SHELBY COUNTY BOARD MEETING
May 12, 2022 – 7:00 P.M.

The Shelby County Board met on Thursday, May 12, 2022, at 7:00 P.M. in Courtroom A of the Shelby County Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Vice-Chairman Gary Patterson called the meeting to order. Prayer was given by board member Sharon Ongman and all those present said the Pledge of Allegiance.

County Clerk Jessica Fox called the roll. Mark Bennett, Bryon Coffman, Jesse Durbin, Jeff Slifer and David Swits were absent.

Minutes for the April 14, 2022, board meeting were presented for approval. Barr made motion to approve the minutes. Orman seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no).

Vice-Chairman Patterson called for Public Body Comment.

Carol Cole reported 180 acres of beans have been planted at the County Farm and 20 more acres would be planted as soon as the fields dry out.

Jake from, Gregory's Resort, spoke to the board about the liquor license they had recently applied for in April. Discussion was held. The County's liquor ordinance says only 2 licenses may be issued per township, but Okaw already has 3 licenses, as does Prairie. The Liquor Ordinance needs updates. Those in attendance from Gregory's Resort were encouraged to speak with the Board Chair as Liquor Commissioner and the State's Attorney.

Kirk Allen, from the Edgar County Watchdog's spoke about the forensic auditor being told the "in/out logs" from the Sheriff's office had been destroyed, when they were received by someone who had foia'd them recently. Allen stated it appears these records were held and concealed from the auditor conducting the forensic payroll audit. Allen also discussed the gun sales that took place in 2018 and discrepancies with records involving those gun sales.

Bob Simpson, Chairman of the Zoning Committee presented for approval a resolution to rezone property (2.95 acres) owned by Bart and Michelle Owens in Shelbyville Township, located at 1457 N 2300 East Rd, from rural residential to general business for the purpose of rental cabins. Owens was present and informed the board that no campers of any type would be permitted at this location.

Williams made motion to approve the resolution. Drnjevic seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (17 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Patterson, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay; none.

Simpson presented a variance for the same property for an overall 900 square foot allowance for the rental cabins. Drnjevic made motion to approve the variance, Williams seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (17 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Patterson, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay; none.

The final zoning resolution presented was to rezone property (7.49 acres) owned by M & S Holdings, Inc., represented by Shawn Starwalt, located at 2108 N 2300 East Rd in Findlay, from rural residential to general business for the purposed of storage rental buildings. Starwalt addressed the board and stated these units would be rented for the storage of boats and large RV's and no living quarters would be permitted.

Drnjevic made motion to approve the resolution, Williams seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (17 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Patterson, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay; none.

At this time, Vice Chairman Patterson called for the County Highway Engineer's report.

In Steve Dewitt's absence, Reed Best presented for approval, 3 50/50 petitions and provided some updates. The first 50/50 petition presented was from the Lakewood Highway Commissioner to replace a CMP (corrugated metal pipe) with a CMP located at 1300E/650N, 1 mile south of Lakewood. Estimated costs are \$4,800 to be shared equally between the County and the Township.

B Bennett made motion to approve the petition, Simpson seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (17 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Patterson, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay; none.

The next 50/50 petition was from the Cold Spring and Lakewood Highway Commissioners to replace a CMP with a CMP located at 370N/1200E, 3 miles southwest of Lakewood. Estimated costs are \$4,700 and will be shared 25% Lakewood Township, 25% Cold Spring Township and the remaining 50% to be paid by Shelby County. Barr made motion to approve the petition, Tate seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (17 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Patterson, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay; none.

The final 50/50 petition presented was from Big Spring Twp/Sigel Twp Road commissioners to replace a concrete box culvert with 2 CMPs. The location of the project is 400N/3120E, located 3.2 miles east of Stewardson. Estimated costs are \$22,170 and will be shared 25% by each township, with the remaining 50% to be paid by the County.

Orman made motion to approve the petition, boehm seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (17 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Patterson, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay; none.

