SHELBY COUNTY BOARD MEETING

May 8, 2019 - 9:00 A.M.

The Shelby County Board met on Wednesday, May 8, 2019, at 9:00 A.M. at the Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman David Cruitt called the meeting to order. Board member David Swits gave the prayer and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

County Clerk Jessica Fox called the roll. Amling, Behl, Coffman and Hayden were absent.

Minutes for the April 10, 2019 board meeting were presented for approval. Mulholland made motion to approve the minutes. Lenz seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no).

PCOM Jared Rowcliffe addressed the board requesting approval to award the concrete bids for work around the maintenance building. 2 bids were submitted from Fox & Austin of Shelbyville (\$22,463.08) and Hadley Concrete from Pana (\$16,546.27). Rowcliffe stated he had personal experience in working with Hadley Concrete.

Patterson made motion to accept the low bid from Hadley Concrete. Gergeni seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote for services (16 yes, 1 nay Bennett).

Next Rowcliffe presented 4 bids for a 20T vehicle lift to be installed at the maintenance facility. Those bids submitted were Automotive Equipment Sales and Service (\$19,057.40) and (\$21,094) which included a shockwave system. Dust and Son Auto Supplies (\$20,498.00) and USA Lift (\$29,989.00).

Mulholland made motion to accept the low bid of \$19,057.40. Wetherell seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no).

At this time, Chairman Cruitt called for the County Highway Engineer's report.

Alan Spesard, County Highway Engineer, presented for approval 3 petitions and provided some updates. The first petition presented was a request from the Big Spring/Sigel Highway Commissioners to replace a box culvert that sits on the township line. Estimated cost is \$8,000 and will be split 50/50.

Cannon made motion to approve the petition. Lenz seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no).

A petition from the Ridge Township Highway Commissioner to replace a bridge north of Henton was presented. Estimated costs are \$500,000 and will be funded with 80% Federal funds, 16% State funds with the rest to be shared between the County and the Township.

Durbin made motion to approve the petition. Cannon seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no).

The final petition presented was a request from the Ash Grove Township Highway Commissioner to replace a box culvert located 3 miles southeast of Windsor. Estimated costs are \$3,000 and will be split 50/50 between the county and township.

Wetherell made motion to approve the petition. Gergeni seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no).

Continuing with updates, Spesard reported the Cowden-Herrick road project, which will utilize the former revolving loan funds, has been approved and the agreement signed. This project will be bid in July. The bridge in Windsor Township is scheduled to be bid on June 14th. Cold mix production took place in mid April at the highway department. 2,000 tons of cold mix was made for the County and for those townships that requested it. The semi-annual highway commissioners' conference was held at the Highway Department on May 5th and was well attended.

Chairman Cruitt called for committee reports. (Committee reports are attached to these minutes). Reports were given and items presented for follow-up are as follows:

Public Building committee member Gary Gergeni informed the board the construction crew hoped to have the framing done this week.

Chairman Cruitt requested the appointment of Troy Uphoff to the Farm Land Assessment Committee. A vacancy exists due to the passing of Dale Short. Wetherell made motion to approve the appointment. Patterson seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no).

Cruitt next requested the appointment of Sue Berryman to the Shelby County Health Board. Simpson made motion to approve the appointment. Swits seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no).

State's Attorney Vonderheide addressed the Board requesting approval for a Resolution to amend the County's Liquor Ordinance to include two classes of restaurant licenses, Class A and Class B. Class B would require the licensee to already have another liquor license with the County, have gaming machines and also serve food. A current license holder requested another liquor license in order to install gaming machines. A gaming machine license requires consumption on premises of alcohol. Amending the current restaurant licenses into 2 classes was the best option. A class B restaurant license will be \$500.00 annually.

Mulholland made motion to approve the Resolution amending the County's Liquor Ordinance to include 2 classifications of Restaurant License. Swits seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no).

Chairman Cruitt informed the Board the county had received reimbursement in the amount of \$800 from UCCI for attendance at 3 membership meetings during the 1st quarter. The CEO trade show was held recently and very well attended. The County was given a plaque for thanks for their support and it is on display in Courtroom B.

Gary Gergeni mentioned he had given 46 pieces of "relics" removed from the roof of the Courthouse to the Historical Society. They were pleased to get them and invited the board down to tour the facility.

