SHELBY COUNTY BOARD MEETING

October 9, 2013 - 9:00 A.M.

The Shelby County Board met on Wednesday, October 9, 2013, at 9:00 A.M. at the Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman Bruce Cannon called the meeting to order. Pastor Mark Sanders, of the Shelby Christian Church gave the prayer and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

County Clerk Jessica Fox called the roll. Durbin was absent.

Minutes for the September 11, 2013 board meeting were presented for approval. Mulholland made motion to approve the minutes as presented. Wetherell seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Chairman Cannon presented the FY 2013-2014 County Levies Resolutions for approval. (Original County Levies Resolutions are attached to these minutes).

Amling made motion to approve the Fiscal Year (FY) 2013-2014 County Levies Resolutions. Clark seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (20 yes, 0 no).

At this time Chairman Cannon called for the Highway Engineer's report.

Alan Spesard, County Highway Engineer, presented a Petition to replace a box culvert which has deteriorated from the Cold Spring and Herrick Highway Commissioners. This box culvert sits on the line between the two townships and is located 3 miles Northeast of Herrick. The costs to replace this box culvert are estimated at \$4000.00, to be shared 50% county and 25% from each township. Bennett made motion to approve the petition to replace this box culvert. Barr seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no) (Petition attached to these minutes).

Providing some department updates, Spesard reported that a closed bridge in Rose Township had been replaced with pipe and has been reopened, the other closed bridge in Rose Township, a County Highway bridge remains closed but has a letting date set for November 8, 2013. The Oklahoma Bridge in Cold Spring Township has been reopened and should have the final IDOT inspection within the next week; however the Neoga Road Bridge will probably not be open for three to four more weeks. The semi-annual Highway Commissioner's Educational Conference will be held November 8 at the Highway Department.

Spesard also announced that he recently received verbal confirmation that Shelby County has been approved by IEMA to receive funding to replace the Lakewood Bridge damaged during flooding last spring. IEMA will administer the FEMA funds, which will be reimbursed at 75% for the costs to replace the bridge. A check for \$1900.00 for debris removal following the spring flooding around Lakewood has also been received from FEMA. Spesard has also been approved to receive extra funding to replace and improve 2 Railroad Crossing Approaches in Okaw Township; the design is funded at \$238,000.00. Okaw Township has agreed to pay \$5000.00, but there will be no cost to the County. Design for this project will be done in-house and those costs will be reimbursed, as will the construction oversight.

As part of the PCOM report, Chairman Cannon took this opportunity to introduce to the County Board, the new CEFS/CIPT Transportation Director Dennis Shiley. Shiley discussed the ridership goals, marketing plans, and also answered questions from the board. Cannon also reported that he and PCOM Rowcliffe had recently attended PCOM training in Effingham.

Zoning Administrator/EMA/PCOM Jared Rowcliffe highlighted the EMA/Zoning report previously mailed to the board for their review. Rowcliffe announced plans to partner with TRIAD next week during their annual Vehicle Safety Inspection Day and provide weather radio programming. (See report attached to these minutes)

Chairman Cannon called for committee reports. (Committee reports are attached to the minutes). Reports were given and items presented for follow-up or for public awareness are as follows:

Animal Control Committee Chair Jordan – The committee will be meeting October 10, 2013 to discuss changes to the current Animal Control Ordinance. States Attorney Vonderheide and Chairman Cannon will also be in attendance at this meeting.

