SHELBY COUNTY BOARD MEETING

February 11, 2015 - 9:00 A.M.

The Shelby County Board met on Wednesday, February 11, 2015 at 9:00 A.M. at the Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman Cruitt called the meeting to order, Board member Robert Hunter gave the prayer and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

County Clerk Jessica Fox called the roll.

Minutes for the January 14, 2015 board meeting were presented for approval. Mulholland made motion to approve the minutes as presented. Hunter seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

State's Attorney Gina Vonderheide addressed the Board requesting approval for an Ordinance setting reimbursement for the costs of medical and hospital services provided to inmates in the custody of the Shelby County Sheriff's office. Vonderheide stated this Ordinance will help protect the County in the future.

Wetherell made motion to approve the Ordinance setting reimbursement for Inmate medical. Kearney seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no) (Copy of Ordinance attached to these mirrutes).

County Farm Committee Chairman Robert Jordan presented the County Farm Lease for the next year, which begins March 1, 2015. The Farm Committee met recently to review the lease with tenant Jim Hampton. Jordan stated with increases in expenses and the decrease in grain prices, the Committee recommends extending the lease for another year under the current price schedule of \$175.00 per acre. (Farm lease attached to these minutes).

Wetherell made a motion to extend the farm lease for another year at the current price of \$175.00 per acre. Mulholland seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

At this time, Chairman Cruitt called for the County Highway Engineer's report.

Alan Spesard, County Highway Engineer presented the Highway Engineer's Report and requested approval from the Board for three Resolutions, two Petitions and one Agreement. Spesard first presented a Joint Agreement between the County and the State for funding for the replacement of 2 bridges in Richland Township that will be let as one contract. The estimated costs for this Bridge replacement are \$760,000.00; 80% will be federally funded, 16% will be State funded with the remaining 4% to be shared equally between the County and Richland Township.

Bennett made motion to approve the joint agreement for funding for the Richland Township bridge replacement project. Wetherell seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no). (Agreement attached to these minutes).

In conjunction with the joint funding agreement, Spesard also presented a Resolution to appropriate funds for the two Richland Township bridges that are to be replaced. This Resolution is part of a new IDOT policy, which assures the entities have funding available for their portion of the project prior to its completion.

Amling made motion to approve the Resolution to appropriate funds for the Richland Township bridge replacement. Clark seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no). (Resolution attached to these minutes).

Next, Spesard presented the annual Cold Mix Resolution for approval. The low bidder at the February 6th bid letting was Howell Paving with a low bid of \$2.43 per gallon of oil, and also included the pug mill and an operator to make the annual Cold Mix for the County and the Townships.

Cannon made motion to approve the Resolution awarding the Cold Mix contract to low bidder Howell Paving. Warren seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no). (Resolution attached to these minutes).

The final Resolution Spesard presented was to award the contract for the Clarksburg Railroad Crossing Approach. This project will be 100% funded by the ICC's Grade Crossing Protection Fund. This bid letting was held on February 6th and the low bidder out of 4 bids was Brad Agney Excavating Company with a low bid of \$34,191.00. Estimated costs for this project were \$46,238.00.

Warren made motion to approve the Resolution awarding the Clarksburg RR Crossing Approach to Brad Agney Excavating. Simpson seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no). (Resolution attached to these minutes).

Spesard presented a Petition from the Oconee Highway Commissioner requesting approval to replace a bridge located 3 miles east of Oconee. The estimated cost is \$440,000.00 and, if approved, will be an 80% federally - funded project.

Bennett made motion to approve the petition to replace the bridge in Oconee Township. Lenz seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no). (Petition attached to these minutes).

The next petition presented was from the Sigel Township Highway Commissioner requesting approval for the replacement of a bridge located 2.5 miles northwest of Sigel. Estimated costs are \$280,000.00.

Behl made motion to approve the petition from the Sigel Township Highway Commissioner to replace a bridge. Wetherell seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no). (Petition attached to these minutes).