Continuing with updates, Best informed the board that the County Club Road (County Highway 5) project is slated to begin July 11. The Westervelt Bridge project is also scheduled to begin in early July. The Findlay bridge will be inspected the week of May 16 – May 18. This will conclude the bridge inspections due for 2022. County Highway Engineer Steve Dewitt is registered to take a bridge inspection course in Ohio in June.

Circuit Clerk Kari Kingston addressed the board to request an emergent budget amendment due to her office receiving a \$123,953.78 technology improvement grant for the Circuit Clerk's office and both Courtrooms from the AOIC. This grant will be used to purchase new computers and audio/visual equipment.

B. Bennett made motion to approve the budget amendment, Edwards seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (17 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Patterson, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay; none.

Assistant State's Attorney Jay Scott presented a memorandum of understanding between the County and the Animal Control Warden regarding compensation and wages.

Williams made motion to approve the MOU, Drnjevic seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (16 yes, 0 no, 1 abstain – Cox). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Patterson, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay; none. Abstain – Cox.

The next MOU presented was between the County and the Highway Department AFSCME workers regarding the payment of the clothing allowance. Drnjevic made motion to approve the MOU, Ongman seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (17 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Patterson, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay; none.

Scott presented a resolution to set the salary for the Sheriff to take office on December 1, 2022. The State recently passed legislation (PA 102-0699), which sets the salary of the Sheriff at 80% of the State's Attorney salary. The State will reimburse the County 66 2/3 of the Sheriff's salary, just as they do for full-time Public Defenders.

B. Bennett made motion to approve the salary setting resolution for the Shelby County Sheriff. Lenz seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (17 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Patterson, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay; none.

Pursuant to 50 ILCS 145/2, salaries for Elected Officials are required to be set 180 days prior to those officials taking office on December 1. This would require the board to set the salaries for the Supervisor of Assessments, Treasurer and County Clerk & Recorder at this meeting.

Assistant State's Attorney Scott presented a resolution to set the salary of the Supervisor of Assessments at \$63,330 for the next 4 years. This would be a 1 time \$5,000 increase on December 1, 2022. B. Bennett made motion to approve the salary for the SOA. Drnjevic seconded said motion. Discussion was held. While other elected positions get a \$6,500 annual stipend, the SOA does not. 1/2 of the SOA's salary is also reimbursed by the State.

Ongman made motion to increase the salary of the Supervisor of Assessments by \$5,000 on December 1, 2022, and by 2% each year on December 1, 2023, December 1, 2024, and December 1, 2025. Tate seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (15 yes, 2 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Ongman, Orman, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay: Lenz, Patterson.

Tate made motion to approve the salary resolution for the Supervisor of Assessments to reflect a \$5,000 increase on the current salary of \$58,330 on December 1, 2022. A 2% increase on the salary of \$63,330 on 12/1/2023, a 2% increase on 12/1/2024 and a 2% increase on 12/1/2025. Edwards seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (17 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Patterson, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay: none.

Tate made motion to amend the salary setting resolution for the Shelby County Treasurer to a 1 time \$5,000 increase on the current salary of \$58,330 on December 1, 2022, and a 2% increase for years 2-4 on 12/1/23, 12/1/24 and 12/2/25. Cox seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (15 yes, 1 no and 1 pass – Lenz). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Ongman, Orman, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay: Patterson. Pass – Lenz.

Tate made motion to approve the salary setting for the County Treasurer to reflect a \$5,000 increase on the current salary of \$58,330 on December 1, 2022, and a 2% increase on years 2 – 4 on December 1 of the following years. Cox seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (14 yes, 2 no –

B. Bennett, Lenz, 1 pass - Boehm). Ayes: Barr, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Ongman, Orman, Patterson, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay: B. Bennett, Lenz. Pass – Boehm.

Ongman made motion to amend the salary setting resolution for the Shelby County Clerk/Recorder to a 1 time \$5,000 increase on the current salary of \$58,330 on December 1, 2022, and a 2% increase for years 2-4 on 12/1/23, 12/1/24 and 12/2/25. Barr seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (16 yes, 1 no - Patterson). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay: Patterson.

