SHELBY COUNTY BOARD MEETING

November 13, 2013 - 9:00 A.M.

The Shelby County Board met on Wednesday, November 13, 2013, at 9:00 A.M. at the Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman Cannon called the meeting to order, Don Strohl gave the prayer and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

County Clerk Jessica Fox called the roll. Behl, Gergeni and Wetherell were absent. Strohl had previously notified the Chairman that he would be leaving early.

Minutes for the October 9, 2013 board meeting were presented for approval. Mulholland made motion to approve the minutes as presented. Clark seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no).

At this time, State's Attorney Gina Vonderheide requested approval for the annual State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor Resolution after noting highlights of the agreement.

Amling made motion to approve the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor Resolution as presented. Mulholland seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no). (Resolution attached to these minutes).

Probation Officers Jyl Fathauer and Heather Wooters, requested approval for the Drug Court Resolution regarding drug testing and fees. This resolution had been previously passed by the Board in December 2011, however the wording has changed slightly and another Resolution needs to be approved by the Board.

Hunter made a motion to approve the Drug Court Resolution as presented. Williams seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no).

Next, Wooters requested the board proclaim December 2013 as Drunk and Drugged Driving (3D) Prevention Month. The Memorial Tree will be in placed in the Courthouse throughout the month of December. Wooters thanked the Board for their support. (Proclamation attached to these minutes).

Clark made motion to approve the Proclamation declaring December 2013 to be Drunk and Drugged Driving (3D) Prevention Month. Warner seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no).

Dennis Shiley, CEFS Transportation Director, addressed the Board requesting revisions to the Illinois Department of Transportation Capital Assistance Application for Rural Transportation that had previously been approved by the Board in June 2013. Shelby County had previously requested three minivans for Rolling Stock; this will be changed to one minivan and one medium duty 14 passenger bus. The wash bay will also be taken out of this grant for the maintenance building, as there will not be enough funding for the wash bay.

Simpson made motion to approve the revisions to the IDOT Capital Assistance Application for Rural Transportation as presented. Hayden seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no). (Revised application attached to these minutes).

In continuing, Shiley reported that CIPT had exceeded their goals for the Shelbyville area in the month of October. They are continuing to do more with less, and will need to continue to build up the fleet of vehicles in the future.

At this time, Chairman Cannon called for the County Highway Engineer's report.

Alan Spesard, County Highway Engineer, presented one Agreement between the County and IDOT for the Clarksburg/County Highway Railroad Crossing Approach Improvements. This project will be 100% funded. Estimated costs for both the approach work and railroad improvements are \$695,000.00. The design work for the approach will be done in house by the County Highway department and they will also oversee construction on this project.

Warren made motion to approve the agreement between the County and IDOT for the Clarksburg/County Highway Railroad Crossing Approach Improvements. Simpson seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no). (Agreement attached to these minutes).

Providing some updates and highlights, Spesard reported that the semi-annual Highway Commissioners conference was held at the highway department on November 8th and was very well attended. There were several informative presentations given to the Highway Commissioners and a wonderful meal catered by the Herrick Café. Spesard discussed the MFT and needy township allotments with the Board; he explained that the number of needy townships continues to increase while the money stays the same. Spesard is currently meeting with the highway commissioners to review their motor fuel tax budgets. Discussion was held regarding Enbridge Pipeline and Spesard answered questions from the board. The letting for the closed Towbruff Bridge in Rose Township, was held on November 8th and awarded to Depew and Owen with a low bid of \$392,498. Spesard reported that the estimate for this bridge was \$444,200 and that 7 companies had submitted bids for this project. Construction on the Towbruff Bridge will begin in the spring of 2014. Construction on the closed bridge was also recently opened to traffic.

Shelby County Board Meeting November 13, 2013

EMA/Zoning Administrator Jared Rowcliffe highlighted the Zoning/EMA/PCOM report previously mailed to the board for their review. Rowcliffe requested approval from the Board to allow Kelly Lockhart, Executive Director of Coles County Regional Planning and Development Commission, to apply for funds on Shelby County's behalf for the Hazard Mitigation Planning Grant.

Amling made motion to approve Kelly Lockhart to apply for funds on Shelby County's behalf for the Hazard Mitigation Planning Grant. Bennett seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no).

