October 12, 2016 - 9:00 A.M.

The Shelby County Board met on Wednesday, October 12, 2016, at 9:00 A.M. at the Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman David Cruitt called the meeting to order. Board member Jim Arthur gave the prayer and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

County Clerk Jessica Fox called the roll. Amling, Durbin and Mulholland were absent.

Minutes for the September 14, 2016 board meeting were presented for approval. Cannon mace motion to approve the minutes as presented. Clark seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17yes, 0 no).

Upon recommendation by the Republican Central Committee, Chairman Cruitt requested the appointment of Bryon Coffman to Shelby County Board District #1 to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Robert Hunter.

Bennett made motion to approve the appointment of Coffman. Wetherell seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no).

Clerk Fox administered the Oath to Mr. Coffman and he took his seat on the Board.

Zoning Administrator Jared Rowcliffe presented for approval a Resolution for a Zoning Amendment (AG to General Business) to allow Wayne Snearly, who lives in Section 25 of Pickaway township, to operate an Automotive Repair and part manufacturing business. The Planning Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals have all met and given the approval for this amendment.

Gergeni made motion to approve the Resolution for Zoning Amendment. Wetherell secondec said motion, which passed by voice vote (18 yes, 0 no).

At this time Chairman Cruitt called for the Highway Engineer's report.

Alan Spesard, County Highway Engineer, addressed the Board to request approval for 3 petitions and give some updates on Highway Department projects. The first petition presented was from the Big Spring Township Highway Commissioner to replace a culvert located 1 mile east of Trowbridge. Estimated costs are \$2800 to be split equally between the Township and County.

Behl made motion to approve the petition request. Woodall seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (18 yes, 0 no).

The next petition was a request from the Richland Township Highway Commissioner to repize a 10 ton posted Bridge located 3.5 miles west of Strasburg. Estimated cost is \$260,000 and will be funded 80% Federal, 16% State with the remaining 4% being split between the Township and County.

Wetherell made motion to approve the petition. Arthur seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (18 yes, 0 no).

The final petition presented was a request from the Rural Township Highway Commissioner to replace a 12 ton posted Bridge located 5 miles northeast of Tower Hill. Estimated cost is \$420,000 and will be funded 80% Federal, 16% State with the remaining 4% split between the Township and County.

Simpson made motion to approve the petition. Kearney seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (18 yes, 0 no).

Continuing with updates, Spesard reported that the County has recently approved 3 million collars of construction projects. The bridge in Richland Township that has been closed was completed and opened last month. The closed bridge in Rural Township has been completed and was opened yesterday. The Coonee Road project totaling 1.6 million is under construction and should be completed within the next couple of weeks. Construction has begun on the Wood Street Bridge in Shelbyville; Spesard said it will be next spring before this project is finished. The semi-annual Highway Commissioners Educational conference will be held at the Highway Department on Friday, November 4th. Spesard received an email stating the Railroad will be here to work on the Main Street Crossing and smooth it out this week. Bennett thanked Spesard for taking care of a recent issue in her area quickly.

Chairman Cruitt called for committee reports. (Committee reports are attached to these minures). Reports were given and items presented for follow-up or for public awareness are as follows:

Animal Control Committee Chair Jordan - the sign is up at the Animal Control facility and really looks nice.

Law Enforcement Chair Kearney – anyone with any questions regarding the FOP or AFSCME contracts can view those contracts in the County Clerk's office.

Insurance Committee Chair Bennett stated there would be a meeting on October 31 at 9:00 with Shelbyville Insurance to discuss some upcoming changes with the Liability Insurance.

Vice Chairman Cannon spoke on behalf of the Economic Development Council of Shelby County regarding the City of Shelbyville's interest in pursuing an Enterprise Zone and passing a Tax Abatement Resolution.

Cannon passed out information regarding the tax abatement and stated he thought this would be a positive thing for both Shelby County and the City of Shelbyville. Discussion was held.

As Airport Committee member, Cannon mentioned that the Balloonfest that was held this past weekend in conjunction with Scarecrow Daze was a tremendous success with large turnouts at both the Dam West area on Friday night and Sunday morning and the County Airport for the Balloon glow on Saturday night.

Chairman Cruitt thanked the Health Department for administering flu shots this morning to County Employees, County Board members and Elected Officials.

There was no chairman correspondence or appointments for the month.

There was no further business to come before the Shelby County Board.