At this time, Chairman Cruitt requested a motion to enter into closed session pursuant to 5 ILCS 120/2 (C) (11) litigation.

Bennett made motion to adjourn the regular meeting and convene to closed session. Mulholland seconded said motion. Roll Call Vote: Aye: Arthur, Barr, Bennett, Cannon, Drnjevic, Durbin, Gergeni, Jordan, Kearney, Lenz, Metzger, Mulholland, Patterson, Simpson, Swits, Wetherell and Williams. Nay: None. Not Voting: Cruitt. Absent: Amling, Behl, Coffman and Hayden. Motion carried.

CLOSED SESSION OF THE COUNTY BOARD

The Closed Session was ended, the doors opened and spectators were allowed to return to the meeting. There was no action taken in closed session.

Wetherell made motion to adjourn the Closed Session and to reconvene the regular session. Mulholland seconded said motion. Roll Call Vote: Aye: Arthur, Barr, Bennett, Cannon, Drnjevic, Durbin, Gergeni, Jordan, Kearney, Lenz, Metzger, Mulholland, Patterson, Simpson, Swits, Wetherell and Williams. Nay: None. Not Voting: Cruitt. Absent: Amling, Behl, Coffman and Hayden. Motion carried.

There was no public body comment and no further business to come before the Shelby County Board.

Metzger made motion to assess mileage and per diem for the May meetings, to pay the bills/payroll as approved by the committees and adjourn until the next regular meeting to be held on June 12, 2019. Cannon seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no) and the meeting was adjourned at 9:40A.M.

RESOLUTION NO. 2019-19

WHEREAS, the County of Shelby, State of Illinois, has heretofore enacted Liquor Control Resolutions, regulating the sale of alcoholic liquor outside of the corporate limits of any city, town or village within the County; and

WHEREAS, the Shelby County Board deems it necessary and desirable to revise and amend the Liquor Control regulations; and

WHEREAS, Shelby County Resolution No. 02-16 was enacted on July 10, 2002, to consolidate all previous Liquor Control Resolutions.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED THAT the Liquor Control Resolution No. 02-16 is hereby amended as follows:


- 1. Article VII, paragraph E states:
 - A. Class Five/Restaurant "A" License: A Restaurant A License shall only be issued to a restaurant as defined under the terms of this resolution and shall entitle the licensee to sell alcoholic beverages at retail to its patrons for consumption on the premises only. The license fee for a Restaurant A License shall be \$600.00 per annum. The maximum number of Restaurant A Licenses issued shall be one (1) per township.
 - B. Class Five/Restaurant "B" License: A Restaurant B License shall only be issued when the following criteria are met:
 - i. The licensee has at least one existing, current license from the County;
 - ii. Gaming machines are operating on the premises; and
 - iii. The licensee operates a restaurant as defined in Article I, Section 3, Paragraph L, except that the sale of food need not generate at least seventy percent (70%) of the gross revenue during the license period.

The fee for a Restaurant B License shall be \$500.00. The maximum number of Restaurant B Licenses issued shall be one (1) per township.

SHELBY COUNTY PUBLIC BUILDINGS COMMITTEE MEETING

April 10, 2019 - 10:00 A.M.

The Shelby County Public Buildings Committee met on Wednesday, April 10, 2019, at 10:00 A.M. at the Shelby County Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois, immediately following the County Board meeting.

Chairman Dale Wetherell called the meeting to order. Those Public Building committee members in attendance were James Arthur, Ken Barr, Gary Gergeni and Frank Mulholland. Board member David Swits, Chairman David Cruitt, Sheriff Don Koonce and Clerk Jessica Fox were also present.

Four bids were submitted for a generator for the Shelby County Courthouse. Two of the bids were submitted completely with labor and materials, the other 2 bids were just for the generator and no labor. The bids were as follows:

Figgins Electric - \$68,420.46

D & M - \$53,230.00

Shelby Energy - \$28,900.66 (Generator only, no labor for installation)

Gateway - \$35,590.00 (Generator only, no labor for installation)

It was also mentioned that the fuse box that would be controlled by the generator also needs a lot of work done in preparation for the generator installation. Discussion was held. There are concerns regarding damage to the heating and cooling system due to occasional "brown outs." The Sheriff stated he would prepare a report showing how much the County has spent on these repairs. The committee feels it is important to create a list of projects that are needed at the courthouse and create either a 5 or 10 year plan. It might be necessary to look into funding a building repair fund, or possibly doing a bond referendum to pay for other projects such as windows in the future. The committee realizes a generator is of importance, however with the unknowns concerning the expenses for the roof repair project, feels that we can't take on another large expense at this time.