Chairman Cannon called for committee reports. (Committee reports are attached to these minutes). Reports were given and items presented for follow-up or for public awareness are as follows:

Law Enforcement Committee Chair Kearney stated that cameras are being installed in the squad cars and several technological advancements are being made at the Sheriff's office, which include a new records managements system, a free accident reporting system for the deputies, and also a new website for the Sheriff's office. Deputy Brandon Sarver has been reassigned as the new canine officer. Deputy Dustin Lustig and his K-9 partner Sito are on the cover of the new 2013 Shelbyville phone book. The Merit Commission is currently reviewing applications for a new deputy.

Animal Control Chairman Jordan reported that the Committee is currently reviewing the Animal Control Ordinance recently drafted by States Attorney Vonderheide. The committee wants to give the Animal Control Warden the authority to issue citations and will be implementing this into the new ordinance. The Committee plans to present this new Animal Control Ordinance to the Board at the December meeting.

Airport Chairman Cannon stated that approximately 4700 hundred people attended the balloon festival in October. Cannon thanked EMA Coordinator Rowcliffe, County Tourism Director Freddie Fry and Airport Manager Scott Jefson for their hard work during the balloon fest and their help in making that event a success. Shelby Electric Cooperative has approached the Airport about doing the work for electrical upgrades to the airport if the airport will purchase the necessary equipment.

Public Buildings Committee Chair Warren updated the board that the upgrade work on the elevator has been completed and a new surge protection unit for the Courthouse has been installed. Roof repairs will hopefully be completed in the near future.

At this time, Chairman Cannon provided a few updates and correspondence to the board. A representative from Clean Line Energy will be attending the December meeting to inform the Board about the Transmission Line they would like to construct through the southern portion of Shelby County. Cannon read a thank you note from Saving Orphaned Animals for the Memorial given in memory of Tom Bridges, a former Courthouse Security Guard who recently passed away.

County Clerk Fox thanked the board members and employees for their generous food and monetary donations to the CEFS food bank.

Chairman Cannon requested the following appointments:

John W. Frederick, trustee Stewardson Fire Protection District Aaron Huffmaster, commissioner, Drainage District #1, Towns of Prairie and Big Spring

Mulholland made motion to approve the Chairman's appointments. Hunter seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no).

There was no public body comment and no further business to come before the Shelby County board.

Clark made motion to assess mileage and per diem for the November meetings, to pay the bills/payroll as approved by the committees and adjourn until organizational meeting to be held on December 11, 2013. Jordan seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no) and the meeting was adjourned at 10:10 A.M.

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RESOLUTION 2013-53

WHEREAS, the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor was created to provide services to State's Attorneys in Counties containing less than 3,000,000 inhabitants; and

WHEREAS, the powers and duties of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor are defined and enumerated in the "State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor's Act", 725 ILCS 210/1 et seq., as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois General Assembly appropriates monies for the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor, one-third from the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor's County Fund and two-thirds from the General Revenue Fund, provided that such funding receives approval and support from the respective Counties eligible to apply; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor shall administer the operation of the appellate offices so as to insure that all participating State's Attorneys continue to have final authority in preparation, filing, and arguing of all appellate briefs and any trial assistance; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor and the Illinois General Assembly have reviewed and approved a budget for Fiscal Year 2014, which funds will provide for the continued operation of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Shelby County Board, in regular session, this day of Nov., 2013 does hereby support the continued operation of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor, and designates the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor as its Agent to administer the operation of the appellate offices and process said appellate court cases for this County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the attorneys employed by the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor are hereby authorized to act as Assistant State's Attorneys on behalf of the State's Attorney of this County in the appeal of all cases, when requested to do so by the State's Attorney, and with the advice and consent of the State's Attorney prepare, file, and argue appellate briefs for those cases; and also, as may be requested by the State's Attorney, to assist in the prosecution of cases under the Illinois Controlled Substances Act, the Cannabis Control Act, the Drug Asset Forfeiture Procedure Act and the Narcotics Profit Forfeiture Act. Such attorneys are further authorized to assist the State's Attorney in the State's Attorney's duties under the Illinois Public Labor Relations Act, including negotiations thereunder, as well as in the trial and appeal of tax objections.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor will offer Continuing Legal Education training programs to the State's Attorneys and Assistant State's Attorneys.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the attorneys employed by the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor may also assist the State's Attorney of this County in the discharge of the State's Attorney's duties in the prosecution and trial of other cases, and may act as Special Prosecutor if duly appointed to do so by a court having jurisdiction.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Shelby County Board hereby agrees to participate in the service program of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor for Fiscal Year 2014, commencing December 1, 2013, and ending November 30, 2014, by hereby appropriating the sum of \$7,000.00 as consideration for the express purpose of providing a portion of the funds required for financing the operation of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor, and agrees to deliver the same to the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor on request during the Fiscal Year 2014.

