SHELBY COUNTY BOARD MEETING September 14, 2016 – 9:00 A.M.

The Shelby County Board met on Wednesday, September 14, 2016, at $9:00\,$ A.M. at the Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman David Cruitt called the meeting to order. Board member Frank Mulholland gave the prayer and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

County Clerk Jessica Fox called the roll.

Minutes for the August 10, 2016 board meeting were presented for approval. Mulholland made motion to approve the minutes. Gergeni seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Chairman Cruitt presented a couple more Fiscal Year 2015-2016 budget amendments for DUI Equipment and Shelby County Community Services. Cruitt explained these "expense" amendments had special funds which offset the expense. (A detailed list of amendments is attached to these minutes).

Clark made motion to approve the amendments as presented. Kearney seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote: Aye: Arthur, Barr, Behl, Bennett, Cannon, Clark, Drnjevic, Durbin, Gergeni, Hayden, Jordan, Kearney, Lenz, Mulholland, Simpson, Strohl, Wetherell, Williams and Woodall. Nay: None Not Voting: Cruitt

Next, Chairman Cruitt presented the Fiscal Year 2016-2017 Budget totaling \$11,435,697. The proposed FY 16-17 Budget has a total deficit of \$295,097 and a special fund deficit of \$295,319. Amling made motion to approve the FY 2016-2017 Budget as presented. Bennett seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote: Aye: Arthur, Barr, Behl, Bennett, Cannon, Clark, Drnjevic, Durbin, Gergeni, Hayden, Jordan, Kearney, Lenz, Mulholland, Simpson, Strohl, Wetherell, Williams and Woodall. Nay: None Not Voting: Cruitt. (FY 2016-2017 Budget Summary attached to these minutes).

CIPT Transportation Director Kim Adair addressed the Board seeking approval to remove a 1995 Ford Cutaway (Unit #14-10) from service. This vehicle has over 232,000 miles, the A/C and the lift are both out and it would costs more to repair than the vehicle is worth. The plan to dispose of this vehicle is to use it for driver training in conjunction with local fire department on October 15th. Adair said she would have a location for this training at a later date and invited anyone who was interested to come watch the training. Adair also updated the Board that ridership is up 400 riders.

Wetherell made motion to approve of removing Unit #14-10 from service. Mulholland seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Treasurer Debbie Ramey updated the Board regarding the delinquent tax sale program and the County Trustee Joseph E. Meyer. This is the first year since beginning this program that the County will have unredeemed parcels to be auctioned. Ramey requested approval from the Board for a Resolution approving issuing a Deed of Conveyance from Shelby County Trustee to the Village of Oconee for parcel 1116-29-06-103-002.

Bennett made motion to approve the Resolution for a Deed of Conveyance to be issued to the Village of Oconee. Wetherell seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote: Aye: Arthur, Barr, Behl, Bennett, Cannon, Clark, Drnjevic, Durbin, Gergeni, Hayden, Jordan, Kearney, Lenz, Mulholland, Simpson, Strohl, Wetherell, Williams and Woodall. Nay: None. Not Voting: Cruitt.

At this time, Chairman Cruitt called for the County Highway Engineer's report.

Alan Spesard, County Highway Engineer, addressed the Board to present some updates and request approval for one petition. Spesard presented the petition from the Windsor Township Highway Commissioner to replace a bridge located 2.5 miles north of the City of Windsor. Estimated costs to replace this bridge are \$300,000. The funding for this bridge will be 80% Federal, 16% State and the remaining 4% being split equally between the County and Windsor Township.

Gergeni made motion to approve the petition for the bridge replacement in Windsor Township. Mulholland seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no). (Copy of petition attached to these minutes).

