

SHELBY COUNTY BOARD MEETING



December 14, 2016 - 9:00 A.M.

The Shelby County Board met on Wednesday, December 14, 2016, at 9:00 A.M. at the Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman David Cruitt called the meeting to order. Pastor Rod Hite of Destiny Fellowship Church in Moweaqua gave the prayer and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

County Clerk Jessica Fox called the roll.

Minutes for the November 9, 2016 board meeting and the December 5, 2016 Organizational meeting were presented for approval. Mulholland made a motion to approve both sets of minutes. Wetherell seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

David Johnson, of Shelby County Partners addressed the Board regarding the lack of high-speed broadband internet in all areas of Shelby County as well as other counties in Illinois. Johnson informed the board members it was important to work together in order to improve this very important and necessary commodity, in order to attract businesses as well as young people to the County. He suggested the County reduce or exempt fees for any not-for-profits who were willing to install towers to improve internet access. Board member Rob Amling suggested bringing a Resolution before the Board in January to show the County's interest and desire to expand high-speed broadband internet services in Shelby County.

County Clerk Fox presented for approval the calendars of regularly scheduled board meetings, committee meetings and County holidays for 2017.

Cannon made motion to approve the calendars of regularly scheduled board meetings, committee meetings and County holidays for 2017. Gergeni seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no). (Calendars of 2017 meetings and holidays attached to these minutes).

Chairman Cruitt presented the FY 2016-2017 Shelby County Tax Levy Resolutions for approval. (Original County Tax Levy Resolutions are attached to these minutes).

Amling made motion to approve the Tax Levy Resolutions for FY 2016-2017. Simpson seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (20 ayes, 1 no -Cannon, Cruitt not voting).

County Clerk Fox requested approval from the Board to move the polling place for precincts Windsor 1 & 2 from the current location of City Hall at 1016 Maine to the Windsor Township Community Building located at 1218 Maine due to lack of space at City Hall. Gergeni made motion to approve the polling place change for Windsor 1 & 2. Hayden seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

County Treasurer Debra Ramey addressed the board requesting approval of a resolution(s) transferring the 2012 Shelby County Trustee Delinquent parcels to those people who had purchased the parcels at a sealed bid auction. 28 parcels were sold to owners. These people will receive clear titles and these properties will go back on the tax rolls.

Amling made motion to approve the resolution(s) to transfer the 2012 trustee parcels to the new owners. Mulholland seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote(21 yes, 0 no). (Resolution master list attached to these minutes).

Zoning Administrator requested approval from the board for a resolution requesting the Circuit Court of the Fourth Judicial Circuit to grant Shelby County's motion for a voluntary dismissal of 2005-CH-43 (David Galvin/Lithia Springs Estates subdivision lawsuit). Rowcliffe stated he had discussed this with Effingham County State's Attorney Bryan Kibler, who is representing Shelby County in this lawsuit. It is hoped that this resolution will help put an end to this lawsuit which has gone on for the past 11 years.

Bennett made motion to approve the resolution requesting a voluntary dismissal of 2005-CH-43. Cannon seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no). (Resolution attached to these minutes).

As PCOM, Rowcliffe informed the Board that Kim Adair had resigned as Transportation Director for CIPT. Susan Love has recently been hired as the new Director. She hopes to be at the January meeting to introduce herself to the Board.

At this time, Chairman Cruitt called for the County Highway Engineer's report.

Alan Spesard, County Highway Engineer, requested approval for 2 petitions, 3 agreements, 2 resolutions and provided some department updates.

Spesard presented 2 petitions from the Cold Spring Township Road Commissioner. Funding for these petitions will be split equally between the township and county. The first petition presented was to replace a culvert located 3.5 miles northwest of Cowden. Estimated cost is \$1200. Woodall made motion to approve the petition for culvert replacement. Bennett seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

The next petition presented was to replace a culvert located 3 miles northeast of Herrick. Estimated cost is \$7,000. Amling made motion to approve the petition to replace the culvert. Cannon seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no). (Petitions attached to these minutes).

Spesard presented for approval 3 agreements with engineering firms for bridge construction projects that have already been approved. These agreements allow these engineering firms to begin the design process. Funding for these bridge projects are expected to be 80% State funds with the remaining 20% split between the township and county.



The first agreement was with Rhutasel & Associates for bridge design on the Richland Township bridge. Durbin made motion to approve this agreement, Wetherell seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

The next agreement was for bridge design in Windsor Township with Hampton, Lenzini and Renwick. Gergeni made motion to approve this agreement. Lenz seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

The final agreement was for bridge design in Rural Township with The Upchurch Group. Simpson made motion to approve this agreement, Cannon seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no). (Agreements attached to these minutes).