Tate made motion to approve the salary setting for the County Clerk/Recorder to reflect a \$5,000 increase on the current salary of \$58,330 on December 1, 2022, and a 2% increase on years 2 – 4 on December 1 of the following years. Cox seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (16 yes, 1 no - Lenz). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Ongman, Orman, Patterson, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay: Lenz.

Vice-Chairman Patterson presented a resolution for an emergent budget amendment for the IMRF budget of \$250,000. B. Bennett made motion to approve the amendment. Tate seconded said motion. Discussion was held. Due to retirements, lump sum payments and the increase in IMRF payments related to the FOP MOU, the current IMRF budget of \$700,000 is not enough.

Prior to the vote, Patterson made motion to remove this item from the table. Edwards seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no).

Orman made motion to amend the IMRF budget by \$250,000. Tate seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (16 yes, 0 no, 1 abstain – Patterson). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay: none. Abstain – Patterson.

Vice Chairman Patterson called for committee reports. (Committee reports are attached to these minutes). Reports were given and items presented for follow-up are as follows:

Gary Patterson reported the entire \$7,000 chemical bill for the County Farm had almost been paid for by donations to F/S.

Sharon Ongman stated she would like to see an “old business” line item on the agenda. Ongman referenced the forensic audit report that was presented on April 5 and stated the board has heard nothing on this issue since that time.

The Finance committee met on May 2 and met with Bruce DeLashmit from Bellwether regarding the use of ARPA funds. Bellwether is still collecting information for the budgeting process, which should begin soon.


Vice Chairman Patterson requested approval of the following appointments:

Rod McClain as trustee for the Findlay Fire Protection district for a 3-year term. Motion by Drnjevic, seconded by Gergeni, all voted aye by voice (17 yes, 0 no).

Gergeni made motion to approve the claims as reviewed by the respective committees. Tate seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (17 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, Boehm, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Patterson, Percy, Simpson, Tate, and Williams. Nay: none.

There were no chairman updates, no correspondence, and no further business to come before the Shelby County Board.

Williams made motion to adjourn until the next regular meeting to be held on June 9, 2022. Orman seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (17 yes, 0 no) and the meeting was adjourned at 8:54 PM.

WHEREAS, the Shelby County Board finds it necessary to amend the previously approved Shelby County Fiscal Year 2022 budget to include awarded funds of \$123,953.78 as revenue in the general fund, line item Technology Grant Expenses, account #001-003-70450;

WHEREAS, the Shelby County Board finds it necessary to amend the previously approved Shelby County Fiscal Year 2022 budget to permit expenditure of awarded funds for purposes of courthouse technology improvements to improve accessibility for remote and hybrid hearings;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Shelby County budget for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2022 is amended to accept \$123,953.78 from the Administrative Office of the Illinois Courts and Guidehouse, Inc. by and through the State of Illinois Technology Grant and to transfer \$123,953.78 to line item Technology Grant Expenses, account #001-003-70450 and to expend awarded funds of \$123,953.78 for purposes of courthouse technology improvements to improve accessibility for remote and hybrid hearings.

February 22, 2022 we received word from The Chief Judge that we had been approved for the entire amount that we had originally requested.



**RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE SALARY FOR
THE Shelby COUNTY SHERIFF**

WHEREAS, Section 5-1010 of the Counties Code [55 ILCS 5/5-1010] requires the County Board to establish the salary of County officers at a meeting prior to the election of the officers whose salary is being established; and

WHEREAS, Section 2(a) of the Local Government Officer Compensation Act [50 ILCS 145/2(a)] requires the salary of elected officers for local governments to be established at least one hundred eighty (180) days prior to the start of their term; and

WHEREAS, Section 2(b) of the Local Government Officer Compensation Act [50 ILCS 145/2(b)] requires the salary of elected officers of a county be set by ordinance or resolution of the County Board; and

WHEREAS, the Public Act 102-0699 was enacted on April 19, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Public Act 102-0699 amends the Counties Code by adding Section 3-6007.5 [55 ILCS 5/3-6007.5] as follows:

Section 3-6007.5. Sheriff's salary.