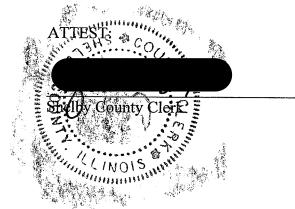

WHEREAS, the Honorable S. Gene Schwarm, Chief Judge of the Fourth Judicial Circuit, in concurrence with the Shelby County Board, has established reasonable fees for the costs of maintenance, testing and other incidental expenses related to the mandatory drug and alcohol testing and electronic monitoring involved in a successful probation program for Shelby County.

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that the fee for drug and alcohol testing shall not exceed \$12.00 for each field test performed by the Probation Department and the fee for drug and alcohol testing shall not exceed \$80.00 for each laboratory test;

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED, that the fee for Electronic Monitoring shall not exceed \$20.00 per day.

The CIPT program is in need of vehicles throughout the six county service area. C.E.F.S. Economic Opportunity Corporation ~ Central Illinois Public Transit are not able to do some service contracts due to lack of vehicles. Additional rolling stock enhances the programs ability to meet the needs of passengers and better coordinate with other agencies.

ITS: Mentor Units

The ITS software will allow the program to have the needed mentor units for the new vehicles when they are delivered. The additional units will increase efficiency within the fleet. This will also allow a spare if one of the units needs to be replaced.

Transit Facility Improvements

The facility enhancement of transit office located at 1505 W.S. 1st Street, Shelbyville will include vehicle lift completion, parking lot, and maintenance bay. The enhancement of the current transit facility will allow the program to complete some minor in house maintenance. This would be a cost effective and efficient way to keep maintenance current. The enhanced facility will allow job creation that is needed within the community.

Equipment

The digital radios will be a more cost effective way for backup communication between dispatch and the drivers. The security cameras will be an aid to the central staff when an issue arises on the vehicle, from an accident, and will be used as a training tool. The maintenance hand tools will be needed for the mechanics to perform their job duties. The color printers will aid in the increased marketing effort the program is working on.

Vehicle Acquistion: Rolling Stock

Additional rolling stock enhances the programs ability to meet the needs of passengers and better coordinate with other public transit providers. Additional vehicles will assist us in better coordination efforts with other providers and agencies such as TRIP. With additional rolling stock, the program will be able to better coordinate longer medical trips with other providers and agencies. Additional rolling stock will assist in additional trips within the service area.

ITS: Mentor Units

Additional Ranger/Mentor units will be installed in new vehicles that have been purchased or awarded to the program. The program does not have any spare units available. Additional units will allow the new vehicles coming into the program the ability to have another form of communication between the vehicle and dispatch. The Mentor/Ranger units will allow the program to cut down on response time between the driver and dispatch.

Transit Facility Improvements

The facility enhancement of transit office located at 1505 W.S. 1st Street, Shelbyville will include vehicle lift completion, parking lot, and maintenance bay. The enhancement of the current transit facility will cut down on the amount of time and miles by not sending all of the vehicles out to another vendor for maintenance. This would be a cost effective and efficient way to keep maintenance current. The facility will also allow the program to grow and expand.

Equipment

Security cameras will enhance the programs security, and safety, or passengers, personnel, equipment and facilities. The cameras will allow the program the ability to investigate any allegations that may arise by either a passenger or a driver. Cameras will reduce the fear of crime, assist in police investigations, monitor medical assistance rendered, and allow the program to monitor overall driver performance.