Clark made motion to assess mileage and per diem for the October meetings, to pay the bills rayroll as approved by the committees and adjourn until the next regular meeting to be held on November 9, 2016. Strohl seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (18 yes, 0 no) and the meeting was adjourned at 9:29 A M

Enterprise Zone Shelbyville and Shelby County Tax Abatement effect Residential

Properties within the enterprise zone would receive a 3 year abatement on all improvements approved by the city.

The Shelby County EDOC has identified that one of the major concerns industry has when relocating to Shelbyville is the lack of available housing.

The enterprise zone would be available for tax abatement up to 3 years.

An example would be:

Vacant site on N Morgan PIN: 2013-07-12-201-011

Current assessed value is \$ 7,640. The levy is 9.10456, resulting in a tax of \$695.60

A new home is being constructed on the formerly vacant site.

The home and land should assess at \$60,000 or more making the total tax \$5,462, at a mil rate of 9.10456,

If the home were in the Enterprise zone and taxes on the improvements were abated the next 3 years. Taxable income would be \$ 695.00. After 3 years the total tax would go to \$5,462.

The County, City and School would still have 3 years remaining at \$ 695 per year, and after 3 years the property would be placed on the tax role at the full assessed value and start yielding \$5,462 annually.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN THE ABATEMENT OF REAL PROPERTY TAX IN THE SHELBYVILLE ENTERPRISE ZONE IN THE CITY OF SHELBYVILLE, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, pursuant to 20 ILCS 655/1 et seq., (formerly Ill. Rev. Stat. 1991, Ch. 67½, Section 601 et. seq.) hereinafter referred to as the "Act", the State of Illinois authorized the creation of enterprise zones, together with creating incentive programs; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Act 97-0905, the State of Illinois amended the Act to provide for the creation of a new enterprise zone, and in connection therewith, the City of Shelbyville (the "City") proposes to apply to, and obtain designation from, the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (hereinafter referred to as "DCEO") to establish a new enterprise zone, from and after January 1, 2018, encompassing a part of the City; and,

WHEREAS, the City proposes to file an application with DCEO to designate, enact and create a new enterprise zone (hereinafter referred to as the "Enterprise Zone Application") under the provisions of the Act, to create the Shelbyville Enterprise Zone to include certain real estate within the City of Shelbyville, for the purpose of promoting economic growth, encouraging economic development, promoting job creation and job retention, and reducing unemployment within the City, said real estate being more fully depicted in the attached Exhibit A (such real estate hereinafter referred to as the "Enterprise Zone Area"), which is attached hereto and hereby incorporated by this reference as though fully stated herein; and,

WHEREAS, in order to offer a property tax abatement incentive within an enterprise zone, the City must provide, in the Enterprise Zone Application to DCEO, a resolution from the governing boards of taxing bodies which are participating in the abatement of property tax; and,

whereas, the _______ (taxing district) (hereinafter referred to as the "Government Entity") hereby finds that the creation of the Shelbyville Enterprise Zone is necessary in order to promote economic growth, encourage economic development, create and retain jobs, and reduce unemployment in the region; and,

WHEREAS, it is now necessary and appropriate that the governing board of the Government Entity to authorize its participation in the abatement of real property tax on improvements made to real property in the Shelbyville Enterprise Zone in order to promote economic growth, encourage economic development, create and retain jobs, and reduce unemployment in the region.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the governing board of the _______(taxing district) as follows:

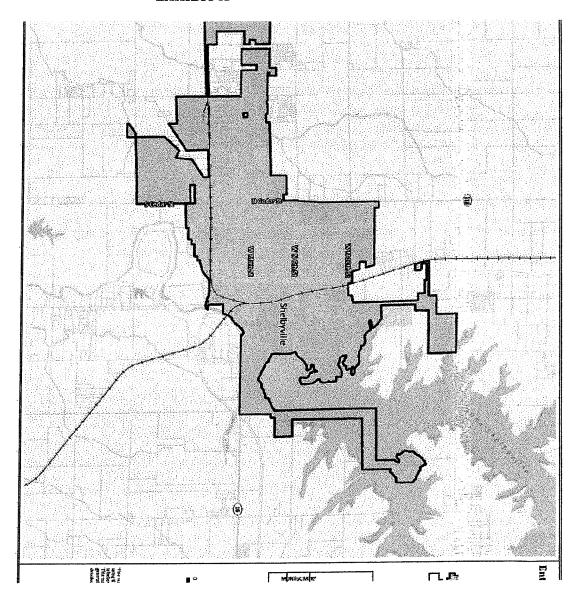

2. Real Estate Tax Abatement Incentive (Commercial Projects):

Subject to the Conditions set forth in paragraph 3., of this Resolution, the Shelby County Clerk is authorized and directed to abate the ad valorem real estate taxes imposed by the Government Entity via the Government Entity's real estate tax levy on any Qualifying Project, which are commercial projects, beginning on that year in which the commercial Qualifying Project is assessed for ad valorem real estate tax purposes by the Shelby County Supervisor of Assessments based upon the Scheduled Tax Abatement Incentive Calculation as follows:

Year One:

An amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the ad valorem taxes extended by the Shelby County Clerk attributable to one hundred percent (100%) of the assessed value of the Qualifying Project as established by the Shelby County Supervisor of Assessments.

