of the Circuit Court pursuant to statute and ordinance or resolution must be deposited into an account specifically for the operation and administration of a Drug Court program; and

WHEREAS, 55 ILCS 5/5-1101(f) further provides that the Clerk of the Circuit Court shall collect the fees to the Drug Court program monthly, less 5%, which is to be retained as fee income to the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court; and

WHEREAS, 55 ILCS 5/5-1101(f) further provides that the fees collected are to be paid as follows:

- 1. A fee of up to \$5.00 paid by the defendant on a judgment of guilty or grant of supervision for violation of the Illinois Vehicle Code or violations of similar provisions contained in County or municipal ordinances committed in the County;
- 2. A fee of up to \$5.00 paid by the defendant on a judgment of guilty or grant of supervision under Section 5-9-1 of the Unified Code of Corrections for a felony; for a Class A, Class B, or Class C misdemeanor; for a petty offense and for a business offense; and

WHEREAS, there presently exists in Shelby County a program, known as the Shelby County Drug Court, whose program and goals the Shelby County Board supports.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the County of Shelby, that a mandatory fee of \$5.00 is hereby established and assessed pursuant to 55 ILCS 5/5-1101(f); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the County of Shelby that assessments collected by the Clerk of the Circuit Court pursuant to statute and this resolution shall be deposited into an account maintained by the Shelby County Treasurer specifically for the operation and administration of the Drug Court; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the County of Shelby that the Clerk of the Circuit Court shall collect the fees to the Drug Court program monthly, less 5%, which is to be retained into the Circuit Court Clerk Operation and Administrative Fund; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the County of Shelby that the fees collected are to be paid as follows:

- 1. A fee of up to \$5.00 paid by the defendant on a judgment of guilty or grant of supervision for violation of the Illinois Vehicle Code or violations of similar provisions contained in County or municipal ordinances committed in the County;
- 2. A fee of up to \$5.00 paid by the defendant on a judgment of guilty or grant of supervision under Section 5-9-1 of the Unified Code of Corrections for a felony; for a Class A, Class B, or Class C misdemeanor; for a petty offense and for a business offense; and



A Resolution Supporting the Taylorville Energy Center IGCC Plant with Carbon Capture

WHEREAS, the Christian County Generation, LLC is moving toward completion of plans to build and operate one of the first Integrated Gasification Combined-Cycle (IGCC) electric generating stations with carbon capture; and

WHEREAS, managing partner Tenaska has worked closely with the community of Taylorville, Illinois and Christian County to site and develop the project; and

WHEREAS, both national government and electric industry projections state that Illinois needs additional reliable electric generating capacity; and

WHEREAS, central and southern Illinois possess large reserves of high-sulfur coal that would be valued as fuel to an IGCC power plant at a projected rate of \$75 million per year (a total of 1.5 million to 1.8 million tons annually); and

WHEREAS, the Taylorville Energy Center IGCC plant would be among the first power plants in the world with the ability to remove fuel impurities associated with emissions from coal-fueled power plants, including sulfur, mercury, and particulate matter; and

WHEREAS, the plant's planners are committed to incorporating cutting-edge technology to capture more than half of the carbon dioxide produced at the plant and prevent it from entering the atmosphere, giving the facility and emissions profile comparable to a natural gas-fueled plant; and

WHEREAS, Illinois employment would be increased by more than 2,500 jobs during the construction phase of the power plant; and

WHEREAS, the electric power generation facility will employ 155 permanent employees and contractors in Christian County, and add indirect employment of an additional 644 full-time and part-time jobs as a result of electric power generation operations; and

WHEREAS, an added 238 long-term workers would be employed in coal mining in support of the plant's operations, which would create an additional 297 permanent indirect jobs; and

WHEREAS, local and regional economic activity would increase by approximately \$126 million annually during commercial operation; therefore be it

RESOLVED, the **County Board of Shelby County**, **Illinois** hereby supports the Taylorville Energy Center IGCC plant with carbon capture, which provides a new market for the Illinois coal industry; incorporates the most advanced emission control technology; and brings thousands of needed jobs through construction and hundreds more through operation of the facility to Christian county and the surrounding region; and therefore be it further

RESOLVED, County Board of Shelby County, Illinois urges the State of Illinois and its elected representatives to take swift and positive action to review the Facility Cost Report and approve it to advance the project.