Airport Committee Chair Cannon – Due to the Federal Government shut down and the closure of US Army Corps of Engineer property, this weekend's hot air balloon Glow festival will be held at the Shelby County Airport. There will be festivities held at the Airport beginning Friday night through Sunday, many activities are planned and large crowds are expected. The Airport will be "closed" to air traffic, other than emergencies during this Glow festival. Freddie Fry from the County Tourism office was present to update the board regarding the Glow hot air balloon festival. Since the balloon fest was an activity that the Corp generally handled, the Tourism office has been trying to get everything necessary for the balloon fest switched over from the Corp to the Airport, in a short amount of time. Discussion was held regarding overflow parking, shuttle buses, and safety issues regarding the large crowds and pedestrian traffic on the highway. EMA Rowcliffe has been helping coordinate overflow parking and shuttle bus services. Local Law Enforcement Officials will also be on hand to help with the festival. Fry stated anyone wishing to volunteer to help in any way this weekend should contact her, as any and all help will be greatly appreciated.

Shelby County Board Meeting October 9, 2013

Public Buildings Chair Warren – Kone elevator is at the Courthouse getting the elevator up to the 2015 standards, and the work should be completed today. Costs are estimated to be 8,800.00, and this amount has already been budgeted.

Insurance Committee Chair Bennett – The committee met this morning with Randy Biehler from Shelbyville Insurance Services to discuss changes to the health insurance. Any part-time employee working 30 or more hours a week will be considered fulltime and be eligible for County Health Insurance. A 4% increase is expected in health insurance costs beginning January 1, 2014. Due to the union contract the County will need to bear the costs of this increase. As of September 1, 2014 the County will be required to participate in the Affordable Care Act.

Chairman Cannon requested the following appointment:

Jolene Beyers, commissioner, Drainage District #1 Town of Oconee

Hayden made motion to approve the Chairman's appointment. Cruitt seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Under Chairman Updates, Cannon reported to the Board that he had recently met with a representative from Clean Line Energy, a private company interested in running Transmission Lines through southern Shelby County. Clean Line is willing to pay \$7,000.00 per linear mile of transmission line to the County for the next 20 years. Cannon informed the Clean Line Energy representative, that the Board would take a neutral position on this issue and follow Farm Bureau. It is expected that representatives from both Clean Line Energy and the Shelby County Farm Bureau will attend a County Board meeting in the future to discuss this matter.

Under public body comment County Health Administrator Melega updated the Board on the new Illinois Private Sewage Disposal Licensing Act and Codes which became effective retroactive to August 28, 2013. This sets the precedence for the USEPA to issue NPDES permits for private sewage disposal systems. Also, the USEPA is proposing legislation to change the definition of Waters of United States to include roadside ditches and tributaries which flow less than 3 months out of the year. Melega recommends that everyone call their US Senator and Congressmen to oppose this legislation.

There was no further business to come before the Shelby County Board.

Clark made motion to assess mileage and per diem for the October meetings, to pay the bills/payroll as approved by the committees and adjourn until the next regular meeting to be held on November 13, 2013. Warren seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no) and the meeting was adjourned at 10:01 A.M.



Reasons property assessments may increase

Some common reasons property assessments may increase are identified below.

- The property values in the area are increasing.
- Improvements were made to the property (e.g., an addition to your home; extensive remodeling; a new deck, porch, or patio; a new in-ground swimming pool).
- The property was under-assessed in relation to other properties and this error has been corrected.
- The property had a homestead exemption that has been removed.

Step 2 Review

After the assessment process is completed, the chief county assessment officer forwards all books, papers, and information that the county board of review requests so that it can complete its duties. In counties other than Cook, the chief county assessment officer completes assessments and delivers the assessment books to the county board of review by the third Monday in June. In Cook County, the county assessor delivers the books to the board of review in the township order in which they are completed.

Board of review composition

Illinois law mandates board of review composition. In most township counties, the county board appoints three people to the board of review. In a few township counties, board of review members are elected. In commission counties, the county commissioners are also the board of review members (unless they appoint the board of review).

In counties with 100,000 or more population that appoint a board of review, applicants must pass an examination given by the Illinois Department of Revenue before taking office. Other counties may impose this requirement by county board resolution. The county board of a county that elects board of review members (other than Cook or St. Clair counties) may require such an examination of any candidate for the board of review.