Spesard next presented a Resolution requesting approval from IDOT to use \$600,000 Motor Fuel Tax funds for maintaining county highways in 2017. Mulholland made motion to approve the Resolution for County Maintenance. Jordan seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no). (Resolution attached to these minutes).

The final Resolution presented requests 50% reimbursement of the County Engineer's salary and expenses from Federal Funds. Cannon made motion to approve the Resolution to appropriate funds for the payment of the County Engineer's salary. Kearney seconded the motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no). (Resolution attached to these minutes).

Providing some updates, Spesard reported the letting for the Henton County Highway Bridge will be held in Springfield on January 20th. The 2017 rock and culvert letting will be held on January 6. The EPA has approved the Highway Department for a tire collection for all local agencies. Spesard stated he expects to collect from 300-500 tires. Spesard plans on having the grant application for the Federal land access program submitted next week. Maximum funding available is 2 million dollars and expected cost for the project is 3.8 million. Spesard plans on presenting the Annual Highway Report at the January 11, 2017 County Board meeting.

Chairman Cruitt called for committee reports. (Committee reports are attached to these minutes).

Enhanced 9-1-1 Committee member Mulholland updated the Board on the recent activities of the newly formed Christian/Shelby 9-1-1 Board. Mulholland stated EMA Coordinator Rowcliffe and Undersheriff McCall had worked very hard on this joint venture and their efforts are greatly appreciated. Mulholland stated everything is in place for both counties to meet the 9-1-1 requirements as of 7/1/2017.

Fees and Salaries Chair Bennett stated Ambulance Committee Chair Mulholland would be looking into the stipend payments of \$25.00 per ambulance call and seeing if there weren't some ways to save the County money.

Public Buildings Chair Wetherell addressed the issue of much needed roof repairs with the Board and referred them to the proposal for Courthouse repairs done by architect Bill Utz. Wetherell and Sheriff Koonce informed the Board the building was in desperate need of repairs to the roof and also the replacement of windows. The current cost estimate for these repairs is 3.5 million dollars. Chairman Cruitt said he was currently seeking some funding options but it might be necessary for the County to take out bonds for these repairs in the future.

Under Chairman updates, Cruitt informed the board that Public Defender Amanda Ade-Harlow had been appointed Judge and would be sworn in on December 15th at 3:30 in Courtroom A. He thanked Ade-Harlow for her service the past several months and congratulated her on Judgeship. Cruitt expects a new Public Defender will be appointed after the 1st of the year.

Chairman Cruitt requested the following appointments:

Gary Robison, Planning Commission. Motion by Mulholland, second by Kearney. All voted aye by voice.

Lynn Williams, Rescue Squad. Motion by Wetherell, second by Bennett. All voted aye by voice.


Ed Anderson, Drainage Commissioner Towns of Prairie and Big Spring. Motion by Wetherell, second by Arthur. All voted are by voice.

Cruitt also called the board's attention to the email sent by Cooperative Extension Director Kathy Reiser discussing funding of the Cooperative Extension programs.

Chairman Cruitt took this time to thank both Barb Bennett and Kay Kearney for the cookies they served before the meeting and to wish all of the County Board members a Merry Christmas.





There was no public body comment and no further business to come before the Shelby County Board.

Metzger made motion to assess mileage and per diem for the December meetings, to pay the bills/payroll as approved by the committees and adjourn until the next regular meeting to be held on January 11, 2017. Williams seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes 0 no) and the meeting was adjourned at 10:09 A.M.

Shelby Partners are working on making High Speed Broadband Internet and Wi-fi Hot Spots available to Shelby County. Some people do not have access and the speeds are slow.

What is Broadband Internet? Speed information is exchanged electronically. Access is by Landline, Cable, Fiber Optics, Wireless, Satellites, and Balloons. Speed measured in MBPS (megabits per second) = 1 million bits per second There are 18 providers in Shelby County.

Why is the Internet important?

What has transpired in history give us a clue how Broadband will progress. In history waterways were used to transport goods and people, then roads, Railroads, and that is where towns were build.

In the early 1930's 90 percent of the rural home had no electric power because the Electric companies said cost too much to electrify the rural areas. **The same** is happening with high speed internet.

In 1935 President Roosevelt established the Rural Electrification Administration (REA). Shelby County formed an electric coop in 1938. Rural electric systems users spread to where 90 percent had electricity by 1953. I hope high speed Broadband would develop much faster.


Partnership for a Connected Illinois

Question: What Is a Megabit? Is It the Same as a Megabyte?

You will often hear the expression 'megabits-per-second' when talking internet

connections. But what exactly is a 'megabit'?

Answer: A megabit (Mb) is approximately 5000 words of plain text. It is often confused with its big brother, the megabyte (MB), which is 8x larger at 40,000 words of plain text.

A 'bit' is a 'binary digit', a very small package of computer data.