- (a) As used in this Section, "salary" is exclusive of any other compensation or benefits.
- (b) The salary of a sheriff elected or appointed after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 102nd General Assembly in a non-home rule county shall not be less than 80% of the salary set for the State's Attorney under Section 4-2001 for the county in which the sheriff is elected or appointed.
- (c) The State shall furnish 66 2/3% of the total annual salary to be paid to a sheriff. Said amounts furnished by the State shall be payable monthly by the Department of Revenue out of the Personal Property Tax Replacement Fund or the General Revenue Fund to the county in which the sheriff is elected or appointed. The county shall furnish 33 1/3% of the total annual salary.

; and

WHEREAS, Section 4-2001 of the Counties Code establishes the methods used to set the salary of the State's Attorney; and

WHEREAS, Section 4-2001(a)(1) through (a)(4) of the Counties Code sets either a certain annual salary for the State's Attorney or an annual salary for State's Attorney "as set by the Compensation Review Board, whichever is greater" [55 ILCS 5/4-2001(a)(1) through (a)(4)]; and

WHEREAS, Section 4-2001(a)(5) of the Counties Code provides for the greater of the set salary or the salary "as set by the Compensation Review Board" to include "any cost of living adjustments as authorized by the Compensation Review Board" [55 ILCS 5/4-2001(a)(1)]; and

WHEREAS, the pursuant to Section 4-2001 of the Counties Code the **Shelby** County State's Attorney's annual salary along with any cost-of-living adjustments is set and authorized by the Compensation Review Board on an annual basis in July.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the annual salary for the **Shelby** County Sheriff shall be as follows:

1. Effective December 1, 2022, the **Shelby** County Sherriff's annual salary shall be set at no less than eighty percent (80%) of the **Shelby** County State's Attorney's salary as is set by the State of Illinois pursuant to Section 4-2001 of the Counties Code inclusive of any cost-of-living adjustments as authorized by the Compensation Review Board.
2. In addition to the salary provided for in Paragraph 1, the Sheriff shall an annual stipend to be paid by the Illinois Department of Revenue out of the Personal Property Tax Replacement Fund in the amount of six thousand five hundred dollars (\$6,500.00) as required by Section 4-6003(d) of the Counties Code [55 ILCS 5/4-6003(d)].
3. The definition of benefits for the **Shelby** Sheriff shall be defined by the County Board of **Shelby** County and shall be consistent with the other county-wide elected officials.

Jim:

Public Act 102-0699 amends the Counties Code by adding Section 3-6007.5. Section 3-6007.5 states:

- (a) As used in this Section, "salary" is exclusive of any other compensation or benefits.
- (b) The salary of the sheriff elected or appointed after the effective date of this amendatory act of the 102nd General Assembly in a non-home rule county shall not be less than 80% of the salary set for the State's Attorney under Section 4-2001 for the county in which the sheriff is elected or appointed.
- (c) The State shall furnish 66 2/3% of the total annual salary to be paid to a sheriff. Said amounts furnished by the State shall be payable monthly by the Department of Revenue out of the Personal Property Tax Replacement Fund or the General Revenue Fund to the county in which the sheriff is elected or appointed. The county shall furnish 33 1/3% of the total annual salary. (Emphasis added.)

55 ILCS 5/3-6007.5.¹

¹ HB4700 was signed by Governor J. B. Pritzker on April 19, 2022. However, the addition of 55 ILCS 5/3-6007.5 does not become effective until July 1, 2022.

Changes in Salary

A. Sheriffs

Article VII, Section 9(b) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois states:

(b) An *increase or decrease* in the salary of an *elected* officer of any unit of local government shall not take effect during the term for which that officer is *elected* (emphasis added).