Statement of Understanding Between

Lake Land College and Shelby County

Professional

Experience Program – LLC Cooperative Educational Program Guidelines

Inherent in the successful conduct of a cooperative education program is the assumption of certain obligations and responsibilities by each of the parties involved – the college, the employer, and the student. Accordingly, in order to establish a basis of mutual understanding among the three parties, and to ensure that the program is carried out to the mutual satisfaction of each participant, responsibilities and obligations are agreed to as outlined:

A. The college agrees to:

- 1. Inform qualified prospective candidates of cooperative education opportunities.
- 2. Provide the employer needed data and information about candidates such as transcripts of courses and grades.
- 3. Inform the employer immediately when a student trainee is dropped or is in danger of being dropped from the college's cooperative education program because of either a school or student action.
- 4. Advise the employer of administrative action(s) affecting student trainee, e.g., probation, academic warning, change of major.
- 5. Provide counseling assistance to the student trainee and/or point of contact for information exchange and program liaison purposes with the employer.

B. The employer agrees to:

- 1. Keep the college informed of learning experience opportunities.
- 2. Consider candidates referred by the college for participation in the program and advise the college accordingly.
- 3. Orient the student to the work setting to which assigned.
- 4. Provide the student trainee with meaningful and increasingly responsible learning experiences correlated to his/her academic work in the major functional areas of his/her career field and guide the student trainee in carrying out the assignments.
- 5. Furnish the college with supervisory evaluations for the student trainee after each work period.
- 6. Notify the college of any personnel actions taken which may affect the status of tenure of the student trainee including intent to release.
- 7. Refrain from extending an offer of permanent employment to the student trainee that would become operative before the student received his/her degree.
- 8. Provide counseling assistance to the student trainee and point of conduct to facilitate information exchange and program liaison with the college counterpart.
- 9. Provide the college with such additional information as may be necessary to assure effective mutual cooperation and successful program operation.

- C. The student trainee agrees to:
 - 1. Satisfy the academic standards of the college, satisfy the cooperative education program requirements and satisfy the work performance standards of the employer.
 - 2. Submit a brief paper related to work experience as required by the college's cooperative education program and such other reports as may be required by the employer.
 - 3. Remain a candidate in good standing with the college.
 - 4. Remain in attendance and enrolled in a study program leading to an Associate degree in Civil Engineering Technology and forego any offer of permanent employment by an employer with whom the student would become operative prior to actual receipt of the degree.
 - 5. Attend briefings and other meetings as required.
 - 6. Comply with appropriate college registration requirements.
 - 7. Comply with other conditions as may be requires for the successful program administration and operation.

Upon graduation or dismissal from the Program, the student's status as a Cooperative Education employee shall be terminated. The employer at its discretion may offer employment on other terms.

WHEREAS, the COUNTY desires to transfer Surface Transportation Program funds to the DEPARTMENT in return for State funds to be used by the COUNTY to pay a portion of the County Engineer's salary, an amount not to exceed fifty percent (50%) of the County Engineer's annual salary:

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the covenants and agreements herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

THE COUNTY AGREES:

- That it will provide the DEPARTMENT with a resolution passed by the County Board authorizing the transfer of the COUNTY's Surface Transportation Program Funds to the State for an equal amount of State Funds.
- 2. That it will deposit the State funds in the COUNTY's Motor Fuel Tax account.
- 3. An annual resolution appropriating funds for the payment of the County Engineer's annual salary shall be submitted to the DEPARTMENT along with the resolution authorizing the amount of Surface Transportation Program funds to be transferred.
- 4. To maintain, for a minimum of 3 years after the completion of the contract, adequate books, records and supporting documents to verify the amounts, recipients and uses of all disbursements of funds passing in conjunction with the contract; the contract and all books, records and supporting documents related to the contract shall be available for review by the DEPARTMENT and/or Auditor General and to provide full access to all relevant materials. Failure to maintain the books, records and supporting documents required by this section shall establish a presumption in favor of the STATE for the recovery of funds paid by the STATE under the contract for which adequate books, records and supporting documentation are not available to support their purported disbursement.

THE DEPARTMENT AGREES:

- 1. To accept the COUNTY's Surface Transportation Program funds and make an equal amount of State funds available to the COUNTY for deposit in the COUNTY's Motor Fuel Tax account.
- 2. That payment of the State funds to the COUNTY will be made each year upon receipt of the COUNTY's resolution transferring their Surface Transportation Program funds and appropriating their Motor Fuel Tax or other funds for payment of their County Engineer's salary.



AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PLACEMENT OF PRIVATE USE WIND ENERGY TURBINES

WHEREAS, an Application for amendment to the Zoning Ordinance for Shelby County has been made by the Zoning Administrator and said application was referred to the Shelby County Planning Commission for public hearing and at its meeting on November 29th, 2011 recommended that such amendments be made by the Shelby County Board; and,

WHEREAS, said application was referred to the Shelby County Board of Appeals for further hearing and at its meeting on November 30^{th} , 2011 recommended that such amendments be made by the Shelby County Board; and

WHEREAS the Zoning Ordinance of Shelby County, No. 05-05 provides for the setting of certain fees to be charged by and paid to Shelby County for various zoning application, permits and appeals;

WHEREAS, this ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Shelby County Board that the aforementioned Zoning Ordinance is to be amended as follows:

ARTICLE II, Section 16 COMMERCIAL WIND ENERGY SYSTEM STANDARDS shall read:

ARTICLE II § 16. WIND ENERGY SYSTEM STANDARDS

DEFINITIONS

Applicant means the entity or person who submits to the county an application for the siting of any WECS or Substation.

Financial Assurance means reasonable assurance from a credit worthy party, examples of which include a surety bond, trust instrument, cash escrow, or irrevocable letter of credit.

Private/Individual WECS means a WECS that is to be constructed for the sole purpose of generating energy for the property it is constructed on.

Operator means the entity responsible for the day-to-day operation and maintenance of the WECS, including any third party subcontractors.

Owner means the entity or entitles with an equity interest in the WECS(s), including their respective successors and assigns. Owner does not mean (I) the property owner from whom land is leased for locating the WECS (unless the property owner has an equity interest in the WECS); or (ii) any person holding a security interest in the WECS (s) solely to secure an extension of credit, or a person foreclosing on such security interest provided that after foreclosure, such person seeks to sell the WECS(s) at the earliest practicable date.

Professional Engineer means a qualified individual who is licensed as a professional engineer in any state in the United States.

Primary Structure means, for each property, the structure that one or more persons occupy the majority of time on that property for either business or personal reasons. Primary Structure includes structures such as residences, commercial buildings, hospitals, and day care facilities. Primary Structure excludes structures such as hunting sheds, storage sheds, pool housed, unattached garages and barns.

Substation means the apparatus that connects the electrical collection system of the WECS(s) and increases the voltage for connection with the utility's transmission lines.

Wind Energy Conversion System (WECS) means all necessary devices that together convert wind into electricity, including the rotor, nacelle, generator, WECS Tower, electrical components, WECS foundation, transformer, and electrical cabling from the WECS Tower to the Substation(s).

WECS Project means the collection of WECS and Substations as specified in the siting approval application of this Ordinance.

WECS Tower means the support structure to which the nacelle and rotor are attached.

WECS Tower Height means the distance from the rotor blade at its highest point to the top surface of the WECS foundation.

Regulation of Commercial Wind Energy Systems (Wind Farms)

- a. No person shall construct or operate a wind energy conversion system (WECS) without having fully complied with the provisions of this Section. For purposes of this Section, WECS refers solely to each combined wind turbine and tower. All WECS equipment shall be in compliance with all applicable state and federal regulatory standards including the Uniform Building Code as adopted by the State of Illinois, the National Electrical Code as adopted by the State of Illinois, FAA requirements, EPA regulations (hazardous waste, construction, storm water; etc) and any other statutory or regulatory requirements.
- Facility equipment shall conform to applicable industry standards including the American Wind Energy Association standards for wind

turbine design and related standards adopted by the American Standards Institute (ANSI). Applicants shall submit certificates from equipment manufacturers that the equipment is manufactured in compliance with industry standards.

Permits Required

- a. A WECS permit shall be obtained from the Zoning Administrator for the construction of all WECS.
- b. A building Permit shall be obtained to allow construction of WECS.