Mulholland made motion to delay any plans to purchase and install a generator until the roof project is done and those expenses paid. Arthur seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (4 aye, 0 nay).

Mulholland made motion to adjourn the meeting. Arthur seconded said motion, all voted aye by voice and the meeting was adjourned at 10:19 AM.

SHELBY COUNTY BUDGET MEETING

April 25, 2019

The Shelby County Budget Committee met on Thursday, April 25, 2019, at 9:00 A.M. at the Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman David Cruitt called the meeting to order. Those Budget members in attendance were Gary Gergeni, Kay Kearney, Larry Lenz, Barbara Bennett, Gary Patterson, Frank Mulholland and newly appointed member Terry Metzger. Bruce Cannon and Rob Amling were absent. Office heads in attendance were Treasurer Erica Firnhaber and County Clerk Jessica Fox.

Chairman Cruitt stated he had UCCI do a survey of counties that hold night meetings. Of the 40 counties that responded, 33 hold night meetings. Public comment recently has requested the Shelby County Board switch to evening meetings. Moving the meetings to the evening would increase public attendance/ participation. Making the move to evening meetings would also allow people who work full time the ability to run for County Board. Concerns expressed were that with the change to evening meetings, public attendance might not increase, church services and sports activities would be a conflict that might decrease member attendance and costs would increase due to the need for security after hours.

Bennett made motion to leave the board meetings as they are currently scheduled. Mulholland seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (5 yes, 2 no Gergeni and Patterson).

Patterson and Gergeni both mentioned this was an issue that needs to be discussed before the full board for their input.

Clerk Fox passed submitted budget reports for FY 19-20. The committee began with review of the County Clerk budget. Fox stated she would be receiving \$33,000 in grant funding but still needed to show the expenses, since these grant funds would go directly into the general fund. Questions were raised about the differences in how group insurance is budgeted and varies by department. Treasurer Firnhaber is going to address this and update the office heads on how this should be budgeted. Discussion was held regarding those departments whose salaries are partially reimbursed by the state and whether the entire expense should be shown on the budget since those officials don't actually see any of that reimbursement. Those salaries that are partially reimbursed by the State are Probation, State's Attorney, Public Defender and Supervisor of Assessments. The Highway Engineer's salary is partially reimbursed out of MFT. Vacation payout, pay increases and comp time payouts were discussed as these impact IMRF and are an additional liability for the County. The Treasurer is working on a spread sheet to show the amount paid out over base salary.

The committee was able to review the following budgets: County Clerk, Circuit Clerk, Treasurer, Coroner, Regional Supt. of Schools, State's Attorney and the Highway Department. After reviewing all of the submitted budgets, but committee will schedule meetings with those officials/department heads whose budgets are in question.

The committee plans on reviewing the information they were given today and meeting again on Wednesday, May 1 at 9:00 AM to continue with budget discussions.





LAW ENFORCEMENT COMMITTEE

May 3rd

Sheriff Koonce called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with the following members of the committee present: Kay Kearney and Gary Paterson. Undersheriff McCall served as secretary. Dave Woods of Mytech solution was present for the meeting.

First spoke about were the needed upgrades to the computer's and computer systems for the Sheriff's Office. Dave Woods presented a proposal to replace 6 desktops 14 laptops and 2 servers in the Sheriff's Office. Dave reported on January 14th 2020 Microsoft will no longer support Windows 7 and only utilize Windows 10. This change in support will instantly make the above listed computers vulnerable to cyber-attack. Putting the county in harms way for large data recovery cost with the probability of insurance not paying the claim if we are running outdated systems. The Committee agreed the above listed equipment will need to be replaced and will address the budget issues at the June Board Meeting.

