## SHELBY COUNTY BOARD MEETING

November 10, 2022 – 7:00 P.M.

The Shelby County Board met on Thursday, November 10, 2022, at 7:00 P.M. in Courtroom A of the Shelby County Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman Bryon Coffman called the meeting to order. Board member Rod Hite gave the prayer, and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

County Clerk Jessica Fox called the roll. Patterson and Williams were absent. M. Bennett was tardy(7:09 PM).

Minutes for the October 13, 2022, Board meeting were presented for approval. B. Bennett made motion to approve the minutes. Lenz seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (19 yes, 0 no).

At this time Chairman Coffman called for Public Body Comment.

John Kraft stated the AG's office found no OMA violation from the Sept. 8, 2022 county board meeting, however Kraft stated the board did not take final action in the appointment of Wetherell as acting county highway engineer.

Kirk Allen asked why the County had not bid Health Insurance., but thanked them for seeking bids on the Liability, Worker's Comp and Cyber Insurances.

Mitchell Esslinger thanked "some" of the County Board members for their service and stated he appreciated what the board does and the fact a balanced budget had been passed this year.

Teresa Boehm stated she would be the "lone democrat" on the board and thanked the outgoing board members for their time given and the help and support they had given her during her time on the board. Boehm stated she hoped the new board would come in with an attitude to resolve things.

Probation CMO Heather Wade requested the board proclaim December 2022 as Drunk and Drugged Driving (3D) Prevention Month. The Memorial Tree will be placed in the Courthouse throughout the month of December. Wade thanked the Board for their support. (Proclamation attached to these minutes).

Drnjevic made motion to approve the Proclamation declaring December 2022 to be Drunk and Drugged Driving (3D) Prevention Month. Edwards seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Next, Wade presented for approval a resolution to authorize probation officers to carry firearms pursuant to 720 ILCS 5/24-2(12.5) and Administrative Order 2022-18 signed by Fourth Judicial Circuit Chief Judge Douglas Jarman. Wade reported as required she has a policy and procedure in place for her officers.

Slifer made motion to approve the resolution. Tate seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (19 yes, 0 no, 1 abstain – B. Bennett).

An emergent budget amendment for Courthouse Security was requested in order to replace the X-ray machine at the entrance. The Courthouse Security budget will be increased from \$12,000 to \$25,000 in order to replace the old machine and that has had a lot of work done on it recently.

Boehm made motion to approve the budget amendment. B. Bennett seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote ( 20 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, M. Bennett, Boehm, Brands, Coffman, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Simpson, Slifer, Swits, and Tate. Nays: none.

Chief Engineering Assistant Reed Best presented the County Highway report. Best presented a 50/50 petition from the Flat Branch Highway Commissioner to replace a box culvert located 1.5 miles east of the Tower Hill/Moweaqua blacktop. Estimated cost is \$24,488 and will be split equally between the township and the county.

M. Bennett made motion to approve the petition. Ongman seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (20 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, M. Bennett, Boehm, Brands, Coffman, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Simpson, Slifer, Swits, and Tate. Nays: none.

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Best next presented the annual resolution to appropriate \$950,000 of motor fuel tax funds for the maintenance of county roads in 2023. Durbin made motion to approve the resolution. Simpson seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote ( 20 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, M. Bennett, Boehm, Brands, Coffman, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Simpson, Slifer, Swits, and Tate. Nays: none.

Continuing with updates, Best reported the Westervelt bridge had been paved and should hopefully be finished by the end of next week.

Insurance committee chair Barb Bennett reported 2 bids had been received for Liability, Workers Comp and Cyber Insurance. The counties current provider CIRMA submitted the low bid of \$192,890 for Liability and Work Comp and \$7,302 for Cyber. The other bid was almost \$100,000 more. The Insurance committee recommends the County enter into a 2 year contract with CIRMA.