Continuing with updates, Spesard stated the bridge in Prairie Township scheduled for replacement is on the State's March 6^{th} letting. The annual Oil letting for the County and Townships will also be held on March 6^{th} and Spesard will have more to report on both of these items at the March Board meeting. A truck hauling bid letting was held at the Highway Department on February 6^{th} . Since this truck hauling dealt with the Townships, these bids were approved by those Townships' Highway Commissioners.

Shelby County Board Meeting February 11, 2015

EMA/PCOM Jared Rowcliffe addressed the Board requesting approval for two Intergovernmental Agreements with Coles County Regional Planning and Development Commission (CCRPDC). The first Intergovernmental Agreement would allow CCRPDC to develop the Shelby County All Hazards Mitigation Plan.

Bennett made motion to approve the Intergovernmental Agreement with CCRPDC to develop the Shelby County All Hazards Mitigation Plan. Gergeni seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no). (Copy of Resolution attached to these minutes).

The second Intergovernmental Agreement would allow CCRPDC to perform all of the work required to complete the Douglas County Public Transportation Needs Assessment if funding is awarded.

Wetherell made motion to approve the Intergovernmental Agreement with CCRPDC to perform all of the work required to complete the Douglas County Public Transportation Needs Assessment if funding is awarded. Kearney seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no). (Resolution attached to these minutes).

Chairman Cruitt called for committee reports. (Committee reports are attached to these minutes). Reports were given and items presented for follow-up or for public awareness are as follows:

Law Enforcement Committee Chair Kearney reported that Shelby County will be implementing an emergency notification system through EMA and the Shelby County Sheriff's Office. Anyone interested in signing up for this service should provide their information to either EMA Coordinator Rowcliffe or the Shelby County Sheriff's Office.

Finance Committee Chair Cannon stated there will be a Budget Meeting on March 18th. After discussing issues relating to phone system upgrades and a 6 month Budget review, the Committee will enter into Closed Session to discuss Union Negotiations.

Airport Committee Chair Cannon stated that as of March, 2015 Scott Jefson will be under contract as the new Fixed Base Operator at his current rate of \$3500.00 a month.

Animal Control Chairman Jordan reported that Animal Control Warden Hudson would be attending training in Mattoon in order to carry a weapon. This class is the same type of class deputies are required to take, and although Hudson will be trained with law enforcement type weapons, these will not be the type of weapons he will be carrying in the future for this job. Discussion followed regarding liability and the situations where Hudson needs to have a weapon for certain aspects of his job. Insurance Chair Bennett stated she would check with the County's Insurance carrier to make sure the County is covered.

Continuing with Chairman Appointments Cruitt requested approval for the following:

Reappoint Betsy Stilabower to the Zoning Board of Appeals. Mulholland made motion to approve the reappointment of Stilabower to the Zoning Board of Appeals. Gergeni seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

Appoint Brenda Reynolds to the Planning Commission to replace Scott Lantz who resigned. Bennett made motion to approve the appointment of Brenda Reynolds to the Planning Commission. Williams seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

Appoint John Hall to the Shelby County Airport and Landing Fields Commission. Bennett made motion to approve the appointment of John Hall to the Shelby County Airport and Landing Fields Commission. Amling seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

Appoint Jeff Green to the Shelby County Airport and Landing Fields Commission. Barr made motion to approve the appointment of Jeff Green to the Shelby County Airport and Landing Fields Commission. Bennett seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no)

Chairman Cruitt informed the Board that George Conder had resigned from the Stewardson Fire Protection District and he had received 2 names for this appointment. Cruitt stated he would be tabling this appointment until the March Board meeting.

During the Public Body Comment Board member Bennett questioned whether the County had any say in Shelby County Community Services being issued a permit for a Medical Marijuana Growing Facility. Chairman Cruitt stated the County had no involvement since the ground this building is to be placed on is already zoned agricultural. Discussion followed.