Application Requirements

An application for a permit to build a wind energy system shall include the following:

- a. A WECS Project summary, including, to the extent available: (1) a general description of the project, including its approximate name plate generating capacity; the potential equipment manufacturer(s), type(s) of WECS(s), number of WECSs, and name plate generating capacity of each WECS; the maximum height of the WECS Tower(s) and maximum diameter of the WECS(s) rotor(s); the general location of the project; and (2) a description of the Applicant, Owner, and Operator, including their respective business structures.
- b. The name(s), address(es), and phone number(s) of the Applicant(s), Owner and Operator, and all property owner(s), if known.
- c. Petitioner will provide a graphic Site Plan Exhibit including the easement boundaries final site location and legal descriptions for each site to the Zoning Administrator for approval before construction begins. Petitioner will furnish the Zoning Administrator with certified "as built" site plans and easement descriptions drawings showing the location of wind turbines, roads, transmission lines and all other improvements. A topographic map of the project site shall include the project site and the surrounding area.
- d. Location of all above-ground utility lines within a radius equal to two (2) times the height of the proposed WECS.
- e Location of all underground utility lines on the WECS site.
- f. Dimensional representation of the structural components of the tower construction including the base and footings.

- g. Schematic of electrical systems associated with the WECS including all existing and proposed electrical connections.
- h. Manufacturer's specifications and installation and operation instructions or specific WECS design information.
- Certification by a registered professional engineer that the tower design is sufficient to withstand wind load requirements for structure as defined by BOCA.
- j. All turbines shall be new equipment commercially available; no used, experimental or proto-type equipment still in testing shall be approved by the Zoning Officer or the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Setback Requirements

- a. No WECS shall be constructed in any setback, dedicated public easement or dedicated public right-of-way without prior written authorization from the landowner, township and county.
- b. Installation of any WECS may not be nearer that three hundred fifty (350) feet or 1.1 times the height of the WECS, whichever is greatest, to any property lines, dedicated roadway, railroad right-of-way for overhead electrical transmission or distribution lines. Distance shall be measured from the foundation at the base of the turbine. New structures built adjacent to wind power facilities shall maintain these same minimum setback requirements. Participating land owners within the area comprising the wind energy conversion system may waive property line setbacks with written approval from all landowners sharing such property line.
- c. Except as provided herein the setback distance for turbines with a rated capacity of 1.0 MW or less or less shall be 1,000 feet or more from any existing or occupied residence and turbines with a greater rated capacity shall be set back 1,400 feet or more from any existing or occupied residence or from the boundary of any to which as of the date of approval of the Special Use is in a platted subdivision and shall be setback from a property line 1.1 times the height of the turbine with the blade tip at its highest point. Distance shall be measured at the time of application for building permit from the foundation at the base of the turbine. A turbine may be placed as near as 600 feet from an occupied residence with the prior written approval of the owner. The setback distance will

- be followed except in specific instances allowed in the special use permit by the Zoning Board of Appeals.
- d. The setback distance for the turbines will be 1500 feet from any platted community which enforces its own government. Distance shall be measured from the foundation at the base of the turbine to the closest Corporate Limit boundary line. (Shelby County will reference the most current Official Year Book on file with the Zoning office).

Safety Requirements

- a. <u>Blade Clearance</u> The minimum distance between the ground and any protruding blade(s) utilized on a WECS shall be fifteen (15) feet, as measured at the lowest point of the arc of the blades. The minimum distance shall be increased as necessary to provide for vehicle clearance in locations where over-sized vehicles might travel.
- b. <u>Climbing Towers. Tower Access</u> Access to lattice towers shall be controlled by fences six (6) feet in height around the tower and anticlimbing devices. Fences will not be required for tubular towers with an internal ladder and locked door. Existing local regulations shall cover wind systems as well.
- c. <u>SIGNAGE</u>. Signage regulations are to be consistent with ANSI and AWEA standards. Signs warning of high voltage shall be posted at least at the entrances of the facility.
- d. **NOISE and VIBRATION.** Noise and vibration levels shall be in compliance with all County and Illinois Pollution Control Agency (IPCA) regulations.
- e. <u>ELECTRICAL COLLECTION CABLES</u>. All WECS electrical collection cables between each WECS shall be located underground unless they are located on public or utility rights-of-way or with prior County approval. All communication lines that are buried should be at a depth consistent with local utility and telecommunication underground lines standards until the same reach the property line or a substation adjacent to the property line.
- f. <u>TOWER CONSTRUCTION</u>. Tower construction shall be in accordance with all applicable sections of the Illinois Statutes, if any.