Maintenance equipment will assist the program in enhancement of the fixed facility project. This will allow mechanics to have the basic tools and storage needed along with the basic diagnostic equipment. All equipment will be purchased as a package.

Color printers will assist the program in the ability to better market the program to passengers and agencies/businesses. Printers will assist in the marketing of brochures, flyers, calendars, newsletters, etc. Program information that is created will be distributed to other agencies such as TRIP and the Rural Medical Transportation Network to allow better coordination between providers/agencies.

Digital radios will assist the program in communication between the drivers and dispatch. The current form of communication is push to talk cell phones that are costly to the program. The program has moved to a one call center located in Effingham, IL. Digital radios will allow for a more cost effective way for drivers to communicate.

C. Use of "Innovative/Green" Technology

Please describe by project the use of innovative or green technology to be incorporated into the project.

Rolling stock vehicles are equiped with overdrive which lowers engine RPM for better fuel economy. These vehicles also have the ability to use E85 fuel. E85 fuel is a has a lower useage of fossil fuel. (Green Technology)

Facility enhancement will allow vehicle emmissions to be reduced due to housed vehicles not requiring lengthly idle time for defrosting, heating, and cooling. (Green Technology)

Digital radios are an updated version of the analog radios that we just replaced with push to talk phones. Analog radios were replaced due to the frequency being deleted. Digital radios represent innovative teachnology that has changed the way drivers understand and use 2 way communication devices. (Innovative Technology)

Security cameras are modern wireless cameras that allow installation anywhere on the vehicle without dedicated cable connections. Placement anywhere in the vehicle allows the added benefit of increased security throughout the vehicle. (Innovative Technology)

Hand tools will be used to keep vehicles in efficient running condition. Service tools are designed to keep hazardous fluid spillage at a minimum and to recover, reclaim, and recycle used fluids and vapors as applicable. Power tools are of energy efficient designs. (Innovative Technology)

New printers will allow the program to upgrade older printers that are using an asorbent amount of ink that is costly to the program. The addition of new printers will allow flyers, brochures, newsletters, etc. to be printed with vibrant color to catch the readers attention and better assist in the marketing effort for public transportation in the programs service area. (Innovative Technology)

STATE OF ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AGREEMENT

for Local Agency Railway-Highway Grade Crossing Improvements

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into by and between the STATE OF ILLINOIS, acting by and through its Department of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as the "STATE", and Shelby County, acting by and through its County Board, hereinafter referred to as the "LA", and the UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY, hereinafter referred to as "COMPANY."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, in the interest of public safety the STATE proposes to improve crossing warning signal devices at the location listed on Exhibit A, as shown on the attached location map; and

WHEREAS, the parties mutually agree to accomplish the proposed improvements through the use of Federal and/or State funds which are provided under applicable Federal or State act, law or appropriation.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants and agreements as hereinafter contained the parties hereto agree as follows:

SECTION 1. The project covered under this agreement shall be subject to all applicable Federal laws, rules, regulations, orders and approvals pertaining to all agreements, specifications, award of contracts, acceptance of work and procedure in general. The STATE, the LA, and COMPANY shall be governed by the applicable provisions of the Federal-Aid Policy Guide, Part 646, dated December 9, 1991, and any supplements or amendments thereto hereinafter referred to as the "Policy Guide".

SECTION 2. The LA and COMPANY shall prepare the general layout plans (including surveys and other engineering services), and detailed estimates of cost. These general layout plans and estimates shall be submitted to the STATE for their approval.

SECTION 3. The completed crossing warning devices shall conform to Part VIII of the 2009 Edition of the National Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD), including any amendments which may be contained in the Illinois Supplement to the MUTCD. Barrier systems, such as guardrail and impact attenuators should not be used at railroad grade crossings except in extraordinary circumstances. Approval for the erection of any roadside barrier by COMPANY must be obtained in writing in advance from the STATE.

SECTION 4. All required installation work at the grade crossing(s) shall be performed by the LA and by COMPANY with their own forces or in accordance with 23 CFR, part 646.216. In the event the LA or COMPANY intends to use forces other than its own under a continuing contract or contracts, the LA and COMPANY shall provide the Department with a list of the items of work to be accomplished under such contract or contracts and a list of the name of each contractor whose services will be used to perform the work. Such contracts shall be in compliance with the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and implementing regulations applicable to Federal-Aid Projects as well as the Illinois Fair Employment Practices Act and implementing rules and regulations.