Sheriff Koonce reported a surplus squad car was sold on sealed bid. The car was purchased for \$5500.00

Undersheriff McCall submitted a petition and order to dispose of county property to the committee, namely for numerous outdated cameras. Kay will check with Jessica Fox of the petition can be made during her committee report at the next meeting or will have to wait until the June agenda. (June it is)

Adam Hudson has been hired as a full-time correctional officer. The appointment has been made to replace Harold Lawson whom has gone on disability for health reasons.

Sheriff Koonce requested the committee and board look into earmarking the proceeds form the Corp of Engineers contract into a budget line item for either Sheriff's Office Computer equipment as those needs seem to be endless. Or into Court house maintenance.

A discussion was held about supplemental employees and the counties obligation to provide health insurance to them if they work over 30 hours a week or 600 hours year. There are currently 5 supplemental employees who may qualify for this benefit. Undersheriff McCall proposed these Employees be made full time as they are all participation in the IRMF retirement plan. Additionally, If the county starts to carry them on the insurance program they are for all intense and purpose full time. And hiring the additional staff fulltime may relieve scheduling issues within the jail. Committee request the Sheriff resubmit the FY 2019/2020 budget to include increases for moving the supplemental staff to full time so the budget committee can review the plan. LEC is in favor of the proposal.

Tim Culberson came into the meeting and gave a progress report on the court house and spoke of several cooling and heating issues within the building. He also spoke of a recent elevator repair and water leak.

The LEC then reviewed the expenditures for the Sheriff's Office and the meeting was concluded.

SHELBY COUNTY BUDGET MEETING

May 1, 2019

The Shelby County Budget Committee met on Wednesday, May 1, 2019, at 9:00 A.M. at the Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman David Cruitt called the meeting to order. Those Budget members in attendance were Kay Kearney, Larry Lenz, Barbara Bennett, Gary Patterson, Frank Mulholland and Terry Metzger. Bruce Cannon, Rob Amling and Gary Gergeni were absent. Office heads in attendance were Treasurer Erica Firnhaber, SOA Debbie Dunaway and County Clerk Jessica Fox.

Clerk Fox informed the committee that the County offices had an HR assessment performed on Monday, April 29, with Donna Rogers, HR Consultant with CIRMA. Most of the department heads were very cooperative in participating with this human resources assessment. Fox told the committee that part-time employees, who are regularly scheduled for 30+ hours a week, are eligible and must be offered health insurance. Also, if a wavier is to be signed it needs to be from Consociate. Installation of a time clock was once again discussed; the committee feels that the department heads are to be responsible for their own employees.

Budget review continued:

Supervisor of Assessments – Increased by \$6,600. Quadrennial year, increase in postage and printing costs. Farm Committee 0 no change from previous year

Probation -The committee would like to see telephone, dues, subscriptions, postage and printing broken out as they were in the past. Salary increase for deputy clerk will be discussed (35,500 - \$36,688) and mileage increase (\$3,500 - \$5,000). The committee will plan on meeting with Probation CMO Aaron Burdick to discuss his departmental budgets at a later date.

Animal Control - budget is ok for now, discussion was held regarding Brad's overtime.

EMA - shows a salary increase in the amount of \$755 for the office holder (\$21,550 - \$22,305). Treasurer Firnhaber stated in reviewing clothing allowance as taxable income, the EMA vehicle could be considered as a taxable benefit for this office. Salary increase will be discussed further at a later date.

County Farm – increased by \$1,000 for real estate taxes

Merit Commission – decrease budget by \$6,000

County Zoning - increase in office holder salary in amount of \$650 (\$18,800 - \$19,450), to be discussed at a later date.

No significant changes were noted to the following: Circuit Judge, Board of Review, Planning, Board of Appeals, and SCCS.

Health – Administrative raises will be given by the Board of Health in June. Revisit at that time.

Public Defender – increase in office holder salary (\$117,000 - \$118, 616) required to be 90% of State's Attorney salary for full-time PD. This salary is reimbursed at 2/3's.

General Fund 029 - revisit

Probation Service Fees – discuss with Aaron at a later date.

The committee plans to continue the budget review process on Wednesday, May 15 at 9:00 AM.

Mulholland made motion to adjourn the meeting. Bennett seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (6 yes, 0 no).

The meeting was adjourned at 10:26 AM.