B. Bennett made motion to approve a 3-year contract with Counties of Illinois Risk Management Agency (CIRMA) for the above mentioned insurances to be effective December 1, 2022. Boehm seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote ( 20 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, M. Bennett, Boehm, Brands, Coffman, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Simpson, Slifer, Swits, and Tate. Nays: none.

Next B. Bennett informed the board the committee had met with Consociate Health and recommended renewing the Health Insurance coverage with Consociate effective January 1, 2023. The overall expense should be about \$7,000 less than it was last year. The self-insurance program is working the way it should and the County is seeing an overall savings in Health Insurance expenses.

B. Bennett made motion to renew the County's Health Insurance with Consociate Health. Boehm seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote ( 20 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, M. Bennett, Boehm, Brands, Coffman, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Simpson, Slifer, Swits, and Tate. Nays: none.

Sheriff McReynolds presented a resolution to dispose of a 2010 Ford Explorer (VIN 1FMEU7DEXAUA81135) with 142,000 miles by declaring it as surplus property. The Sheriff informed the board the vehicle had already been stripped of all law enforcement related equipment. Discussion was held about the possibility of keeping the vehicle so it could potentially be used by other departments.

Slifer made motion to approve the resolution. M. Bennett seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Chairman Coffman presented the 2022 tax levy for Shelby County. The Budget committee met with the Mental Health "708" board on November 1 to discuss their levy reduction from \$600,000 to \$450,000. The Mental Health "708" Board agreed to a levy reduction for the 2022 levy year.

Swits made motion to approve the 2022 tax levy. Boehm seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote ( 20 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, M. Bennett, Boehm, Brands, Coffman, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Simpson, Slifer, Swits, and Tate. Nays: none.

Board member Brands addressed the board and stated he felt since Troy Agney had voluntarily resigned from the County as EMA Director on October 28, and has an investigation pending into another matter that the board should rescind his appointment last month to the Christian/Shelby ETSB 9-1-1 Board.

Brands made motion to rescind the appointment. Ongman seconded said motion. Discussion was held regarding Agney's 1 year public safety sector appointment. Some members felt that Agney should continue to serve, as no charges have been filed against him for any crime. Brands pulled his motion to rescind the appointment of Agney, pending an opinion from the State's Attorney on the matter.

Chairman Coffman called for committee reports.

Farm Committee Chair Slifer reported the beans are out and the wheat looks good at the County Farm.

Airport committee member Ongman reported the Airport and Landing Fields Commission has a large wish list. Large cracks in the runway need repaired. They hope to

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revisit the hanger project in 2025 and the FAA wanted trees removed on the south side of Rt. 16. FBO Scott Jefson will work with Highway Foreman Stacy Prosser to address this project.

At this time, nothing is being done regarding the Courthouse windows. Public Building Chair Tate stated he felt they should wait until the new board was seated and the new committees determined.

Chairman Coffman stated he recently attend a UCCI conference that had a lot of good information regarding solar and wind farms. Coffman encouraged the new board to attend all of the educational seminars they can that are offered by UCCI and IACBM, as those provide alot of good learning resources.

Coffman requested the following appoointments.

Tom Horsman, Planning Commission (3 year term). Motion by Drnjevic, seconded by Edwards. Motion passed by voice vote ( 20 yes, 0 no).

Bruce Steinke, Planning Commission (3 year term). Motion by Drnjevic, seconded by Simpson. Motion passed by voice vote ( 20 yes, 0 no).

Kenny Barr, Shelby County Housing Authority ( 5 year term). Motion by Lenz, seconded by B. Bennett. Motion passed by voice vote ( 20 yes, 0 no).

David Tallman, Sheriff's Merit Commission (6 year term). Motion by B. Bennett, seconded by Drnjevic. Motion passed by voice vote ( 20 yes, 0 no).

Shawn Conlin, Eastern Illinois Economic Development Authority (term to expire 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday in January, 2026). Motion by Hite, seconded by B. Bennett. Motion passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Rod Hite, Shelby County Housing Authority (5 year term). Motion by Durbin, seconded by Slifer. Motion passed by voice vote ( 20 yes, 0 no).