- g. <u>UTILITY INTERCONNECTION.</u> The WECS, if interconnected to a utility system, shall meet the requirements for interconnection and operate as set forth in the electrical utility's then-current service regulations applicable to WECS.
- h. WASTE MANAGEMENT. All SOLID WASTE whether generated from supplies, equipment, parts, packaging, or operation or maintenance of the facility, including old parts and equipment, shall be removed from the site in a timely manner consistent with industry standards. All HAZARDOUS WASTE generated by the operation and maintenance of the facility, including but not limited to lubricating materials, shall be handled in a manner consistent with all local, state and federal rules and regulations.
- i. <u>LIGHTING.</u> Projects shall utilize minimal lighting. No tower lighting other than normal security lighting shall be permitted except as may be required by the FAA.

Public Services

- a. Roads. Any proposed access roads that will be used for construction purposes shall be identified and approved by the Township Road Commissioner and the County Engineer prior to issuance of the building permit. Township Road Commissioner and County Engineer shall conduct a pre-construction baseline survey to determine existing road conditions for assessing potential future damage.
- b. Any road damage repairs caused by the transport of the facility's equipment, the installation of same, or the removal of same, must be completed to the satisfaction of the Township Road Commissioner and the County Engineer. The Township Road Commissioner and County Engineer may choose to require either remediation of road repair upon completion of the project or are authorized to collect fees for oversized load permits. Further, a corporate surety bond in an amount to be fixed by the Township Road Commissioner or the County Engineer may be required by the Township Road Commissioner or the County Engineer to insure the township or the county that future repairs are completed to the satisfaction of the unit of local government.
- c. <u>Dust Control</u> Reasonable dust control measures will be required by the County during construction of the WECS.

- d. <u>Sewer and Water</u> Any facility shall comply with existing septic and well regulation as required by the Shelby County Health Department and the State of Illinois Department of Public Health.
- e. <u>Drainage Repair</u> All damages to waterways, drainage ditches, field tiles, or any other infrastructures caused by the construction or maintenance of the WECS, must be completely repaired to near original condition.

Engineer's Certificate

The engineer's certificate shall be completed by a structural engineer registered in the State of Illinois and shall certify that the tower and foundation are compatible with and appropriate for the turbine to be installed and that the specific soils at the site can support the apparatus. All commercially installed wind turbines must utilize self-supporting tubular towers.

Certificate of Contracts

Certificate shall verify that power purchase contracts, power transmission contracts, and other legal rights are in place.

Decommissioning Plan

Petitioner shall ensure that the facilities are properly decommissioned a. upon the end of the project life or facility abandonment. Petitioner's obligations with respect to decommissioning shall include removal of all physical material pertaining to the project improvements to a depth of 48" beneath the soil surface, and restoration of the area occupied by the project improvements to as near as practicable to the same condition that existed immediately before construction of such improvements. Prior to issuance of a building permit, Petitioner will provide a bond, letter of credit or other security acceptable to the County, for the cost of decommissioning each tower to be constructed under that building permit, which security shall be released when such tower is decommissioned. Petitioner will provide an affidavit to the Shelby County Zoning Board representing that all easements for wind turbines shall contain terms that provide financial assurance, including access to the salvage value of the equipment, for the property owners to ensure that facilities are properly decommissioned within twelve (12) months of expiration or earlier termination of the project.

- Obtaining necessary recorded access easements and necessary recorded utility easements, copies of which shall be submitted to the Zoning Administrator.
- c. No appurtenances other than those associated with the wind turbine operations shall be connected to any wind tower except in accordance with the Shelby County Zoning Ordinance.

Required Safety Features

- a. All WECS shall be designed with an automatic overspeed control to render the system inoperable when winds are blowing in excess of the speeds for which the machine is designed.
- b. All WECS shall have a manually operable method to render the system inoperable in the event of a structural or mechanical failure of any part of the system including the automatic overspeed control.
- c. All WECS shall be designed with an automatic control to render the system inoperable in case of loss utility power to prevent the WECS from supplying power to a de-energized electrical distribution system.
- d. Any WECS thereof declared to be unsafe by the Zoning Administrator by reason of inadequate maintenance, dilapidation, obsolescence, fire hazard, disaster, damage or abandonment is hereby declared to be a public nuisance and shall be abated by repair, rehabilitation, demolition or removal in accordance with the procedures set forth in the County Ordinances governing the removal of Nuisances.