There was no further business to come before the Shelby County Board.

Clark made motion to assess mileage and per diem for the February meetings, to pay the bills/payroll as approved by the committees and adjourn until meeting to be held on March 11, 2015. Cannon seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no) and the meeting was adjourned at 9:45 A.M.

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Shelby County Board Ordinance- 15-01-"0" Setting Reimbursement for the Cost of Medical and Hospital Services

WHEREAS, the County Jail Act, 730 ILCS 125/17, requires the County to reimburse any hospital, physician or any other agency which provides medical services to inmates of the County Jail; and

WHEREAS, By resolution or ordinance County Jail Act authorizes the County Board authority to provide for such reimbursement at the Department of Public Aid's rates for medical assistance; and

WHEREAS, these rates are normally less than the usual and customary rates charges for such services; and

WHEREAS, reimbursements at the Department of Public Aid rate will represent a significant cost savings to the County; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff of Shelby County requests that the County Board adopt this ordinance to provide reimbursements for medical services at the Department of Public Aid's rates.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY BOARD MEMEBERS OF SHELBY COUNTY, in session this __11th day of February, 2015 pursuant to the authority of the County Jail Act, 730 ILCS 125/17, that Shelby County shall reimburse private hospitals, physicians, or other medical service providers at the Department of Public Aid's rates for medical assistance for services provided to the inmates of the County Jail, with said rates to be determined by the Sheriff in consultation with the Illinois Department of Public Aid.

LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS LEASE made and entered into this 13th day of February , 2013, by and between the County of Shelby, State of Illinois, ("Landowners"), represented by Robert Jordan, Jesse Durbin and Larry Lenz, County Board members and County Farm Committee members, and Jim W. Hampton, R.R.3, Shelbyville, Illinois 62565 ("Tenant").

The Landowner rents and leases to the Tenant, for agricultural purposes only, the following described REAL ESTATE, to-wit;

The Northeast Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Four (4), and the West Half of the Northwest Quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Three (3), Township Elven North (11N), Range Three East (3E), of the Third (3rd) Principal Meridian, situated in the County of Shelby, State of Illinois, consisting of 196.3 acres of tillable ground.

LENGTH OF TENURE: The term of this lease shall begin on **MARCH 1, 2013,** and shall continue until **FEBRUARY 28, 2014.**

EXTENT OF AGREEMENT: Terms of this lease shall be binding on the heirs, executors, administrators, assigns or agents, for both Landowner and Tenant, in the same manner as upon the original parties.

RENT: The Tenant shall pay to the Landowner \$175.00 per acre, \$34,352.50, in two (2) equal payments of \$17,176.25. The first payment is due on April 2, 2013 but not later than April 30, 2013. The second payment is due on November 1, 2013, but no later than November 30, 2013. Failure to make either payment by the deadline is grounds for termination of the lease.

COSTS:

- 1. The Landowner agrees to pay up to two-thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) per year for necessary limestone; however, the Landowner shall have the right to have the aforementioned real estate tested to determine whether or not limestone is necessary.
- 2. The Tenant specifically agrees to pay for any and all types of fertilizer, herbicides, and seed. The Tenant also agrees to keep the cemetery, roadside, and waterways properly mowed.

LANDOWNER AGREES TO FURNISH AS HIS INVESTMENT AND EXPENSES:

- 1. The above described farm, including the fixed improvements thereon.
- 2. Materials the Landowner deems necessary for repairs and improvements on the above described farm.
- 3. Skilled labor employed in making permanent improvements.

TENANT AGREES TO FURNISH AS HIS INVESTMENT AND EXPENSES:

- 1. All machinery, equipment, power and labor necessary to farm the premises properly.
- 2. Labor, except skilled labor, required for repairs and improvements.