Continuing with updates, Spesard reported the RR crossing in Rural Township has been approved. This project will be 100% funded with the design and construction oversight being handled by the Highway Department. Those costs will be reimbursed as well. Rural Township will contribute \$2500 towards this RR crossing improvement and Union Pacific is to install gates and lights upon completion of the crossing upgrades. Estimated costs are \$78,440. A Federal Grant has been awarded to replace a bridge located on the County Highway near Henton. The letting was scheduled to take place in June of 2017, however a request was made to move this letting forward and it is now scheduled to be held in January 2017. Costs for this bridge replacement are estimated at 1 million dollars. Work on the Wood Street Bridge in Shelbyville was scheduled to begin after Labor Day; however the City requested additional storm sewers, which they will be paying for, so the expected start date is now September 26th. Spesard updated the Board that he is working on a new grant to improve the approach to a RR crossing in Westervelt. This would be federally funded with special funds solicited from IDOT, estimated costs are \$388,000. Spesard stated that Union Pacific had anchored the panels on the RR crossing east of the Courthouse; however it is still rough. Spesard he plans on filing another complaint with the ICC. Ending his report, Spesard stated the EPA has approved a tire collection for local government agencies to be held at the Highway Department. This will be the first tire pickup to be approved in 2 years.

Chairman Cruitt called for committee reports. (Committee reports are attached to these minutes). Reports were given and items presented for follow-up or for public awareness are as follows:

Law Enforcement Chair Kearney – Sheriff Koonce and Undersheriff McCall have implemented a ballistic vest policy for all full-time deputies and Courthouse Security. Deputies are mandated to wear their vests whenever they are on duty. Undersheriff McCall reported that most of the auxiliary officers had purchased their own vests. One of the K-9's has been retired due to his age and aggressive personality.

Finance Chair Cannon – a budget meeting will be held on September 21. Cannon also reported the balloon fest is scheduled to take place at the Airport on Saturday October 8th. Festivities will run in conjunction with Scarecrow Daze and the balloon fest will go from Friday evening through Sunday. Anyone interested in helping with parking would be welcome.

Shelby County Board Meeting September 14, 2016

Public Buildings Chair Wetherell – the committee met with Bill Utz, the Architect. Utz will take bids for the work that needs to be done and meet with the committee after figures and estimated costs are available.

Kenneth Kramer, Drainage Commissioner for Combined Drainage District #2 Town of Tower Hill. Motion by Amling, second by Bennett; all voted aye by voice (20 yes, 0 no).


Dennis Drnjevic to replace Robert Hunter on the Mental Health "708" Board; motion by Hayden, second by Barr; all voted aye by voice (20 yes, 0 no).

There was no Correspondence.

Under public body comment, Bryan Kibler, Effingham County State's Attorney, addressed the Board to update them on the current status of the lawsuit involving Shelby County, Dave and Barbara Galvin, the Curls and Goodwins. This law suit has been going on approximately 10 years; at issue is Lithia Estates Subdivision, and how it was originally platted. Judge Koester has approved the replat of the lots from 32 ¼ acres lots, to 5 or 6 lots, but she has some stipulations. Those include creating a turnaround at the end of the cul-de-sac, planting trees and erecting a fence. Kibler feels the turnaround can be constructed for under \$35,000; this expense will be Shelby County's to pay. Judge Koester was hopeful that those involved in the dispute could come to some sort of agreement, but Kibler reports that has not been the case. Arguments continue over trees (mature or seedlings) as well as whether or not curbs and gutters will be put in place. Discussion was held. Kibler stated another conference call is scheduled to take place in 10 days. Kibler stated he doesn't feel this suit will be resolved anytime soon.

At this time there was no further business to come before the Shelby County Board.

Clark made motion to assess mileage and per diem for the September meetings, to pay the bills/payroll as approved by the committees and adjourn until the next regular meeting to be held on October 12, 2016. Strohl seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no) and the meeting was adjourned at 9:39 A.M.