There was no correspondence and no old business to be discussed.

B. Bennett made motion to approve the payment of claims as reviewed by the respective committees. Orman seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote ( 20 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Barr, B. Bennett, M. Bennett, Boehm, Brands, Coffinan, Cox, Drnjevic, Edwards, Gergeni, Hite, Kessler, Lenz, Ongman, Orman, Simpson, Slifer, Swits, and Tate. Nays: none.

## PROCLAMATION


### **Drunk and Drugged Driving (3D) Prevention Month**

The November and December holiday seasons are traditionally one of the most deadly times for alcohol-impaired driving. Millions of families across the nation will be celebrating this wonderful holiday season looking back on all their accomplishments this past year. However, for a few thousand families this holiday seasons are a sad reminder because they lost a loved one to an impaired driver during a previous year. For those families this is an appropriate time to focus attention on both the problem and the solutions.

In 2020 there were 254 people killed in alcohol impaired fatalities which was approximately 21% of all crash fatalities in the State of Illinois. This is a decrease from 2019's alcohol impaired fatalities of 276 or approximately 27% of all crash fatalities in the State of Illinois. Furthermore, there were 20,131 DUI arrests in the State of Illinois in 2020. Evidence based practices have shown us community-based programs involving consumer education, effective laws, and strong law enforcement presence have been proven successful in reducing impaired driving.

Organizations from every State in this great nation are joining together this holiday season by supporting anti-impaired driving programs and policies. Thanks to the Shelby County Probation Office, Shelby County is a partner in that effort to make our roads and streets safer by offering the Victim Impact Panels (VIP) and other evidence-based practices this holiday season. Furthermore, to show support to the 254 families that will have to spend the holiday season without their loved one, Shelby County Probation will have a Christmas Tree in the Court House Lobby with one ribbon for every DUI crash fatality in 2020.

**Now, therefore,** I, Bryon Coffman, Shelby County Board Chairman, do hereby proclaim December 2022 as **Drunk and Drugged Driving (3D) Prevention Month** and do hereby call up all citizens, government agencies, business leaders, hospitals, schools, and public and private institutions in Shelby County to promote awareness of the impaired driving problem, to support programs and policies to reduce the incidences of impaired driving, to promote safer and healthier behaviors regarding the use of alcohol and other drugs December 2022 holiday season.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2022-18


ORDER AUTHORIZING PROBATION OFFICERS TO CARRY FIREARMS

Duly appointed Probation Officers, Supervisors, Chief Managing Officers, and Directors of Probation and Court Services of the Fourth Judicial Circuit may carry firearms pursuant to 720 ILCS 5/24-2(12.5), which states, in part: "probation officers while in the performance of their duties, or while commuting between their homes, place of employment or specific locations that are part of their assigned duties, with the consent of the Chief Judge of the circuit for which they are employed."; and

This authorization requires compliance with 50 ILCS 710/1, the Peace Officer Firearms Training Act.

Prior to carrying a firearm pursuant to this Administrative Order, the County Probation Office to which the Officer is assigned, must have a Firearms Manual or Policy approved by the Chief Judge. The Officer must also obtain written approval, annually, from the Chief Judge, Resident Circuit Judge, Chief Managing Officer or Director, and the County Board.

**RESOLUTION 22 - 70**

**RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE FISCAL YEAR 2023 BUDGET TO INCREASE THE  
COURTHOUSE SECURITY LINE ITEM TO ALLOW FOR THE PURCHASE OF A  
COURT SECURITY X-RAY MACHINE**

**WHEREAS**, the Shelby County Board has previously adopted a budget for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2023; and

**WHEREAS**, since the adoption of the budget for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2023, the Court Security X-Ray machine in the Shelby County Courthouse has begun to no longer adequately x-ray items; and

**WHEREAS**, it is necessary to purchase a new x-ray machine for the safety of employees of the Shelby County Courthouse and members of the public when inside the Shelby County Courthouse; and