TENANT'S DUTIES IN OPERATING THE FARM:

- 1. To keep the farm neat, and to prevent any unnecessary waste, or damage to the property.
- 2. Not to allow noxious weeds to go to seed on said premises but to destroy same; to cut all weeds, sprouts and brush in fence rows and on roads adjoining as often as needed each year without charge to the Landowner for labor.
- 3. To investigate and repair any broken tile and keep outlets open; repair breaks in open ditches. Tenant shall not plow or disk through grass waterway, or other low places that will permit open ditches eroding across fields.
- 4. Not to burn corn stalks, cobs, straw or other residue grown on the farm, nor to remove any hay, cobs or straw or other residue, except by agreement.
- To clip small grain stubble and to prevent noxious weeds from going to seed.
- 6. Not to permit tramping of rotation fields by livestock in wet weather when the soil is soft, and to prevent rooting by hogs.
- 7. The Tenant agrees to follow such crop rotation, tillage practices, fertilizer programs, conservation measures, and arrangements as are worked out with the Landowner or his Agent, for the best interest of all concerned.
- 8. Not to assign this lease to any person or persons or sublet any part of the premises without the consent of the Landowner.

ADDITIONAL AGREEMENTS:

- 1. Tenant is not to erect or permit to be erected upon said premises, any structure, building, fence or sign of any kind whatsoever, except by the written consent of the Landowner, nor to purchase any materials or incur any expenses for the account of the Landowner without his approval and will not make a claim for labor at any time unless Landowner has given written permission at a previous date.
- 2. Tenant is not to add electrical wiring, plumbing or heating without written permission of the Landowner, and when same is given such is to pass inspection of both power and insurance companies. Said additions shall immediately become part of the property against which the Tenant will have no further claim unless otherwise agreed in writing.

- 3. Nothing in this lease shall confer upon the Tenant any right to minerals underlying said land or any part thereof, but the same are hereby expressly reserved by the Landowner together with the full right, liberty and land room to them, to enter upon the premises and to bore, search and excavate for same, to work and remove the same, and to deposit excavated rubbish, and with full liberty to pass over said premises with vehicles and lay down and work any such railroad track or tracks, tanks, pipe lines, powers and structures as may be necessary or convenient for the above purpose. Said Landowner, however, agrees to deduct from the annual rent, pro-rata, for the land so taken by him or his assigns for said uses when the rental of such land is cash, and to reimburse the said Tenant for any actual damage he may suffer for crops destroyed where such land is on grain rent and to release Tenant from obligation to continue farming this property when development of resources interferes materially with Tenant's ability to make a satisfactory return.
- 4. Landowner shall in no way be liable in damages for failure of water supply or for any damage by the elements or otherwise, to any of the improvements, nor for any loss or damage while improvements are under construction or repair nor for any failure to repair or alter or replace any buildings or improvement.
- 5. Tenant takes possession of the leased premises subject to the hazards of operating a farm, and assumes all risk of accidents to himself, his family, his employees, or agents in pursuance of his farming operations, or in performing repairs to the buildings, fences and other improvements.

RIGHT OF ENTRY: The landowner or his agent shall be entitled to free access to the premises at all times and may make any repairs and improvements thereon. If this lease is terminated, the Landowner or his agent shall be entitled to fall plow, fertilize or otherwise prepare the ground and plant in proper season for the flowing year's crops.

LANDOWNER'S LIEN:

The Landowner's lien provided by law shall be the security for the rent herein specified.

If the Tenant shall, from any cause, fail to comply with all his agreements herein, the Landowner may at any time when such failure occurs after giving three days written notice of his intention to do so, take active possession of said premises and buildings thereon which the Tenant agrees to surrender, and employ other persons to tend said crop and perform all the agreements of the Tenant as herein contained as fully as the same are contemplated in this agreement and after deducting all monies advanced, or monies due for the rent and the expense of attending such crop as aforesaid, to pay the residue, if any, to the Tenant.