ORDER DIRECTING COUNTY CLERK TO ISSUE TAX DEEDS AND PROVIDING OTHER RELIEF

This cause comes on for hearing, pursuant to Application, upon the Petition of SHELBY COUNTY, AS TRUSTEE For Taxing Districts, for the Orders of this Court directing the County Clerk of Shelby County, Illinois, to issue Tax Deeds, and for other relief. It appearing to the Court that all persons entitled thereto have received due notice of these proceedings, and the Court having considered testimony, exhibits and arguments, and being fully advised, HEREBY FINDS as follows, to-wit:

- 1. That this Court has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof and of all parties hereto; and
- 2. That all of the evidence, including Certificates, Affidavits and Supplements thereto, offered for admission into evidence by Petitioner should be, and are hereby, admitted into evidence herein; and
- 3. That all of the allegations of the Petition and Application filed by Petitioner herein are true and sufficiently proven; and that at the Collector's sale of lands and lots for nonpayment of taxes and assessments alleged within said Petition and Application herein, Petitioner duly purchased the Parcels of Shelby County, Illinois, real property (hereinafter, "the Parcels") described by their respective official numbers within "EXHIBIT A" attached hereto and made a part hereof, as evidenced by the Shelby County, Illinois, 2012 Tax Sale Certificates of Purchase likewise described by their respective official numbers within "EXHIBIT A" hereof; and that Petitioner is now the owner of each such Tax Sale Certificate of Purchase; and
- 4. That the time for redemption from the aforesaid sale expired prior to the date hereof, i.e., on July 8, 2016, and that the Parcels have not been redeemed from said sale as provided by law; and
- 5. That all of the notices required by law have been duly and timely given and provided; and that Petitioner has fully and strictly complied with all of the provisions of law necessary to the issuance of tax deeds to the Parcels described within said "EXHIBIT A"; and that Petitioner is entitled to the Orders of this Court directing the issuance of tax deeds as to all of the Parcels so described within said "EXHIBIT A".

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the County Clerk of Shelby County, Illinois, shall forthwith issue to the Petitioner, SHELBY COUNTY, AS TRUSTEE For Taxing Districts, upon its request hereafter, Tax Deeds conveying to said SHELBY COUNTY, AS TRUSTEE, or to its assigns, the Parcels of real property described by their respective official numbers within "EXHIBIT A" hereof (except those Parcels, if any, which shall have been redeemed prior to the entry hereof, as shown

within the Tax Judgment, Sale, Redemption and Forfeiture Record), free and clear of all of the interests of all of the former owners and occupants thereof, and free and clear of all liens formerly held by Taxing Districts for which said Petitioner acts as Trustee (all such liens being merged into the title derived by Petitioner through such Tax Deeds), and free and clear of all of the interests of all other persons and parties heretofore interested in the Parcels (whether as lienholders or otherwise), it being FURTHER ORDERED that all of the former interests of all such former owners, occupants, lienholders and parties otherwise interested in the said Parcels are HEREBY EXTINGUISHED and of no further force or effect, whatever; and

FURTHER, that Petitioner and assigns are entitled to, and are hereby granted, possession of all of the aforesaid Parcels, and may enforce this Order as provided by law; and that this Court hereby retains jurisdiction to, and shall hereafter, enter such other and further Orders herein as may be necessary or desirable to place and to maintain Petitioner and its assigns in possession of said real property; and that for good cause shown, the period for issuance and recording of Tax Deeds as to the said Parcels pursuant to 35 ILCS 200/22-85 is HEREBY TOLLED pending further Order of this Court herein; and





Roofing product comparison

Major categories of roofing products for sloped roofs include asphalt shingles, slate, tile, wood shingles and shakes and historicated products of metal or plastic.

halt shingles

phalt shingles are the most common type of shingle used on residential and commercial buildings, as they come in a variety of styles, shapes and colors. An asphalt shingle is reinforced with organic material, wood fibers or fiber glass and surfaced with mineral granules. The two common types in the market are three-tab and architectural shingles. Asphalt shingles can last from 15 to 20 years.

Tile roofing

Tiles are made from clay, concrete and rubber. Tile roofing can last up to 50 years. The weight of the tiles requires a significant support system. Average costs are typically two to three times higher than asphalt shingles.

Wood shakes

Most wood shakes are made from treated wood, such as cedar, with dimensions generally random from one to another. Wood shakes typically last up to 30 years. Installation for wood shakes and wood shingles is about three times more expensive than asphalt shingles.