It takes approximately 8 bits to make one single typed character in an email. A megabit is approximately 1 million bits, which is approximately 5000 words of typed email text.

The Little 'b' vs. the Big 'B':

Yes, this is confusing. The little 'b' is for 'bit'. The capital 'B' is for 'Byte'. Hence, Mb and MB are abbreviations for the smaller vs. larger data sizes.

Example: My internet connection is 50 megabits-per-second download speed (50 Mbps)

This statement describes a connection speed of approximately (50 * 5000) words of plain text in 1 second.

Example: My smartphone gets 4 megabits-per-second on my network.

This statement describes the cellphone connection speed as being approximately (4 * 5000) words of plain text in 1 second.

The Big Brother, 'Megabyte':

A megabyte (MB) is 8 megabits combined. A megabyte is approximately 40,000 words (8 hundred pages) of plain notepad text. Megabytes are commonly used to measure hard drive space and RAM memory.



Broadband and the Site Selection Decision

Corporate site selectors expect broadband. It is not a perk or special benefit. For communities, it is a critical piece of infrastructure for attracting new capital investment. Specifically, a company is likely to require a direct fiber connection and redundancy. As with electric service, the reliability of the service is heavily scrutinized to ensure the operation will not be placed offline (especially for information-intensive projects like data centers) or that the risk of being offline is minimal. The competitiveness of the service is also important. Locations with numerous providers have an advantage because competitiveness will drive up speeds and drive down cost. Locations with inadequate connectivity are quickly passed over for projects requiring broadband. Communities lacking broadband infrastructure make the process of elimination easier for investment decision-makers and influencers. That said. merely having broadband likely places a location on a level playing field with other communities. It will be the only reason a company selects a certain location.

In addition to all other labor requirements set forth in this proposal and in the "Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction" adopted by the Illinois Department of Transportation, during the performance of this contract, Hampton, Lenzini and Renwick, Inc., its assignees and successors in interest (hereinafter referred to as the "Engineer") agrees as follows:

I. SELECTION OF LABOR

The Engineer shall comply with all Illinois statutes pertaining to the selection of labor.

II. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

During the performance of this contract, the Engineer agrees as follows:

- A. That it will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, ancestry, age, marital status, sexual preference, physical or mental handicap or unfavorable discharge from military service, and further that it will examine all job classifications to determine if minority persons or women are underutilized and will take appropriate affirmative action to rectify any such underutilization.
- B. That, if it hires additional employees in order to perform this contract or any portion hereof, it will determine the availability of minorities and women in the area(s) from which it may reasonably recruit and it will hire for each job classification for which employees are hired in such a way that minorities and women are not underutilized.
- C. That, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by it or on its behalf, it will state that all applicants will be afforded equal opportunity without discrimination because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, ancestry, age, marital status, sexual preference, physical or mental handicap or unfavorable discharge from military service.
- D. That it will send to each labor organization or representative of workers with which it has or is bound by a collective bargaining or other agreement or understanding, a notice advising such labor organization or representative of the Engineer's obligations under the Illinois Human Rights Act and the Department's Rules and Regulations. If any such labor organization or representative fails or refuses to cooperate with the Engineer in its efforts to comply with such Act and Rules and Regulations, the Engineer will promptly so notify the Illinois Department of Human Rights and the contracting agency and will recruit employees from other sources when necessary to fulfill its obligations thereunder.
- E. That it will submit reports as required by the Department of Human Rights, Rules and Regulations, furnish all relevant information as may from time to time be requested by the Department or the contracting agency, and in all respects comply with the Illinois Human Rights Act and the Department's Rules and Regulations.

EXHIBIT A

- F. That it will permit access to all relevant books, records, accounts and work sites by personnel of the contracting agency and the Illinois Department of Human Rights for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with the Illinois Human Rights Act and the Department's Rules and Regulations.
- G. That it will include verbatim or by reference the provisions of this clause in every subcontract so that such provisions will be binding upon every such subconsultant. In the same manner as with other provisions of this contract, the Engineer will be liable for compliance with applicable provisions of this clause by all its subconsultants; and further it will promptly notify the contracting agency and the Illinois Department of Human Rights in the event any subconsultant fails or refuses to comply therewith. In addition, the Engineer will not utilize any subconsultant declared by the Illinois Human Rights Commission to be ineligible for contracts or subcontracts with the State of Illinois or any of its political subdivisions or municipal corporations.