If the Tenant shall fail to pay the cash rent and advances, or account for the share rent as herein stipulated or shall fail to keep any of the agreements of this lease, all costs and attorney's fees of the Landowner in enforcing collection or performance, shall be added to and become a part of the obligations payable by the Tenant hereunder.

YIELDING POSSESSION: The Tenant agrees that at the expiration of the term of this lease, he will yield up possession of the premises to the Landowner without further demand or notice, in as good

order and condition as when same were entered upon by the Tenant, loss by fire or tornado, and ordinary wear excepted.

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Agreement Provisions

THE LA AGREES:

- To acquire in its name, or in the name of the state if on the state highway system, all right-of-way necessary for this project in accordance with the requirements of Titles II and III of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, and established state policies and procedures. Prior to advertising for bids, the LA shall certify to the STATE that all requirements of Titles II and III of said Uniform Act have been satisfied. The disposition of encroachments, if any, will be cooperatively determined by representatives of the LA, and STATE and the FHWA, if required.
- To provide for all utility adjustments, and to regulate the use of the right-of-way of this improvement by utilities, public and private, in accordance with the current Utility Accommodation Policy for Local Agency Highway and Street Systems.
- (3) To provide for surveys and the preparation of plans for the proposed improvement and engineering supervision during construction of the proposed improvement.
- (4) To retain jurisdiction of the completed improvement unless specified otherwise by addendum (addendum should be accompanied by a location map). If the improvement location is currently under road district jurisdiction, an addendum is required.
- (5) To maintain or cause to be maintained, in a manner satisfactory to the **STATE** and **FHWA**, the completed improvement, or that portion of the completed improvement within its jurisdiction as established by addendum referred to in item 4 above.
- (6) To comply with all applicable Executive Orders and Federal Highway Acts pursuant to the Equal Employment Opportunity and Nondiscrim nation Regulations required by the U.S. Department of Transportation.
- (7) To maintair, for a minimum of 3 years after the completion of the contract, adequate books, records and supporting documents to verify the amounts, recipients and uses of all disbursements of funds passing in conjunction with the contract; the contract and all books, records and supporting documents related to the contract shall be available for review and audit by the Auditor General and the department; and the LA agrees to cooperate fully with any audit conducted by the Auditor General and the department; and to provide full access to all relevant materials. Failure to maintain the books, records and supporting documents required by this section shall establish a presumption in favor of the STATE for the recovery of any funds paid by the STATE under the contract for which adequate books, records and supporting documentation are not available to support their purported disbursement.
- (8) To provide if required, for the improvement of any railroad-highway grade crossing and rail crossing protection within the limits of the proposed improvement.
- (9) To comply with Federal requirements or possibly lose (partial or total) Federal participation as determined by the FHWA.
- (10) (State Contracts Cnly) That the method of payment designated on page one will be as follows:
 - Method A Lump Sum Payment. Upon award of the contract for this improvement, the LA will pay to the STATE within thirty (30) calendar days of billing, in lump sum, an amount equal to 80% of the LA's estimated obligation incurred under this Agreement. The LA will pay to the STATE the remainder of the LA's obligation (including any nonparticipating costs) within thirty (30) calendar days of billing in a lump sum, upon completion of the project based upon final costs.
 - Method B Monthly Payments. Upon award of the contract for this improvement, the LA will pay to the STATE, a specified amount each month for an estimated period of months, or until 80% of the LA's estimated obligation under the provisions of the Agreement has been paid, and will pay to the STATE the remainder of the LA's obligation (including any nonparticipating costs) in a lump sum, upon completion of the project based upon final costs.
 - Method C Progress Payments. Upon receipt of the contractor's first and subsequent progressive bills for this improvement, the LA will pay to the STATE within thirty (30) calendar days of reciept, an amount equal to the LA's share of the construction cost divided by the estimated total cost, multiplied by the actual payment (appropriately adjusted for nonparticipating costs) made to the contractor until the entire obligation incurred under this Agreement has been paid.