Year Two:

An amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the ad valorem taxes extended by the Shelby County Clerk attributable to one hundred percent (100%) of the assessed value of the Qualifying Project as established by the Shelby County Supervisor of Assessments.

Year Three: An amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the ad valorem taxes extended by the Shelby County Clerk attributable to one hundred percent (100%) of the assessed value of the Qualifying Project as established by the Shelby County Supervisor of Assessments.

3. Real Estate Tax Abatement Incentive (New Residential Projects):

Subject to the Conditions set forth in paragraph 3., of this Resolution, the Shelby County Clerk is authorized and directed to abate the ad valorem real estate taxes imposed by the Government Entity via the Government Entity's real estate tax levy on any Qualifying Project, which are new residential projects, beginning on that year in which the new residential Qualifying Project is assessed for ad valorem real estate tax purposes by the Shelby County Supervisor of Assessments based upon the Scheduled Tax Abatement Incentive Calculation as follows:

Year One:

An amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the ad valorem taxes extended by the Shelby County Clerk attributable to one hundred percent (100%) of the assessed value of the Qualifying Project as established by the Shelby County Supervisor of Assessments.

Year Two:

An amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the ad valorem taxes extended by the Shelby County Clerk attributable to one hundred percent (100%) of the assessed value of the Qualifying Project as established by the Shelby County Supervisor of Assessments.

Year Three: An amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the ad valorem taxes extended by the Shelby County Clerk attributable to one hundred percent (100%) of the assessed value of the Qualifying Project as established by the Shelby County Supervisor of Assessments.

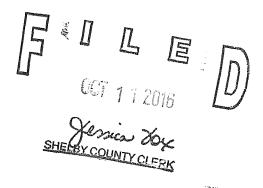

Undersheriff 'McCall made a report of the current status of the 911 Merger. All of the Sheriff's Office employees have been trained on the new software and radio equipment will soon be moved from the buffet Tower to the Corp of engineer's tower by the Dam.

The latest of the new squad cars has been put into service and it has been assigned to Deputy Litteral.

Sheriff Koonce reported we are having issues with another air-conditioning unit at the Detention Center we are currently waiting on a bid for replacement.

Sheriff Koonce also reported Deputy Sarver has elected to give up the k9 program do due health reasons. Deputy Myers will take over the program and will start training with the dog on Monday October 10th. It was discussed based on the aging and continuing problem with the k9 vehicles they well be traded off for two new Ford SUV's and one of them will be outfitted as a k9 unit for Deputy Myers.

Undersheriff McCall gave a demonstration of the new Computer Aided Dispatch software and explained the new program with all its parts has increased communications 10 fold between the office and the Deputies in the field.

The Sheriff's Office bills were reviewed and approved by the committee.

OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. Because there were new people attending the meeting, Kay shared the ongoing discussions regarding the Sheriff getting his Medicare/Insurance Supplement without paying the usual copay of most employees. At a UCCI meeting in August an attorney, Jason Brokaw, reviewed the action taken by the Fees & Salaries Committee and reported that such actions were "within the guidelines of the committee to accept such an agreement." The Fees & Salaries Committee will not be changing the procedure at this time.
 - Kay will be sure that the F & S Committee is aware that this includes the sheriff's Medicare, Prescription, and Supplemental plans.
- 2. Kay thanked Jessica Fox for preparing a document listing employees' current pay and raises. This was done to help Board members be more aware of the practice of some offices hiring new employees at a higher rate than others (along with the Union raise). Apparently those office heads had the power to hire at a higher rate which is difficult to understand.

NEW BUSINESS

Improvement of relations between employees and Board Members continues to be of great concern to Union members.