Ill. Const. 1970, Art. VII, § 9(b). Sheriffs are Officers of Local Government. *See*, Ill. Const. 1970, Art. VII, § 4(c). Therefore, an *elected* Sheriff cannot have their salary increased or decreased during their term of office. *See, Illinois County Treasurers' Association v. Hamer*, 2014 IL App (4th) 130286 ¶ 28.² As such, the raise cannot be applied to Sheriff Chaplin but instead to the winner of the election for Sheriff.

B. State's Attorneys

While Article VII, Section 9(b) prohibits the increase or decrease of an elected Sheriff's term, the same prohibition does not exist for the State's Attorney. *See, Ingemunson v. Hedges*, 133 Ill.2d 364 (1990). The Illinois Supreme Court held that State's Attorneys are members of the judicial branch. Article VI, Section 19 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois states:

A State's Attorney shall be elected in each county in 1972 and every fourth year thereafter for a four year term. One State's Attorney may be elected to serve two or more counties if the governing boards of such counties so provide and a majority of the electors of each county voting on the issue approve. A person shall not be eligible for the office of State's Attorney unless he is a United States citizen and a licensed attorney-at-law of this State. *His salary shall be provided by law* (emphasis added).

Ill. Const. 1970, Art. VII, § 9(b). The *Ingemunson* court found that:

the drafters of our constitution, by placing the office of State's Attorney in the judicial article, and specifying that “[a] State's Attorney[s] * * * salary shall be provided by law,” could not have intended that State's Attorneys be subject to the executive article's salary-raise prohibition.

² Sheriffs are in the same position as treasurers so the analysis in *Treasurers' v. Hamer* applies. The Court did not address the difference between an “elected” and “appointed” treasurer. The Court just said treasurer.

Ingemunson, 133 Ill. 2d at 367. While this case dealt with an increase in pay, the same rational would apply to a decrease in pay but only if a mechanism for a decrease in pay were provided in a statute.³

Section 4-2001 of the Counties Code sets the salaries of State's Attorneys, except the Cook County State's Attorney, based in population. The original salary matrix was set as follows:

Table 1 – Initial Breakdown of State's Attorneys' Base Salaries

However, under Section 4-2001(a)(5), the salary matrix was adjusted as follows:

(5) Effective December 1, 2000, to each state's attorney in counties containing fewer than 30,000 inhabitants, the same salary plus any cost of living adjustments as authorized by the Compensation Review Board to take effect after January 1, 1999, for state's attorneys in counties containing 20,000 or more but fewer than 30,000 inhabitants, or as set by the Compensation Review Board whichever is greater.

55 ILCS 5/4-2001 (West, 2020). Therefore, as of December 1, 2000, the matrix for the determining the wages of State's Attorneys was set as follows:

II. Fixing Compensation of County Elected Officers

Section 2 of the Local Government Officer Compensation Act states, in part, that:

- (a) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the compensation of elected officers of school districts and units of local government, including home rule units, which compensation is to be fixed by that school district or unit of

³ Because of Article VII, Section 9 of the Illinois Constitution, a Sheriff's salary could not be diminished.

local government, shall be fixed at least 180 days before the beginning of the terms of the officers whose compensation is to be fixed.

- (b) In addition to the requirements of subsection (a), the compensation of county elected officers shall be fixed by ordinance or resolution of the county board or the board of county commissioners. In the ordinance or resolution fixing the compensation of county elected officers under subsection (a), the county board shall separately list each stipend an elected officer is expected to receive in addition to the compensation to be paid by the county. The stipends listed shall include, but are not limited to, stipends expected to be received under:

* * *

Section 4-6003 of the Counties Code.⁴ (Emphasis added).

50 ILCS 145/2 (West 2020).

A. Timing and Manner

Under Section 2(a), the salary of a sheriff must be set no less than one hundred eighty (180) days prior to the election. *See*, 50 ILCS 145/2(a). Therefore, salary must be set by Saturday, June 4, 2022.

Pursuant to Section 2(b), the County Board must fix the salary by ordinance or resolution. Therefore, combined together, the County Board must set the salary of the Sheriff by passing an ordinance or resolution (in an open meeting and with proper notice), prior to Saturday, June 4, 2022.

