SHELBY COUNTY BOARD MEETING

January 12, 2011 – 9:00 A.M.

The Shelby County Board met on Wednesday, January 12, 2011, at 9:00 A.M. at the Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman Bruce Cannon called the meeting to order. All present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Clerk called the roll. Absent were Fred Doerner, Roger Pauley and Norma Stewart. Ken Barr and Robert Jordan were tardy.

Minutes for the December 6, 2010 organizational and December 8, 2010 regular board meetings were presented for approval.

MOTION: Richard Hayden made motion to approve the minutes of the December 6, 2010, organizational board meeting as presented.

David Cruitt seconded the motion.
VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried.

MOTION: Larry Lenz made motion to approve the minutes of the December 8, 2010, regular board meeting as presented.

Robin Robertson seconded the motion.
VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried.

Chairman Cannon stated that the first item on the agenda, an Executive Session, would be heard later on the agenda to allow States Attorney Deborah Riley to attend.

Chairman Cannon presented the Emergency Management Agency (EMA) and Supervisor of Assessments (SOA) FY 2010-2011 proposed budget amendments. SOA Diana Wagner requested a budget amendment to reduce the Field Person Salary line item by \$3,500.00 and to increase the Field Person Mileage line item by \$3,500.00. The line item total amount would be \$9,500.00 and \$5,500.00, respectively. EMA Director Jared Rowcliffe requested the creation of a new department titled Emergency Management Agency Special Funds and an expense line item for that department. Grants, totaling \$9,100.00, for local emergency planning had been received by the county. Chairman Cannon further explained that at the time the grants were received there was no account set up for the grants; therefore, the \$9,100.00 was put into the Capital Improvement account. Mr. Rowcliffe cannot access the Capital Improvement line item so the new department is necessary. Mrs. Wagner and Mr. Rowcliffe met with the Budget Committee prior to Board meeting to present their budget amendment requests.

MOTION: Dale Wetherell made motion to approve the FY 2010-2011 budget amendments as requested by the County's EMA Coordinator and Supervisor of Assessments as presented.

Barbara Bennett seconded the motion.
VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried.

Alan Spesard, County Highway Engineer, addressed the Board to give the highway report. Mr. Spesard presented the following four Resolutions for approval: Award Annual County Rock Contracts; Award Annual County Culverts Contracts, Groups 1 and 2; Award Annual County Culverts Contract, Group 3; and Award Highway Department Surplus Equipment.

Resolution – Award Annual County Rock Contracts:

Resolution – Award Highway Department Surplus Equipment:

MOTION: Glenn R. “Dick” Clark made motion to approve the Resolution to award to Jeff Montgomery a 1990 Chevrolet pickup truck and 1992 Chevrolet Suburban based on his high bids of \$367.00 and \$407.00 as presented.
Kay Kearney seconded the motion.

VOTE: All voted aye by voice and the motion carried.

Referencing the Highway Department Annual Report, Mr. Spesard gave the Board some highlights on the work in the County Highway during the last calendar year. Mr. Spesard will report at the next board meeting on the lettings held in the next month.

EMA/Zoning Administrator Jared Rowcliffe updated the Board on the activities of the EMA/Zoning offices. Mr. Rowcliffe highlighted the Zoning/EMA update report previously mailed to the Board for their review. The Illinois Windworking Group is hosting a conference on Siting, Zoning and Taxing Winds Farms on February 9, 2011. Anyone interested in attending needs to see Mr. Rowcliffe to register. As EMA Coordinator, Mr. Rowcliffe informed the Board that an US EPA grant was awarded to IEMA and will be used to help 50 Illinois school districts screen school buildings for Radon. Mr. Rowcliffe has notified Shelby County school officials of the grant.

Chairman Cannon called for committee reports. Those reporting were:

Budget Committee – Chairman Cannon stated a committee meeting was held to review the FY 2010-2011 budget amendments requested by Mrs. Wagner and Mr. Rowcliffe.

Fees and Salaries Committee – Mr. Robertson stated that the meeting went well.

Legislative Committee – Mr. Robertson stated that a meeting was held to review the County Board closed session minutes of the last six months. The Legislative Committee recommends that the closed session minutes of the July 14, 2010, September 8, 2010 and November 10, 2010 meetings be opened to the public.

At this time, Chairman Cannon told the Board members that binders had been prepared for each committee to use to take minutes of their meetings according to number 13 in the County Board’s Order of Business. Binders may be picked up in the County Clerk’s office. Minutes should contain a roll call, synopsis of what goes on in the meeting and then be filed in the County Clerk’s office.

MOTION: Rob Amling made motion to approve opening the closed session minutes as stated above.
Barbara Bennett seconded the motion.

Purchasing Committee – Mr. Roessler stated that all claims were approved.

Mr. Warren noted that the new squad car purchased by the Sheriff was to replace a wrecked car that had been covered by insurance.

Animal Control Committee – Mr. Jordan told the Board about an animal control issue south of Stewardson

Health Committee – Mr. Barr reported all bills were in order.

Law Enforcement Committee – Mr. Hayden stated no meeting was held. The Sheriff has traded the Chevrolet Avalanche obtained from a drug bust for a new Jeep Cherokee. The plan is within the Sheriff’s budget.

Airport Committee – Chairman Cannon reported on an issue with the fixed base operator’s liability insurance.

Public Buildings Committee – Mr. Warren stated a meeting was held and informed the Board that there were water leaks in the shower area of the Detention Center. Quotes for repair are being sought. Mr. Warren presented a new roofing shingle product of recycled plastics for consideration, if courthouse preservation grants are forthcoming.