- Deb Dunaway called attention to frustration that those in the FOP Union recently filed claims for about \$30,000 for Comp Time payment. AFSME members are encouraged to use their vacation days and cannot accumulate as much comp time.
- Lisa shared that her feeling of being disrespected during the negotiation process has been difficult to put aside. Many employees feel that the salaries given to the board were inflated and inaccurate. They resented being told that they were being overpaid.
- John and Shane told about the employees at the Highway Department and the changes in personnel and responsibilities. The low base salary has been a factor in hiring and keeping trained and/or skilled workers. Everyone agrees that this will need to be addressed in future negotiations and a new pay scale created for that department.
- There was some discussion regarding what clothing and/or safety items are provided to highway employees. (safety glasses, vests, gloves, and sometimes a sweatshirt)

The next meeting will be Tuesday, January 10, 2017.

Commissioner Rick Brown calls the meeting to order.

Jim Schwerman is present too give the committee an update on the hay project. They came out and sprayed the grass, but is not dying fast as hoped. If needed, Jim said he would have them spray it again. Fertilizer will be spread Tuesday and that Vicky Shaffer had been hired to do the seeding. Jim informs the committee the corn harvest is about two weeks out and that the beans are still pretty green and

about three weeks to a month before they are ready.

Jim also explained his marketing plan for this year and will try to keep the elevator expenses to a minimum.

Jim says the harvest should be about the same levels as 2014. Corn should be around 200 bushel an acre

and beans maybe in the mid 50's. Jim also talks about some crop rotation for 2017 and also mentions the new minimum distances from the runway center lines to the crops, that IDOT says we need to comply with. Jim talk some more on the crops and maybe some cover crops. A lengthy discussion followed on different crop options

and then Jim finished with the farm update and excused himself.

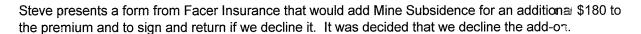
Scott introduces Curt Crosby to the commission. Curt is a pilot and also one of our hangar renters and electrician by trade. Curt is there to make aware to the commission the advantages of sub metering the E-hangars. Curt explains that one incentive to sub metering the hangars is too make the airport a better airport. Also, it would allow the tenant latitude with what all goes on in his hangar, such as plugging a engine heater in or maybe have a refrigerator. Curt explains two different ways to do it, either by kilowatt hour or ratio of kilowatts used to total kilowatts used. This way each tenant pays for what they use and it would also save the airport some expense. Curt passes a pamphlet around that shows what they look like and goes on to explain a couple mounting options. He explains that with sub metering there would be no minimum meter charge like there would be if each hangar had a separate meter/acct, with the power company. There are two different kinds to use and Curt explains the differences in them and the prices. A cost of roughly \$300 per hangar is what the expense would be or about \$6000. A lengthy discussion ensued on the advantages and cost of sub metering. It was decided that we hold off at the present time and discuss more at a later time. Curt thanked the commission for their time and excused himself.

The minutes were read by all. Rick makes a motion to approve the minutes. It was seconded by John and was approved by all saying aye.

The Treasurer's report was read by all. Walt makes a motion to approve the Treasurers Report. It was seconded by Jeff and approved by all saying aye.

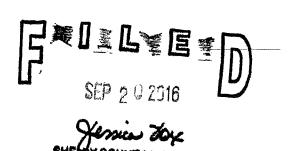

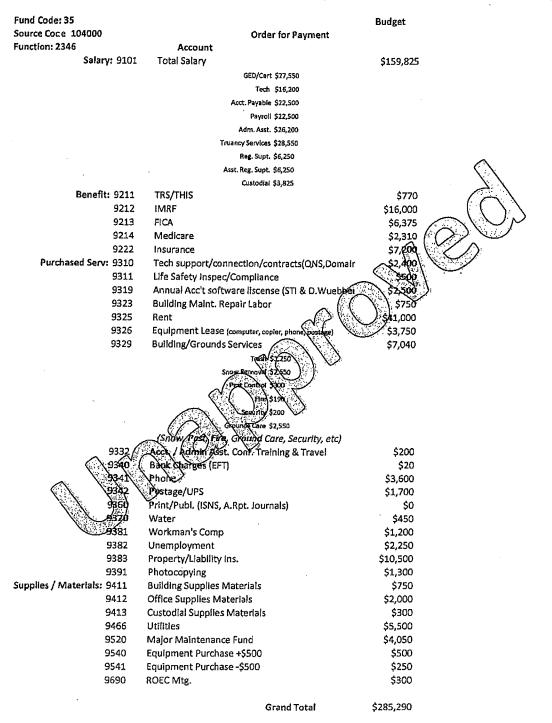

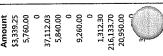