Slate shingles

Slate shingles are dense, fine grained, metamorphic rock cut into shingles. Slate shingles come in many sizes, thicknesses and finishes. Slate shingles are heavier and harder to install. Synthetic slate shingles are becoming a popular replacement for traditional slate shingles. Synthetic slate shingles weigh less than traditional slate shingles. A slate roof can last from 50 to 75 years, and some will lest more than 100 years if instelled correctly. Slate shingles can cost as much as four times more than asphalt shingles. The cost is often recouped by its quality, aesthetic value and lifespan.

Metal roofing

Standing seam, steel, aluminum and copper are the most common metal roofing materials used on commercial buildings. A metal roof can last between 30 and 50 years, and copper could last up to 100 years. A metal roof can withstand extreme weather, but hallstomm frequently cause cosmetic denting. Average costs are typically two to three times higher than asphalt shingles.

Warranty

Warranties vary greatly between manufacturers and contractors. A manufacturer warranty might provide coverage against manufacturing defects in the materials and the contractor warranty might provide coverage against workmanship errors.

Major caregories of flat or low-sloped roofs include built-up, single-ply membranes, modified bitumen and foam roof product.

Built-up roof (BUR)

A built-up roof is the traditional hot tar and gravel roof. The components of hot tar and membrane are assembled in iayers at the job site to form the built-up roof. The roof is normally ballasted by a layer of smooth river stone. A built-up roof can last up to 25 years and is the least expensive of the four flat roof products mentioned here.

Single-ply membrane

Single-ply membranes are the most popular flat rooling material used in commercial construction. These roofs can often be installed in one complete layer of material. The most common types of single-ply membranes are EPDM, the true rubber roof, and PVC and TPO, a form of plastic. Most membrane roofs are glued down, but other attachment options include mechanically anchored fasteners or ballasted with river stone.

The light-colored versions are recommended in warm climates: Even the black version costs more than BUR or modified bitumen. Single-ply membranes are also more vulnerable to punctures than other choices. A typical roof can last 70 to 50 years.

Modified bitumen

Sometimes referred to as polymer-modified bitumen, this type of troofing is a single-ply rolled roof with a mineral-based surface. Torch-down systems involve heating the adhesive as the meterial is unrolled. Newer peel-and-stick systems are safer and easier to install. A typical roof can last 20 to 30 years Torch-down applications add to the cost.

Sprayed polyurethane foam (SPF)

Sprayed polyurethane foam is sprayed on as a liquid. One of its biggest advantages is that it can be sprayed directly over an existing roof, eliminating the need to remove the old roof covering. The foam is then covered with a protective coating and granules for added performance, it can last 30 years, although the protective coating may need to be reapplied every 10 to 15 years. The cost of foam is relatively low. Cost increases come from the type of protective coating used and from the higher density foams.

Life expectancy Severe wind and hall storr damage and impact the life

Severe wind and hail storms can do serious damage and impact the life of a roof and its ability to protect a building from additional damage. Building factors, such as roof steepness and roof complexity, along with proper roof ventilation and sun exposure, affect the life of a roof. The life of the roof is also affected by location, building height and measures taken to maintain the roof.

Hail impact-resistant roofing classifications

Undewriter's Laboratories (UL) classifies the degree of impact resistance based on the size of a steel ball tested to withstand direct impact. A point to note when purchasing materials is that the higher hail impact classes typically also provide greater wind resistance. The classes range from 1 to 4. Church Mutual recommends selecting roofing materials with a Class 3 or Class 4 rating.

- Class 3 Roofing material can withstand 1 %" steel ball impact
- Class 4 Roofing material can withstand 2" steel ball impact

Construction difficulty

Construction difficulty refers to the project complexity with respect to labor, equipment and materials. Proper installation is critical for ensuring optimal performance.

- Low Easy to install, limited training or equipment needed to install.
- Medium Requires additional training or equipment to install.
- High Highly specialized installation that requires expert skills and tools.