Failure to remit the payment(s) in a timely manner as required under Methods A, B, or C, shall allow the **STATE** to internally offset, reduce, or deduct the arrearage from any payment or reimbursement due or about to become due and payable from the **STATE** to **LA** on this c⁻ any other contract. The **STATE**, at its sole option, upon notice to the **LA**, may place the debt into the the Illinois Comptroller's Offset System (30 ILCS 105/10.05) or take such other and further action as my be required to recover the debt.

- (11) (Day Labor or Local Contracts) To provide or cause to be provided all of the initial funding, equipment, labor, material and services necessary to construct the complete project.
- (12) (Preliminary Engineering) In the event that right-of-way acquisition for, or actual construction of the project for which this preliminary engineering is undertaken with Federal participation is not started by the close of the tenth fiscal year following the fiscal year in which this agreement is executed, the LA will repay the STATE any Federal funds received under the terms of this Agreement.
- (13) (Right-of-Way Acquisition) In the event that the actual construction of the project on this right-of-way is not undertaken by the close of the twentieth fiscal year following the fiscal year in which this Agreement is executed, the **LA** will repay the **STATE** any Federal Funds received under the terms of this Agreement.

(Railroad Related Work Only) The estimates and general layout plans for at-grade crossing improvements should be forwarded to the Rail Safety and Project Engineer, Room 204, Illinois Department of Transportation, 2300 South Dirksen Parkway, Springfield, Illinois, 62764. Approval of the estimates and general layout plans should be obtained prior to the commencement of railroad related work. All railroad related work is also subject to approval be the Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC). Final inspection for railroad related work should be coordinated through appropriate IDOT District Bureau of Local Roads and Streets office.

Plans and preemption times for signal related work that will be interconnected with traffic signals shall be submitted to the ICC for review and approval prior to the commencement of work. Signal related work involving interconnects with state maintained traffic signals should also be coordinated with the IDOT's District Bureau of Operations.

The LA is responsible for the payment of the railroad related expenses in accordance with the LA/railroad agreement prior to requesting reimbursement from IDOT. Requests for reimbursement should be sent to the appropriate IDOT District Bureau of Local Roads and Streets office.

Engineer's Payment Estimates in accordance with the Division of Cost on page one.

- (15) And certifies to the best of its knowledge and belief its officials:
 - (a) are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency;
 - (b) have not within a three-year period preceding this Agreement been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against them for commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain or performing a public (Federal, State or local) transaction or contract under a public transaction; violation of Federal or State antitrust statutes or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements receiving stolen property;
 - (c) are not presently indicted for or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a governmental entity (Federal, State, local) with commission of any of the offenses enumerated in item (b) of this certification; and
 - (d) have not within a three-year period preceding the Agreement had one or more public transactions (Federal, State, local) terminated for cause or default.
- (16) To include the certifications, listed in item 15 above and all other certifications required by State statutes, in every contract, including procurement of materials and leases of equipment.
- (17) (State Contracts) That execution of this agreement constitutes the LA's concurrence in the award of the construction contract to the responsible low bidder as determined by the STATE.
- (18) That for agreements exceeding \$100,000 in federal funds, execution of this Agreement constitutes the LA's certification that:
 - (a) No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress or any employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan or cooperative agreement;
 - (b) If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress or an employee of a Member of Congress, in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying", in accordance with its instructions;
 - (c) The LA shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all subawards at all ties (including subcontracts, subgrants and contracts under grants, loans and cooperative agreements) and that all subrecipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.
- (19) To regulate parking and traffic in accordance with the approved project report.
- (20) To regulate encroachments on public right-of-way in accordance with current Illinois Compiled Statutes.
- (21) To regulate the discharge of sanitary sewage into any storm water drainage system constructed with this improvement in accordance with current Illinois Compiled Statutes.
- That the LA may invoice the STATE monthly for the FHWA and/or STATE share of the costs incurred for this phase of the improvement. The LA will submit supporting documentation with each request for reimbursement from the STATE. Supporting documentation is defined as verification of payment, certified time sheets, vendor invoices, vendor receipts, and other documentation supporting the requested reimbursement amount.
- To complete this phase of the project within three years from the date this agreement is approved by the **STATE** if this portion of the project described in the Project Description does not exceed \$1,000,000 (five years if the project costs exceed \$1,000,000).
- Upon completion of this phase of the improvement, the LA will submit to the STATE a complete and detailed final invoice with all applicable supporting supporting documentation of all incurred costs, less previous payments, no later than one year from the date of completion of this phase of the improvement. If a final invoice is not received within one year of completion of this phase of the improvement, the most recent invoice may be considered the final invoice and the obligation of the funds closed.