SECTION 5. The LA and COMPANY will not begin to work without written authorization from the STATE to proceed. COMPANY shall file a form 1 or form 3 Petition of Illinois

Administrative Code 1535 with the Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC) showing details of the automatic warning devices herein required, and shall receive approval thereof by X-Resolution before commencing with the installation. Upon receipt of authorization from the STATE and the ICC, COMPANY shall promptly begin the work set forth in the agreement and shall notify the LA in writing at the address listed on EXHIBIT A before commencing work.

SECTION 6. The LA and COMPANY, for performance of their work as herein specified, may bill the STATE monthly (in sets of two) for the STATE'S 100% share of the cost of materials purchased, delivered and stored on the LA's and COMPANY's property but not yet installed. The materials will become the property of the STATE and must be designated for exclusive use on the project designated on EXHIBIT A.

In the event of any loss of material after payment, the LA and COMPANY will replace the material at no cost to the STATE. The storage area of such materials shall be available for STATE inspection upon 24-hour notice. The bill shall be accompanied by a voucher from the material supplier indicating payment by the LA and COMPANY. Payment under this paragraph shall not be claimed for any bill totaling less than \$500.

In the event the LA and COMPANY fails to install the stored material within one year of the fully executed agreement date, the State may provide a written notice to the LA and COMPANY, requiring the LA and COMPANY to promptly deliver the stored material to a location indicated in writing by the State. Upon delivery, the STATE shall then take possession of said material for the STATE'S own use. The delivery of the material to the STATE shall in no way serve to terminate this agreement or affect the other provisions of this agreement and in addition shall not affect the LA's and COMPANY's right to claim payment for stockpiled material to replace that taken by the STATE.

SECTION 7. The LA and COMPANY, for performance of its work as herein specified, may bill the STATE monthly (in sets of two) for the STATE'S 100% share of its expense as incurred. These progressive invoices may be rendered on the basis of the estimated percentage of the work completed, plus allowable FHWA approved additives. Reimbursement of labor additives will be limited to only the most current direct labor additives, small tools additives, equipment additive rate, if so developed, and public liability/property damage liability insurance rates as audited and approved by a cognizant State agency and the FHWA. Indirect overhead or general and administrative expenses, or those expenses which may be classified as such under generally accepted accounting principles are not eligible for reimbursement on this project.

The STATE after verifying that the bills are reasonable and proper shall promptly reimburse the LA and COMPANY for 100% of the amount billed. Payment under this paragraph shall not be claimed for any bill totaling less than \$500. Upon completion of the project, the LA and COMPANY shall provide the STATE with a written notification of the date of completion. The LA and COMPANY, upon completion of their work, shall each submit a complete and detailed final bill of all incurred costs to the STATE no later than one year from the date of completion of the project. Otherwise, previous payments to the LA and COMPANY may be considered final, except as agreed to by the STATE and the LA and COMPANY. After the STATE has checked the final statements and agreed with the LA and COMPANY that the costs are reasonable and proper, insofar as they are able to ascertain, the STATE shall then reimburse the LA and COMPANY an amount, less previous payments, if any, equal to 100% of the amount billed. After the STATE has audited the expenses as incurred by the LA and COMPANY and final inspection of the installation has been made, the STATE shall reimburse the LA or COMPANY for any amount still owed to the LA or COMPANY or bill the LA or COMPANY for any overpayments or items of 'expense found as not being eligible for reimbursement.

The LA and COMPANY shall maintain, for a minimum of 3 years after the date of the final bill, adequate books, records, and supporting documents to verify the amounts, recipients, and uses of all disbursements of funds passing in conjunction with the contract; the contract and all books, records, and supporting documents related to the contract, which may be stored on electronic files, shall be available for review and may be audited by the STATE. The LA and COMPANY agree to cooperate fully with any audit conducted by the STATE and to provide full access to all relevant materials. Failure to maintain the books, records, and supporting documents required by this section shall establish a presumption in favor of the STATE for the recovery of any funds paid by the STATE under the contract for which adequate books, records, and supporting documentation are not available to support their purported disbursement.