COUNTY HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT FUNDING

ANNUAL LOCAL TAX & STATE MFT FUNDING

Shelby County receives local property tax funds and State motor fuel tax (MFT) funds. These funds are considered “Special Revenue Funds” due to the fact that they are legally restricted for expenditures for use by the Shelby County Highway Department for the construction and maintenance of Highways. The local tax revenues and expenditures are internally controlled by the County Bridge, County Highway, and Federal Aid Secondary accounts. The state motor fuel tax revenues and expenditures are internally controlled by the County Motor Fuel Tax and Township Motor Fuel Tax accounts. The expenditures and revenues associated with these funds are audited annually by the Shelby County contracted auditing firm of “Mose, Yockey, Brown & Kull, LLC (MY&K)”. In addition to the audit performed by MY&K, the State & Township MFT expenditures and revenues are audited annually by the Illinois Department of Transportation.

- There was a reduction of Motor Fuel Tax Revenue due to a Statewide reduction in the sale of fuel
- 2009 Capital Bill increased payment of MFT funds to County = \$65,259

Details associated with these revenues and expenditures for the current Fiscal Year ending in August 31, 2010 will be published by MY&K in a report entitled “AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION” in the spring of 2011

STATE & FEDERAL CONTROLLED FUNDING

The IDOT committed State and Federal Funding for Shelby County Capital Improvement Projects as follows:

Total Federal, State and local Construction Funds for Bridge & Road Projects = \$847,314

- Federal Bridge Replacement & Rehabilitation Funds totaling approximately \$552,758 toward 80 % of the awarded contract construction and engineering costs for township bridges.

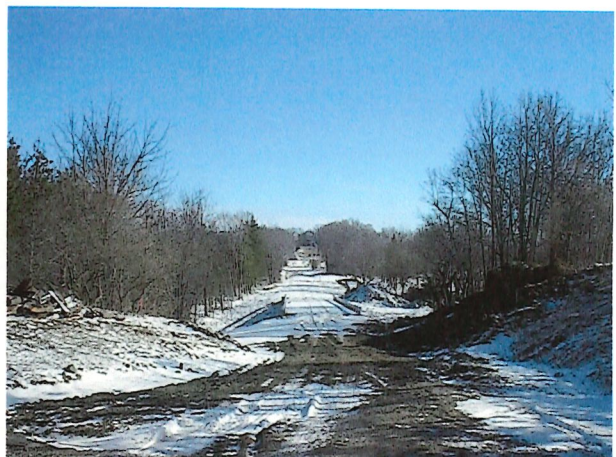

PREVAILING WAGE ADVISORY September 14, 2009

Governor Quinn Signs Bills to Clarify and Enhance Compliance with the Prevailing Wage Act

Three separate prevailing wage bills aimed at clarifying what work is covered and how contractors are to be notified that projects are subject to prevailing wage requirements were passed by the General Assembly and signed into law by Governor Pat Quinn this summer. These changes become effective **January 1, 2010** and the Illinois Department of Labor is actively communicating these changes to affected parties in order to promote greater understanding and compliance with the revised law.

On July 23, Gov. Quinn signed **Senate Bill 223 (Public Act 96-0058)** to clarify that “public works” includes all projects funded in whole or in part through *bonds, grants, loans or other funds made available by or through the State or any of its political subdivisions*. Prior to the passage of SB 223, some doubt existed within the regulated community as to whether projects financed through public funding mechanisms not specifically enumerated in the Act were “covered” work. This ambiguity resulted in millions of dollars in back wages, penalties and legal costs being incurred by contractors, developers and public bodies. Public Act 96-0058 removes any doubt over whether such work is covered by explicitly stating that a construction project is covered by the Prevailing Wage Act if it is financed in whole or in part with bonds, grants loans or other funds made available through the State or any of its political subdivisions. These political subdivisions include traditional public bodies such as municipalities, counties and state agencies, as well as non-traditional public bodies, such as the Illinois Finance Authority, the Illinois Housing Development Authority and regional economic development authorities.

The Department of Labor believes this clarification was needed to ensure workers receive a fair wage and to help contractors and developers avoid penalties due to an inadvertent failure to comply with the law. The Department wants to make sure all interested parties – public bodies, developers and contractors – understand their obligations and comply with the requirements of the Prevailing Wage Act. To this end, the Department is currently conducting outreach to advise public bodies, business organizations, developers and contractors of recent changes to the Act and their responsibilities under the law, including better notification by public bodies and first-tier contractors that projects are subject to prevailing wage at the outset of the project, before any work is performed.

Another prevailing wage bill signed by Gov. Quinn, **House Bill 952 (Public Act 96-0186)**, amends the law to explicitly cover all demolition work undertaken by a public body, regardless of whether or not the demolition work is in conjunction with a public works construction project. Prior to this change, there

was some disagreement as to whether such demolition work was covered if it was not related to a public works construction project.

The final prevailing wage bill, **House Bill 163 (Public Act 96-0437)**, holds public bodies financially responsible for any interest, penalties or fines assessed by the Department if they fail to provide proper written notification to a contractor that a project is subject to the Prevailing Wage Act. Similarly, contractors that fail to notify their subcontractors that a project is subject to prevailing wage requirements will be held responsible for any interest, penalties or fines assessed by the Department. However, regardless of whether or not they were properly notified, contractors that fail to pay the proper wages to their workers are still responsible for all back wages owed to those workers.