- (25) (Single Audit Requirements) That if the LA expends \$500,000 or more a year in federal financial assistance they shall have an audit made in accordance with the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular No. A-133. LA's that expend less than \$500,000 a year shall be exempt from compliance. A copy of the audit report must be submitted to the STATE (Office of Finance and Administration, Audit Coordination Section, 2300 South Dirksen Parkway, Springfield, Illinois, 62764), within 30 days after the completion of the audit, but no later than one year after the end of the LA's fiscal year. The CFDA number for all highway planning and construction activities is 20.205.
- That the LA is required to register with the System for Award Management or SAM (formerly Central Contractor Registration (CCR)), which is a web-enabled government-wide application that collects, validates, stores, and disseminates business information about the federal government's trading partners in support of the contract award and the electronic payment processes. To register or renew, please use the following website: https://www.sam.gov/portal/public/SAM/#1.

THE STATE AGREES:

- (1) To provide such guidance, assistance and supervision and to monitor and perform audits to the extent necessary to assure validity of the LA's certification of compliance with Titles II and III requirements.
- (2) (State Contracts) To receive bids for the construction of the proposed improvement when the plans have been approved by the **STATE** (and **FHWA**, if required) and to award a contract for construction of the proposed improvement, after receipt of a satisfactory bid.
- (3) (Day Labor) To authorize the **LA** to proceed with the construction of the improvement when Agreed Unit Prices are approved and to reimburse the **LA** for that portion of the cost payable from Federal and/or State funds based on the Agreed Unit Prices and Engineer's Payment Estimates in accordance with the Division of Cost on page one.
- (4) (Local Contracts) That for agreements with Federal and/or State funds in engineering, right-of-way, utility work and/or construction work:
 - (a) To reimburse the LA for the Federal and/or State share on the basis of periodic billings, provided said billings contain sufficient cost information and show evidence of payment by the LA;
 - (b) To provide independent assurance sampling, to furnish off-site material inspection and testing at sources normally visited by STATE inspectors of steel, cement, aggregate, structural steel and other materials customarily tested by the STATE.

IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED:

- (1) Construction of the project will utilize domestic steel as required by Section 106.01 of the current edition of the Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction.
- That this Agreement and the covenants contained herein shall become null and void in the event that the **FHWA** does not approve the proposed improvement for Federal-aid participation or the contract covering the construction work contemplated herein is not awarded within three years of the date of execution of this Agreement.
- (3) This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties, their successors and assigns.
- For contracts awarded by the LA, the LA shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the award and performance of any USDOT assisted contract or in the administration of its DBE program or the requirements of 49 CFR part 26. The LA shall take all necessary and reasonable steps under 49 CFR part 26 to ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of USDOT assisted contracts. The LA's DBE program, as required by 49 CFR part 26 and as approved by USDOT, is incorporated by reference in this Agreement. Upon notification to the recipient of its failure to carry out its approved program, the department may impose sanctions as provided for under part 26 and may, in appropriate cases, refer the matter for enforcement under 18 U.S.C. 1001 and/or the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986 (31U.S.C. 3801 et seq.). In the absence of a USDOT approved LA DBE Program or on State awarded contracts, this Agreement shall be administered under the provisions of the STATE's USDOT approved Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program.
- (5) In cases where the **STATE** is reimbursing the **LA**, obligations of the **STATE** shall cease immediately without penalty or further payment being required if, in any fiscal year, the Illinois General Assembly or applicable Federal Funding source fails to appropriate or otherwise make available funds for the work contemplated herein.
- (6) All projects for the construction of fixed works which are financed in whole or in part with funds provided by this Agreement and/or amendment shall be subject to the Prevailing Wage Act (820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq.) unless the provisions of that Act exempt its application