**WHEREAS**, the budget for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2023 budgeted \$12,000.00 for line item Courthouse Security, account #017-045-50650, which line item is funded by court user fees and not the county general fund; and

**WHEREAS**, the cost of a new x-ray machine has been determined to be \$19,370.76; and


**WHEREAS**, increasing line item Courthouse Security, account #017-045-50650 to \$25,000.00 will allow for the purchase of a new Court Security X-Ray machine as well as any other necessary expenditures that might arise during the fiscal year ending August 31, 2023; and

**WHEREAS**, the Shelby County Board determines that an emergency situation exists in regard to purchasing a Court Security X-Ray machine; and

**WHEREAS**, the Shelby County Board finds it necessary to amend the previously approved Shelby County Fiscal Year 2023 budget to allow for the purchase of a Court Security X-Ray machine;

**BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Shelby County budget for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2023 is amended to increase line item Courthouse Security, account #017-045-50650 to \$25,000.00.

Per Section 5-501 of the Illinois Highway Code, the undersigned, Highway Commissioner of Flat Branch Township in said County, would respectfully requests:

**Location: TR 21 at a point near SW 1/4 of SE 1/4 of Section 12, R2E, T13N, 3PM**

Replace a 14' x 4' Reinforced Concrete Box Culvert with Two 78" x 42' CMP. Pipe : (2) 78" x 42' Riveted Alum CMP  
= \$16,293.48 Labor, Eqp't. Mat'l = \$8,194.84 **TOTAL = \$24,488.32**

in said road district, which the road district is responsible.

The anticipated cost of the proposed project will be \$24,488 Dollars, which sum will be more than 0.02% of the full, fair cash value of all the taxable property in said Road District, as equalized or assessed by the Department of Revenue, and the tax rate for road purposes in said Road District was in each year for the 2 years last past not less than the maximum allowable rate provided for in Section 6-501 of the Illinois Highway Code.

## **MINUTES OF MEETING**

**October 10, 2022**

Members present at meeting:

Commissioners--Rick Brown, Walt Lookofsky, Paul Canaday, John Hall, Steve Wempen

County Board Members--Sharon Ongman

Airport Manager--Scott Jefson

Others Present--Lindsay Hausman

Commissioner Rick Brown calls the meeting to order.

The minutes were read by all. Walt made a motion to approve the minutes. It was seconded by John and was approved by all saying aye.

The Treasurer's report was read by all. Walt made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. It was seconded by Paul and approved by all saying aye.

Lindsay Hausman, with Hansons is present and Rick asks Lindsay since she had to drive back to Springfield if she would like to go ahead and start. Lindsay said she wanted to be at the meeting so she could talk to us about the TIPS meeting the following Wednesday, the money we've accumulated and about the projects we want to pursue or that she can recommend for us to do and the different pots of money that's available to pull from. First Lindsay mentions that we have four years of entitlement saved up for a hangar project that we have postponed for a few years because of the cost increasing from \$677,000 to 1.4 million in the last few years. Lindsay said we used about two and a half years of entitlement funds for the runway maintenance project.

Lindsay mentions us talking about making some improvements to the Main Hangar and some of that money could be utilized for that or for something else on the airfield. Lindsay passed out a map of the airfield that showed our pavement ratings from 2019 and said we should get the updated numbers from the recent inspection sometime in December. Lindsay points out the apron and the ramp area showing the lowest numbers and said those areas we could do.

Lindsay mentions the money from the State Rebuild Illinois Program that we requested for the associated pavements around the new hangars that was programmed, won't happen since we're not going ahead with the hangar project. Lindsay said the way it works is the state won't allow us to change the scope of the project but if we wanted her to she would go to the state and tell them our situation and ask them if we could reprogram some of the money and maybe use it for improvements with the ramp or hangars. Lindsay said the state has said that they will not do that but she would ask them anyway.