In the resolution the County must also include reference to the Sheriff's annual six thousand five-hundred-dollar (\$6,500.00) stipend contained in Section 4-6003(d) of the Counties Code. *See*, 55 ILCS 5/4-6003 (West 2020).

While the stipend must be included in the ordinance, the receipt of the stipend does not count as part of the eighty percent (80.00%) nor may it be subtracted from the eighty percent (80.00%). Both Sections 3-6007.5(a)⁵ and 4-6003(e)⁶ of the Counties Code make that clear.

⁴ Section 4-6003 of the Counties Code contains the \$6,500 Sheriff's Stipend.

⁵ "As used in [55 ILCS 5/3-6007.5], 'salary' is exclusive of any other compensation or benefits."

⁶ "No county board may reduce or otherwise impair the compensation payable from county funds to a sheriff if the reduction or impairment is the result of the sheriff receiving an award or stipend payable from State funds."

B. Eighty Percent 80%

Because the Sheriff's Salary has to be set by June 4, 2022, the amount has to be no less than eighty percent (80%) of the State's Attorney's salary as of June 4, 2022. However, the cost-of-living increases the State's Attorneys will receive between, can be added to the Sheriff's salary throughout the December 1, 2022 to November 30, 2026 term.

1. Increases in Salary between December 1, 2022 and November 30, 2026.

While Article VII, Section 9 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois states that an increase or decrease in the salary of an elected Sheriff cannot "take effect during the term", it does not say that increases in salary cannot be determined prior to the beginning of the term. Ill. Const. 1970, Art. VII, § 9(b).

According to Section 4-2001 of the Counties Code, a state's attorney's salary includes "cost of living adjustments as authorized by the Compensation Review Board (emphasis added)." 55 ILCS 5/4-2001(a)(5). The cost-of-living adjustments are part of the State's Attorney's salary and the eighty percent (80.00%) would be calculated off of increased salary to conform to Section 3-6007.5 of the Counties Code.

2. Legality

The cost-of-living adjustments can be fixed to the salary of the Sheriff prior to the Sheriff taking office. This interpretation is consistent with Section 2 of the Local Government Officer Compensation Act. Section 2 states that the salary "shall be fixed" at least one hundred eighty (180) dates prior to the start of the term. So long as the cost-of-living adjustments are referenced—which can be done by referencing Section 4-2001 of the Counties Code—in the ordinance/resolution, they are legal.

According to the Illinois Attorney General:

the salary of an elected officer of a unit of local government need not be fixed at a flat annual rate for the entire term; the salary may be established on a graduated basis prior to the beginning of the term for which that officer is elected.

Ill. Atty. Gen. Op. S-777, p. 9 (June 18, 1974). The attorney General opined that:

It would follow that the spirit and purpose of the constitutional prohibition would not be violated by an act establishing a fixed scale of pay to be determined during the term of office.

re: ISA – Public Act 102-699
April 25, 2022
Page 6 of 6

Id at p. 5. A reference to the terms of Section 4-2001 of the Counties Code would not violate the Illinois Constitution.

III. Conclusion

As counties are required to pass ordinances to set the sheriff salary by June 4, 2022, I have attached a template for an ordinance/resolution.



SHELBY COUNTY BOARD RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE FISCAL YEAR 2022 IMRF BUDGET

WHEREAS, the Shelby County Board has previously adopted a budget for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2022, and

WHEREAS, the budget for fiscal year 2022 for the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund (IMRF) was set at \$700,000, and

WHEREAS, since the adoption of the budget for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2022 Shelby County was notified by the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund (IMRF) that it was obligated to pay a lump sum payment of \$399,000, and

WHEREAS, the \$399,000 payment was made in December 2021 in order to avoid Shelby County incurring a \$29,000 interest penalty to IMRF, and

WHEREAS, the lump sum payment was not foreseeable when the Fiscal Year 2022 budget was adopted, and