SECTION 8. The crossing warning signal system should be placed in service immediately after the installation is completed. The LA and COMPANY shall notify the STATE in writing of the date of the completed installation. The STATE will perform a final inspection upon receiving the written notification.

SECTION 9. When construction of this project is completed, and so long as State law shall so require, the COMPANY shall maintain at its expense, or by agreement with others, provide for the maintenance of the crossing warning signal devices.

SECTION 10. In compliance with the Federal-Aid Policy Guide, dated December 9, 1991, Section 646.210, the railroad work as herein contemplated requires no contribution from the COMPANY or the LA.

SECTION 11. In the event that delays or difficulties arise in securing necessary federal or state approvals, or in acquiring rights-of way, or in settling damage claims, or for any other cause which in the opinion of the STATE render it impracticable to proceed with the construction of the project, then at any time before construction is started, the STATE may serve formal notice of cancellation upon the LA and COMPANY and this agreement shall thereupon terminate. In the event of cancellation, the STATE shall reimburse the LA or COMPANY for all eligible cost and expense incurred by the LA and COMPANY prior to receipt of notice of cancellation and payment by the STATE.

SECTION 12. The LA and COMPANY, their subrecipients or subcontractors shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of this Agreement. The LA and COMPANY shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 CFR part 26 in the award and administration of STATE-assisted contracts. Failure by the LA or COMPANY to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this Agreement, which may result in the termination of this contract or such other remedy as deemed appropriate.

In the event any work at the crossing is performed by other than the LA forces or COMPANY forces, the provisions of "an act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works" (Illinois Compiled Statutes, 820 ILCS 130/1 et seq.) shall apply.

SECTION 13. This agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto, their successors or assigns.

SECTION 14. The LA and COMPANY shall complete all work or shall be responsible that all work is completed by other forces within one year of the date of the fully executed agreement. In the event that all work cannot be completed within one year, the LA and COMPANY shall notify the STATE in writing the cause for the delay before the one-year deadline has expired. Otherwise, the STATE will consider petitioning the Illinois Commerce Commission to order the work to be completed.

SECTION 15. At the time this Agreement was executed, there were funds available for the project; however, obligations assumed by the STATE under this Agreement shall cease immediately, without penalty or payment beyond that which the LA and COMPANY have already accumulated, should the Illinois General Assembly or the Federal Highway Administration fail to appropriate or otherwise make available funds for the project.

SECTION 16. The LA and COMPANY are hereby requested by the STATE, to perform preliminary engineering for the project, and authorized to accrue project reimbursable preliminary engineering costs beginning on January 14, 2013. The LA and COMPANY hereby agree to not invoice the STATE until such time this agreement is fully executed.

SECTION 17. Upon award of the roadway construction contract and request from the LA for payment, STATE shall pay 95% of the awarded contract amount to LA.