STATE OF ILLINOIS DRUG FREE WORKPLACE CERTIFICATION

This certification is required by the Drug Free Workplace Act (Ill. Rev. Stat., ch. 127, par. 152.311). The Drug Free Workplace Act, effective January 1, 1992, requires that no grantee or contractor shall receive a grant or be considered for the purposes of being awarded a contract for the procurement of any property or services from the State unless that grantee or contractor has certified to the State that the grantee or contractor will provide a drug free workplace. - 4. Notifying the contracting or granting agency within ten (10) days after receiving notice under part (2) of paragraph c of subsection 1 above from an employee or otherwise receiving actual notice of such conviction.
- 5. Imposing a sanction on, or requiring the satisfactory participation in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program by any employee who is so convicted, as required by Section 5 of the Drug Free Workplace Act.
- Assisting employees in selecting a course of action in the event drug counseling, treatment and rehabilitation is required and indicating that a trained referral team is in place.
- 7. Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug free workplace through implementation of the Drug Free Workplace Act.



- i. Assist the LA in the tabulation and interpretation of the contractors' proposals
- j. Prepare the necessary environmental documents in accordance with the procedures adopted by the DEPARTMENT's Bureau of Local Roads & Streets.
- k. Prepare the Project Development Report when required by the DEPARTMENT.
- (2) That all reports, plans, plats and special provisions to be furnished by the ENGINEER pursuant to the AGREEMENT, will be in accordance with current standard specifications and policies of the DEPARTMENT. It is being understood that all such reports, plats, plans and drafts shall, before being finally accepted, be subject to approval by the LA and the DEPARTMENT.
- (3) To attend conferences at any reasonable time when requested to do so by representatives of the LA or the Department,

That the ENGINEER warrants that he/she has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the ENGINEER, to solicit or secure this contract, and that he/she has not paid or agreed to pay any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the ENGINEER, any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gifts or any other consideration, contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this contract. For Breach or violation of this warranty the LA shall have the right to annul this contract without liability.

You are listed as the administrator for Shelby County's Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) that was capitalized by the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity's (DCEO) Community Development Assistance Program (CDAP). The DCEO's CDAP program is in turn funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program established under the Federal Housing Community Development Act of 1974.

In recent monitoring HUD has advised DCEO to review and improve its administration of the RLF program. Specifically, HUD recommended reducing the administrative workload of the program by working with communities to close inactive funds, which we define as a fund that has not issued a loan in the last three years or has issued a loan but not received any repayment. Our records indicate Shelby County's RLF is inactive and therefore DCEO would like to work with you to close Shelby County's RLF in a manner that is beneficial to the community.

The original objective for the DCEO funding Shelby County's RLF was to support economic development projects and the funds were restricted to those types of activity. Through closure of the RLF, Shelby County will be permitted to use the RLF balance for other objectives that meet CDBG Program requirements. To ensure that we meet all HUD requirements, provide important details, and answer any questions, we will hold a mandatory meeting in 2017. The date and location will be provided before the end of the year. Until the meeting the requirement for semi-annual reporting remains in force. Additionally DCEO requests that no loans be made from Shelby County's RLF.

Any questions concerning the RLF program in general or your community's RLF in particular can be emailed to CEO.CDBG@illinois.gov. We would like to catalog any general questions and make our responses available as a "frequently asked questions" to all RLF communities.

We look forward to working with you to utilize your inactive RLF funds for Shelby County's best benefit.





Please pass this note along to your fellow County Board members whose email addresses I did not have. Thank you.

**Dear County Board members:** 

I'm writing to update you on some disconcerting developments regarding the County Board Match part of the state budget that stretches the money you and other local donors provide to fund U of I Extension operations in your county. (As you may know, not one cent of matching money was provided in FY16. We significantly depleted our reserves to compensate for the shortfall on a one-time basis – but as you can appreciate, that is not a sustainable model.)

Extension Partners' legislative liaison, Pam Weber, provided this update late Friday:

Sources, specifically the Governor's Office of Management and Budget, are telling us the Governor has placed a "hold" on the County Board Match Funds from the State....approximately 10 million dollars.

Reminder - These State funds augment local funds and are spent locally and administered locally. Over 85 counties in the state passed referenda increasing their property taxes to support Extension services in their counties, while other county boards contribute generously to support ongoing programs in their counties. Those referenda votes were cast and county contributions were provided with the understanding that the State would honor their commitment with matching funds, as provided in statute (505 ILCS 45/1).

Outcome - If these funds are not released, Extension will face difficult decisions in the upcoming year. Thanks to the prudent administration of Extension, layoffs are not expected, but programming could suffer severe cuts, including 4-H and Master Gardeners. Positions may not be filled and new programming hampered. Through the last 20 years Extension has streamlined their operation, going from 102 to 27 administrative units while still providing quality services, and implementing efficiencies for continued good management practices.

I am sure the ongoing budget mess in Springfield has affected funding for many programs of concern to you, not just U of I Extension. If/as you interact with state legislators and the Governor's office in the coming days, I hope you will mention to them how important it is for the State to hold up its end of the bargain, providing the Extension County Board Match funds as outlined in the statute cited above.