Chief county assessment officers are clerks of the boards of review (other than in Cook County) and can answer taxpayers' questions when the board is not in session. The board of review office is usually located in the county courthouse.

Board of review powers and duties

Boards of review have the following powers and duties:

- Assess property that was omitted from assessment books
- Approve all homestead exemptions; review non-homestead exemption applications and forward recommendations to the Illinois Department of Revenue
- In all counties but Cook County, ensure assessments are equitable within counties by applying a blanket increase or decrease on areas within the county, on classes of property, or on townships requiring an adjustment (based on studies of the ratio of assessments to sales prices)
- Hear valuation complaints and adjust assessments on their own initiative after the property owner is notified and given an opportunity to respond





Shelby County's Tobacco Control Program

Illinois Tobacco Free Communities

The health department is a recipient of a Tobacco Control grant. Shelby County residents continue to have lung cancer mortality rates significantly higher than in Illinois. In 2005, Shelby County had a crude rate of 71.9% compared to a state crude rate of 51.7% and in 2004 it was 62.5% compared to Illinois's 53.4%. Since the year 2000, Shelby County residents have continued to have crude rates significantly higher than the state averages for lung cancer. Shelby County has also maintained a higher percentage than the state average of pregnant mothers whom continue to smoke during their pregnancy.



Shelby County's Diabete's Control Program: A partnership with Shelby Memorial Hospital enticed the department to seek a grant to support the activities of a Diabetes Control Program within Shelby County. Diabetes has been consecutively from 1994-1997 ranked in the top ten leading causes of death in Shelby County and in Illinois. Diabetes is one of the top five leading contributors to hospitalizations in Shelby County. The grant has supported the hospital's efforts in establishing a self-management program and a co-sponsored support group. The support group meets every other month and is held at Shelby Memorial Hospital. A total of 90 attendees met over the eighteen group meetings.

FAMILY CASE MANAGEMENT / PRENATAL CLASSES

The Family Case Management Program serves pregnant women and/or families with infants up to age one and high risk children up to age five who are on Medicaid or have low incomes. The program's purpose is to insure that pregnant women, infants and high risk children receive necessary health care services to prevent unhealthy births and avoidable high health care cost. Registered nurses assess the

client's needs and make referrals as necessary. The program is a coordinated effort of the public health and WIC nurses. For pregnant mothers the department offers free prenatal classes. Six free prenatal class sessions were held at the department. Classes consist of prenatal care, labor and delivery, relaxation and breathing techniques. The classes are taught by registered nurses.

The supplemental food program offers only specific foods rich in iron, calcium and vitamins A and C. The objective is to prevent health problems associated with inadequate dietary intake among women, infants and children. WIC vouchers list the amounts of infant formula, milk, eggs, cheese, fruit juice, cereal, legumes, or peanut butter a client receives monthly. No money exchanges hands between client and vendor. WIC is not welfare. All working families are

eligible if they fall within certain income guidelines. An evening clinic is available for working families. The WIC Program provides health assessment, nutrition education and health care referrals to each client. WIC serves pregnant, breastfeeding, postpartum women, infants and children up to five years of age to help prevent health and nutritional problems during the most critical time of growth and development.

Well Child Clinic

Physician: Dr. Virginia Dauz

Clinics are held in cooperation with Virginia Dauz, M.D., Pediatrician and Medical Advisor for the Shelby County Health Department. Infants and children up to the age of five are given a complete physical examination, developmental screening and needed

immunizations. Fees are based on a sliding fee scale or billed to Medicaid. Clinic totals were two examinations for infants and children.

Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program

Lead screening is provided in cooperation with Shelby Memorial Hospital and the Illinois Department of Public Health. Lead screening is performed on infants and children age 6 months to 6 years of age. Follow up is performed on all children whose blood lead level is 10ug/dl (micrograms per deciliter) or greater.

Public Health Nurses work together with the state's Environmental Health staff in this program.