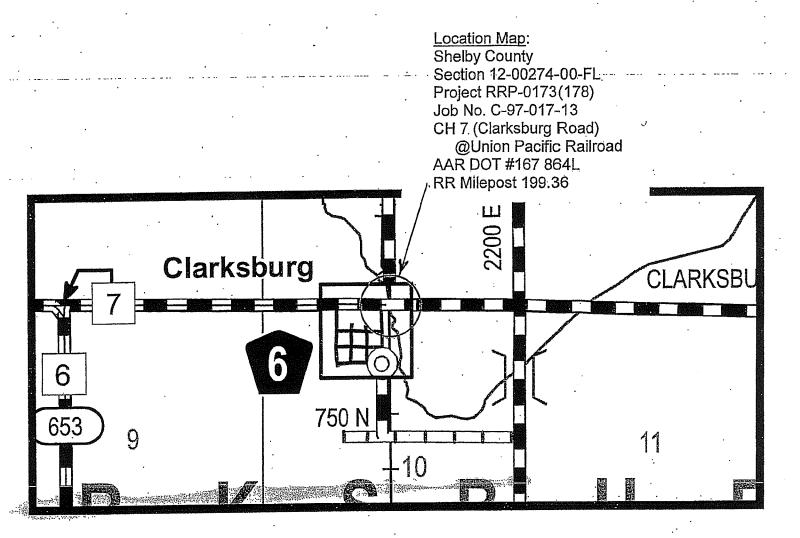

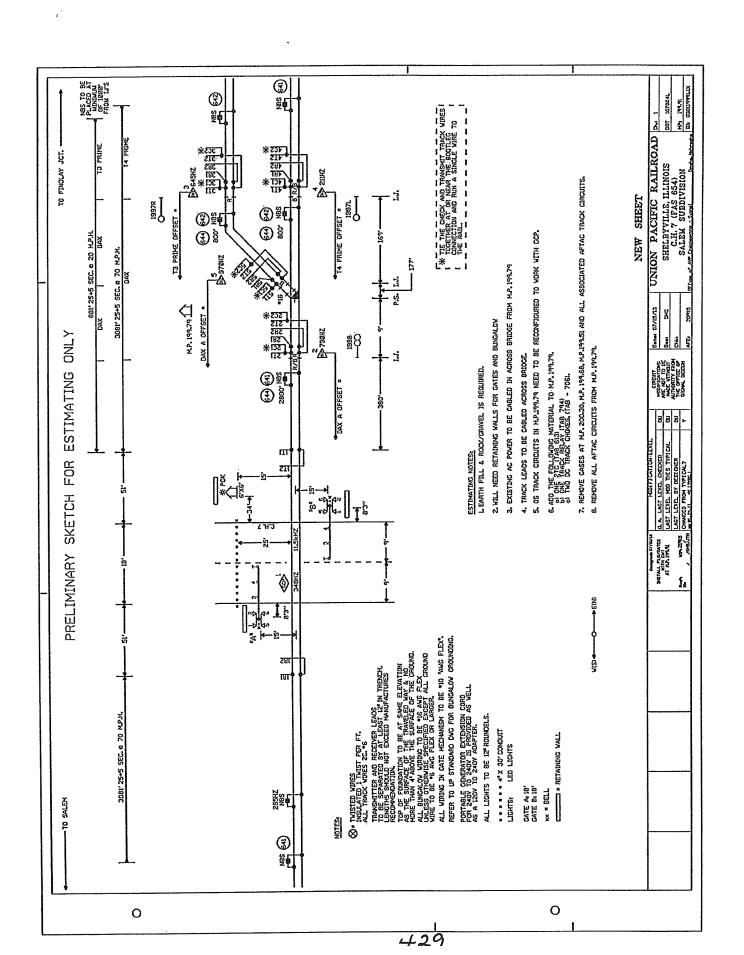

Jim Looft calls the meeting to order.

The minutes were read by all. Jim makes a motion to approve the minutes.

It was seconded by Steve and it was approved by all saying aye.

The Treasurer's report was read.

Jim makes a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. Steve seconded and it was approved by all saying aye.

Jim Schwerman is present at the meeting. He mentions receiving an insurance check for just over \$4000 on the wheat harvest, because of the actual price being so much lower than the guaranteed price.

Jim also gives an update on the other crops and that because of the lack of rain, haven't done very good. Jim presents a bid from Gene Davis to do some surface drainage on the farm. Jim went on to explain where and what needed to be done. Some discussion followed on the issue and Scott mention talking to the County Highway Dept. and that they were willing to come over and haul the concrete away and possible dirt, but the Gene would probably spread it out. Scott ask Jim what he recommended we do around the new wind cone to keep from damaging it with farm machinery. It was decided to put about a ten foot spread of chip rock around it. There was also a discussion on the water at the east end and where the treated water is coming from. It was decided to accept the bid for \$14,882.00 and have the work done.

Scott also mentioned talking to the county about what it would take to have the county come over with the hihoe and start clearing some of the trees in the fence rows that have got to come out. Some discussion followed on what could be done with it, as far as burning or burying it.

Jim also mention what he planned on planting next year and where. Corn was the main thing and where we're allowed to plant it.

A water hydrant was requested by the ag pilots at the east end and some discussion followed on the idea.