Maintenance

The Zoning Administrator or his representative shall have the right, at any reasonable time, to enter, in the company of the owner, operator or his agent, the premises on which a WECS has been constructed to inspect all parts of said WECS installation and require that repairs or alterations be made within thirty (30) days if, in his judgment, there exist a deficiency in the structural stability of the system.

Inspections

Inspections at a fee to be determined from time to time may be made by the Zoning Administrator, or by a qualified inspector for equipment of this type selected by him, no more than once annually to certify the safety and maintenance of the WECS and accessory structures. Total annual inspection fees shall not exceed \$100.00 per WECS per year, with

an escalation equal to the change in the Consumer Price Index as reported by the Federal Government.

Arbitration

In the event a dispute arises as to satisfaction of the forgoing conditions to this special ordinance, such dispute may be resolved judicially or may at the request of the petitioner, county, or the aggrieved party, be resolved pursuant to binding arbitration in accordance with the procedures of the American Arbitration Association by an independent arbitrator acceptable to petitioner and the County or aggrieved party, as applicable. If petitioner and the County or the aggrieved party, as applicable, are unable to agree on an arbitrator, then each such party shall choose an independent arbitrator and their respective choices shall then choose an arbitrator. This condition shall not bind an aggrieved party, other than the County or petitioner, to submit to arbitration.

Further application after completion of project construction.

Construction of the wind farm shall begin within 12 months from the date of this Special Exception Use Ordinance. After construction is complete, the "as built" drawing showing the location of wind turbines, roads, transmission lines and all other improvements related to the wind turbine installation shall be delivered to the Zoning Office. Only the land utilized for these wind turbines and related improvements shall be designated for a the area of special exception permit. Upon completion of construction the surrounding area will be again zoned as originally designated prior to the application for Special Exception as if the Special Exception had never been granted. Additional wind turbines to be placed on that same parcel of land shall require another petition for recommendation by the planning commission and approval from the Zoning Board of Appeals.

WIND ENERGY SYSTEM STANDARDS(PRIVATE/INDIVIDUAL)

Regulation of Private/Individual Wind Energy Systems

a. No person shall construct or operate a wind energy conversion system (WECS) without having fully complied with the provisions of this Section. For purposes of this Section, WECS refers solely to each combined wind turbine and tower. All WECS equipment shall be in compliance with all applicable state and federal regulatory standards including the Uniform Building Code as adopted by the State of Illinois, the National Electrical Code as adopted by the State of Illinois, FAA requirements, EPA regulations (hazardous waste,

- construction, storm water; etc) and any other statutory or regulatory requirements.
- Facility equipment shall conform to applicable industry standards including
 the American Wind Energy Association standards for wind turbine design and
 related standards adopted by the American Standards Institute (ANSI).
 Applicants shall submit certificates from equipment manufacturers that the
 equipment is manufactured in compliance with industry standards.

Permits Required

- a. A WECS permit shall be obtained from the Zoning Administrator for the construction of all WECS.
- b. A building Permit shall be obtained to allow construction of WECS.

Rules and Setback Requirments of Private/Individual WECS Permits

- a. Turbines will be allowed in Ag, R1, RR, GB and I1
- b. A maximum height at the top of blade tip of 150 feet.
- c. A setback of 1.5 times the height of the unit at the top of the blade tip. This applies to any property line, right of way or easement.
- d. Tower and blade color shall be painted white or gray or another non-reflective, unobtrusive color.
- e. No more than two turbines on a single tract of property will be permitted.

Violations

a. Any person, firm or corporation, or agent, employee or contractor of such, who violates, disobeys, omits, neglects, or refuses to comply with, or who resists enforcement of any provision of this Ordinance shall be in violation, and shall be subject to a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each offense. Each week a violation continues to exist shall constitute a separate offense. The Shelby County Zoning Administrator shall be responsible for the administration and enforcement of the regulations of this Ordinance. The Shelby County State's Attorney shall prosecute violations of this Ordinance for the County.

Severability

a. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

Fees

- a. Wind Energy Conversion System **(COMMERCIAL)** application for permit FIVE HUNDRED (\$500.00) DOLLARS
- b. Wind Energy Conversion System (PRIVATE/INDVIDUAL) application for permit ONE HUNDRED TWENTY FIVE (\$125.00) DOLLARS.

Effective Date

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage from the Shelby County Board.