WHEREAS, due to the lump sum payment there are insufficient funds in line 006-029-51000 to cover payments to IMRF for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2022, and

WHEREAS, an additional \$250,000 will be required to meet Shelby County's IMRF obligations for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2022, and

WHEREAS, the additional \$250,000 can be provided from the IMRF fund rather than from the general fund, and

WHEREAS, 55 ILCS 5/6-1003 allows budget amendments in order to meet an immediate emergency,

WHEREAS, an immediate emergency exists in ensuring that Shelby County remains current in payment of its obligations to IMRF.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Shelby County budget for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2022 is hereby amended to increase line 006-029-51000 by \$250,000 with said funds to be provided from the IMRF fund.

MINUTES OF MEETING

April 11, 2022

Members present at meeting:

Commissioners--John Hall, Rick Brown, Steve Wempen

County Board Members--

Airport Manager--Scott Jefson

Others Present--Jim Schwerman

Commissioner Rick Brown calls the meeting to order.

Jim Schwerman starts the meeting with his farm report. Jim said we had about four hundred bushel of soy beans left and prices are above \$16 again. Jim talks current conditions and said it was time to sell. Jim talks about the delays with planting because of the weather and looked for it to continue into June.

Jim said he and Scott spent a few hours with Roy Yanis that day looking at the ditch out front. Jim continued on with the drainage issue and some possible actions we could take to help correct it. Some discussion on the issue ensued. Jim also mentioned the drainage on the east side continually getting worse since a lot of trees were removed years ago. Rick asks Jim about redoing the drainage that might have been damaged when the trees were removed. A lengthy discussion ensued on the drainage issue and what could be done. Jim said he has talked to one person and is going to talk to another person about dipping the ditch out and also taking out the damaged drain tile at the same time. Jim explained that damaged tile can be worse than no tile. Rick then asks that they would take out the damaged tile and then not replace it? Jim said yes and that the only thing they might do is put some new outlets in.

Jim said he would get back to us when he got the bids so we can decide what we want to do.

Scott mentions getting a couple bids for tiling the front yard which would have two outlets going to the front ditch which would require us to get a State permit. Some discussion ensued on the front drainage. Jim then excused himself.

Steve mentions receiving the addition \$45,000 CARES FUND money that's listed on the Treasurers Report and that we should be getting the \$19,627.00 sales tax money very soon.

The minutes were read by all. Rick made a motion to approve the minutes. It was seconded by John and was approved by all saying aye.

Scott asks Steve if he had called Fuel Master about missed credit card sales that did not get downloaded. Steve said no, that they were included in our credit card deposits, but not into our computer so really didn't lose any. Steve said the only ones we would lose would be from a hangar renter if they used their smart card during the time of the issue and not tell us.

The Treasurer's report was read by all. Rick made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. It was seconded by John and approved by all saying aye.

Scott mentions maybe purchasing a pump to suck everything out of the avgas tank to clean it out and asks John if he thought it would work since it would be about seven feet down. John said it would and that he had one that he could use. Scott said the last time he did it he got about thirty gallon of water out of the tank. Some discussion ensued on the matter.

Paul Canaday is at the meeting and wanted to mention the amount of time Scott spent working on the FMU and replacing all the parts inside the unit. Scott said he had a bill and left to go get it.

John makes a motion to accept the bills as presented. Rick seconded it and it was approved by all saying aye.

Managers Report

Scott mentions that on April 4th at 2:00 am he got a phone call from the Shelby County Airport. A man said he had a family emergency and wanted to know when the next flight to Decatur airport was. Scott said he explained to the person that there were no flights to Decatur and the person said he was with the Auxiliary Police and he needed to get to Decatur. Scott said he ended up calling the Sheriff and city. He found out that the guy had been causing trouble in town since 6:00. A short discussion followed about him. Scott said charges were filed against him for trespassing and that's considered a verbal warning, but if he ever comes back on the property, he can be arrested. Scott said there was nothing disturbed.