Managers Report

Had to rebuild the diesel fuel injectors on the tractor and that the mowing has slowed down somewhat. We have the TIPS meeting coming up. Will wait for winter on some of tree removal in fence row because of poison ivy/oak. The RC guys cancelled out and never herd anything else from them. One of the guys from the American Waco group was here again and it's looking pretty positive. They would like a little package put together that he could present to the group as far as eating places, motels, and different things to do or see around the area.

Also talk to Pritchard about some new lighting in the back hangar and it would be about \$1500. The batwing mower needs a lot of maintenance done to it over the winter to be ready for next year. Also making a list of things to take to the TIPS meeting on October 10th.

Also need to check on approach being 4 degrees instead of 3 degrees and get passed the tree issues. Also would like to find out who making decisions for our airport as far as runway lengths, approach angles and such, our consultants?

Went to FAA and checked our grass runway length at 2100 ft. or so and IDOT says it's 1400. IDOT does not have the authority to change a runway length. Also discussed the load rating of 18-36. Also mentioned he and Steve going to Decatur on the 21st to fly for the Young Eagles event. Still having an issue with the fuel pump kicking out a breaker and need to look into it.

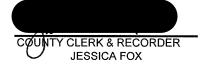

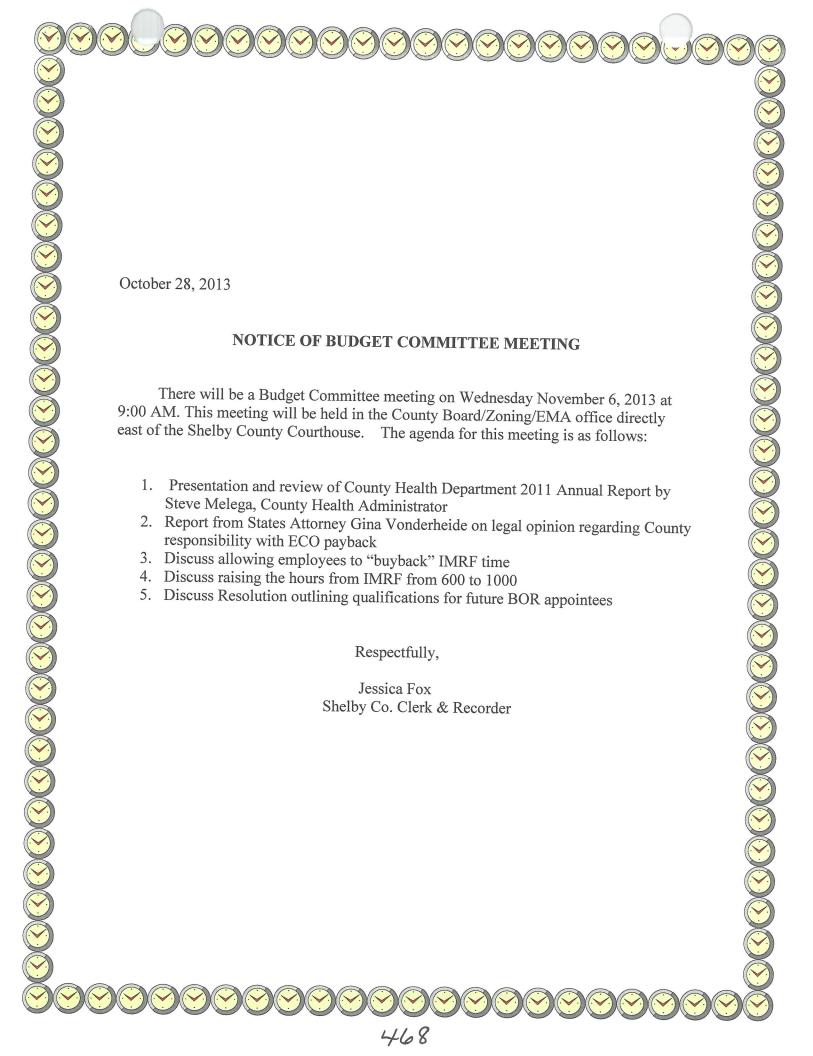

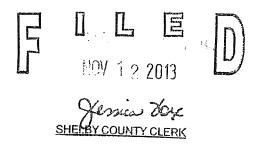