As you may know, we have embarked on an exciting, five-year \$3.5 billion plan to build a stronger, more reliable energy delivery system to serve you and your community for years to come. We're fortifying utility poles, replacing distribution lines and gas transmission equipment, and installing automated switches and sensors throughout our 43,700 square-mile territory. Additional improvements include upgrading electric and natural gas meters. 

GRAIN BELT EXPRESS CLEAN LINE

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Grain Belt Express Clean Line is an approximately 750-mile overhead, direct current transmission line that will deliver low-cost, renewable energy from western Kansas to Illinois and surrounding states. The project will benefit Illinois by reducing wholesale electricity prices and creating hundreds of jobs in the state.

Grain Belt Express will benefit Illinois.

The Grain Belt Express is designed to benefit Illinois electricity consumers. The project will add a new source of cost-competitive renewable energy, reduce wholesale electricity prices, create hundreds of construction and manufacturing jobs, and provide revenue to local communities. A delivery station will be located in Clark County, Illinois and the project will interconnect with the electric grid in Sullivan, Indiana, which is along the Illinois-Indiana border.

The Grain Belt Express project represents an approximately \$700 million infrastructure investment in Illinois, consisting of approximately 200 miles of transmission at roughly \$2 million per mile and an approximately \$300 million delivery station.

The project will create jobs through the construction of the transmission line, through the manufacturing of the components for the transmission line, and through the construction and manufacturing of the wind turbines needed to supply the line.

Illinois needs more low-cost renewable energy.

Illinois has a growing demand for new renewable energy resources, driven by the state's renewable portfolio standard (RPS), requiring 25% renewable electricity by 2025, and by the public interest in obtaining more energy from environmentally friendly resources. The Grain Belt Express will enable the development of new wind farms that will use the project to deliver low-cost power to Illinois. A higher percentage of renewable energy in Illinois' electric mix can reduce fuel price volatility, improve air and water quality, and replace older generating capacity that is being retired due to environmental compliance requirements. In order to realize these benefits, enough cost-effective renewable energy resources must be available for Illinois electricity providers and consumers to purchase. New transmission lines like the Grain Belt Express have an essential role to play in providing access to those resources.

Clean Line is committed to compensating landowners fairly.

Clean Line seeks to voluntarily negotiate 100% of its easement agreements and believes that its landowner compensation package is a fair and good-faith offer. In exchange for a grant of an easement, Clean Line compensates landowners for both 100% fair market value of the easement area and for any structures placed in the easement area. The landowner may elect to receive either a one-time or annual payment for each structure located on the landowner's property. The annual payment for the structures will escalate by 2% each year. Less than 1% of the easement area will be occupied by the structure footprint, and the remainder of the easement area can continue to be utilized for farming, grazing cattle, and any other activities that do not interfere with the operation of the line. Clean Line will also compensate the landowner for any crop losses, marketable timber, and damages to property that may be caused by construction or maintenance activities.

Clean Line is seeking input to develop a proposed route in Illinois.

Clean Line is committed to working with landowners to site the Grain Belt Express in a way that takes into account feedback from landowners and community members. Clean Line has been working on the Grain Belt Express in Illinois since 2012 and has met with hundreds of people in the route study area. As we move through the routing process and work to develop the route for Grain Belt Express in Illinois, we will continually seek input and provide opportunities to be involved.