Scott mentions calling Brian Coffman and explained to him about Jeff Green resigning and Brian wanted to know if he had any recommendations for his replacement. Scott said he thought Paul Canaday would be a good choice, because he is pilot and has also done a lot of work at the airport and knows how everything works.

Scott said the front tires are done but they were still working on the back tires for the tractor. Shelby Electric came out and looked at the power box at the SRE building. A small door was open and mice had gotten in there and it needed to be cleaned. Scott said Matt Figgins came up and went thru everything and found an issue in the Main Hangar in the power box so he wrote up a quote to replace the fused knife switch with a 200 amp main breaker disconnect. The quote for the upgrade is \$1360.89. Steve said he had a 200 amp breaker he could use if it would save the airport some money by getting it at cost and since it was new but over ten years old, it should be a lot cheaper than a newer one. Rick makes a motion to hire Figgins Electric to do the upgrade. John seconded it and it was approved by all saying aye.

Scott said he had two bids back for tiling the front yard. One bid is from Jason Winnings for 700 ft of four in of dual wall tile and with water intakes where needed for the amount of \$5355.00.

The other bid was from Garrett Wasson for grading and leveling on both sides of the entrance for \$8,500, hauling in top soil at \$14,000, and reseed the entire front yard for \$2,000 which comes to a total of \$24,500. Scott said that Roy Yanis is yet to turn in a bid.

Scott asks if we can purchase a loader for the tractor with some of the money we're to receive. Steve said maybe with some of the \$400,000 Build Illinois money, but the \$159,000 per year for five years is for terminal or tower only. Steve said he would ask.

Rick asks how much the loader would cost. Scott said he wasn't sure, but it keeps going up. A short discussion on the loader ensued.

Scott mentioned that the new Lake Shelbyville Flying club is up and going and have been talking to Paul Canaday and Gary Henchen about leasing both of those aircraft. Scott said that Gary is wanting to bring his airplane here permanently so that would be one of the two empty hangars if we lease one out to him. The hangar lease would be to Gary but would be paid by the flying club. Also, Scott said that his hangar that he gets in his contract is being used by Paul so the club would be paying for Paul's hangar as long as the club agrees to stay in that hangar.

Steve asks about Garrett Wasson leasing his hangar to the club and Scott said his is on hold. Scott said right now there would be two leases signed by the flying club for ninety days to see how things go.

Scott then mentions Ken Best's hangar. Ken crashed his plane and the hangar has been empty for over a year. With what Ken got from the insurance company for his plane and the cost to replace it being far more, he is still without a plane. Scott said maybe we should look at that. Some discussion ensued on the issue.

Scott said that leaves us with one empty hangar and that Garrett asks about putting his 182 in there but it is still in Indiana and isn't ready to be flown here and the grass strip where it's at isn't usable yet.

Some discussion on holding the hangar for a non airworthy airplane ensued.

Steve mentions to Scott we needed to maybe make an amendment to the lease and eliminate the \$250 fuel surcharge because it didn't fly to well. Some discussion ensued. It was decided to X that section out and initial it. Scott said he needed to get a lease signed by Paul and Gary. Scott also mentioned asking the county hwy dept. about hauling dirt or if they had any dirt piled up, to use for the front.

Some discussion ensued. Scott asks about setting up an account at Triple B. Steve said he would.







This letter is to express our opposition to any proposed zoning modification or variance on the property directly adjacent to and bordered by us on the north and the Old Lithia Springs recreational area to the south.

Our property has been family owned for over 55 years. The principles of the Carl Laughlin Trust, are unanimously and vehemently against changes that would directly degrade our enjoyment of the area by introducing more traffic and noise, increase likelihood of trespassers across our boundaries and further displace the native habitat and wildlife inherent to the site. Furthermore, we think the current infrastructures will pose a safety concern with the narrow access lane with traffic blind spots on both sides to enter and exit. This would be further hampered when potential clients are encumbered with towed recreational vehicles or oversized vehicles. In the final analysis, the scale and topography of the acreage is restrictive to development which would further adversely alter neighboring aesthetics.