Rick asks Lindsay about the cost of a ten place hangar being 1.4 million and ours was going to be a five place. Lindsay said that we wanted 5 box hangars and that the square footage was about the same. Scott mentions only having five doors instead of ten at roughly \$50,000 each but still too expensive plus part of it was going to be taller and would still be over a million dollars. Scott asks Lindsay if we would be better off pursuing the ramp and hangar pavement or would we be better off doing phase one of the taxiways. Lindsay said that since the Rebuild Illinois money was for the new hangar pavement, it might make it easier to switch it to the existing hangar pavements. With the pavement numbers being low it might make it more likely to happen. Scott also asks Lindsay if we redo the ramp area how are they going to work around the blocked off area. Lindsay said with the low pci rating she would suggest a rehabilitation where they come in, grind off about two inches and overlay the whole ramp and X off that corner. Scott mentions removing it and maybe some more. Some discussion ensued on different options for the east end and also realigning the taxiway.

Scot asks Lindsay where we were at with an official ALP. Lindsay said that several airports ALPs are sitting with the FAA and have been for years. A short discussion on the matter ensued.

Lindsay said in summing up from what she is hearing is that we want to take the Rebuild Illinois money and transfer that into a hangar/pavement rehab project. Maybe our first priority project would be an apron/ramp rehabilitation which could utilize a lot of the entitlement money that's saved up. Lindsay mentions a lot of different funding programs that have come available over the last few years and one of them is the BIL (Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill).

This bill gave airports a set amount of money for five years. Lindsay said Shelby County Airport's portion of this money is \$159,000 a year. It's similar to our entitlement, it is available for anything that is eligible for federal dollars we can use it for. Lindsay said unlike revenue generating projects that puts us on a three year hiatus, this money does not do that. Scott asks Lindsay about replacing our 2500 gallon fuel tank with a 10,000 gallon tank for 100LL, would that be considered a fuel farm or a storage deal. Lindsay replied that it would be considered a fuel farm and fuel farms have different eligibility requirements and she would check if replacing a tank would be eligible, she was not sure.

A short discussion followed.

Rick mentions maybe using some of the money to do some refurbishing of some of the hangars where they are rusting real bad. Scott asks Lindsay how specific we have to be with the hangar rehabilitation and Lindsay said for the TIPS submittal, not that specific and explained some. Lindsay also mentioned that if the money was used for hangar improvement we would need to show that it would bring an increase of revenue, such as increasing rent and put it on a business plan. Rick ask how that would work with the Main Hangar and Lindsay said the same, it would have to show an increase in revenue. Scott asks Lindsay about purchasing additional land with some of the money and Lindsay said that she thought it would be available. Some discussion on what all is involved in acquiring land ensued.

Scott also asks Lindsay what needed to be done to eliminate the GPS approach because of all the birds that gather along the runway because of planting grass instead of corn or beans. Scott explained the issue to Lindsay and she said she would talk to Susan Zellers about it. More discussion on hangar repair and money and Lindsay clarified herself and said any normal maintenance is out of pocket, only improvements that would generate more revenue would be eligible for funding. Paul asks Lindsay about the expiration date on the \$159,000 per year for five years and Lindsay said the money for 2022 would expire in 2026 but not to wait, that we should apply probably no later than the next TIPS meeting for 2022's money. More discussion on the uses for the money ensued. Rick asks Lindsay if she had an idea how much it would cost to redo the ramp and between the hangars and Lindsay said she couldn't really say but would say around a million dollars. More discussion ensued about how much entitlement funds we have available.

Lindsay thanks us and excused herself.

Scott asks if we can buy a new mower with some on the funds available and Steve said not eligible. Scott said the new flying club is doing real good and are in the process of acquiring another plane. Scott mentions talking to Mid Illinois Petroleum and they are working to get prices on a 10,000 gallon fuel tank. A short discussion ensued on the matter.

There is more discussion on what we want to pursue for our future projects. It was decided that we have a car show combined with the next Balloon Fest and fly young eagles on a different weekend. Scott mentions that we are doing a virtual meeting here for the TIPS meeting. Rick mentions the poor turn out for the cookout and a short discussion ensued.
